MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 21ST DAY OF JANUARY, 1936, AT 3 P. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence, or absence, of Directors as follows:

At this meeting C. A. Hickman, President, presided; owing to the absence of Secretary Stripling, President Hickman appointed Director Hogsett as Acting Secretary of this meeting.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

Minutes of a Called Meeting of January 7, 1936, were read, approved and ordered of record.

President Hickman presented a letter dated January 20, 1936, received by him from Hawley, Freese & Nichols. This letter relates to the matter of "gate setting" at Eagle Mountain Dam, East Conduit and "stop logs." Upon the reading of the letter, it was the sense of the Directors that the letter be attached as "Exhibit A" to these minutes: It was so ordered.

3.

President Hickman presented to the Directors for consideration an application for the lease of lands owned by this District, from:

Upon consideration of the proposal for lease, director Hogsett made a motion, seconded by Director Bewley, that the proposal for lease do be approved for execution; subject only to the following conditions, i. e.: That the lease shall be subject to final approval by the Land Committee; and that the lease be actually executed in the form adopted by the District. Upon a vote being taken the motion carried and it was so ordered.

It was brought to the attention of the Directors that several persons leasing District lands had requested that the District furnish them materials in order that they themselves might make necessary repairs to the District's houses in which they are living. Director Hogsett made a motion, seconded by Director Cooke, that the matter of furnishing materials to be used in making necessary repairs on District owned houses, be referred to the Land Committee with power to act: It was so ordered.

President Hickman laid before the Board the official returns of the election for Directors, held on Tuesday, January 14, 1936, to determine who should be chosen to serve as Directors of the District to succeed the expiring terms of E. E. Bewley, Will K. Stripling and W. S. (Steve) Cooke. Thereupon the Directors present, as a Committee of the whole, did proceed to canvas the returns of said election and to cast up the total votes cast. From the tabulation the Directors find and do now here declare that the following named candidates received total votes as follows:

Further, it appeared that all the procedures incident to the ordering and holding of said election and the manner of making returns thereon did in all things comply with the law applicable thereto. By reason thereof it appears, and it hereby is declared that the number of votes respectively received by E. E. Bewley, Will K. Stripling and W. S. (Steve) Cooke, are higher or greater in number than the number of votes cast for any other person whose name appears in the returns of said election as a candidate therein, and that, by reason thereof they, and each of them, have been duly elected as directors of this district.

Thereupon President Hickman did move that E. E. Bewley, W. K. Stripling and W. S. (Steve) Cooke do hereby be declared to be Directors of this District to serve for two years from January 14, 1936, or until their successors shall have been duly elected and qualified, in accordance with the appropriate law. Further that the said E. E. Bewley, Will K. Stripling and W. S. Cooke, do take the oath of office prescribed by law, and present their good and sufficient bond of office for approval by this Board. Further that, upon approval of their said bonds and oaths of office they shall instantly be constituted and established as Directors of this District for the term

hereinabove stated. Further, that there do be attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B," the tabulation of votes cast in said election, showing the number of votes cast for each candidate therein. Further that, said "Exhibit B" do be identified by the respective signatures of the president and acting secretary of this District. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

Dr. C. A. Hickman, President, Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, Fort Worth, Texas.

Dear Sir:

In the matter of "gate setting" at Eagle Mountain Dam. (East Conduit):

Butcher and Sweeney, contractors, duly completed their work to my approval except for "rescuing" the pine stoplogs, for which item I advised retention of \$50.00. Since their last estimate was rendered and paid by your Board, the contractors have extracted sufficient "stopplogs" placed in March 1934, to give a waterway of 11 ft. depth by 13 ft. 3 in. width, from underside of the conduit arch to the "stop-logs" left in place. Part of these timbers have been pulled up the slope of the dam and stored on south side of the valve house. Those remaining have been grappled and removed to sufficient distance from the conduit mouth to insure safety to the gate valves.

In the opinion of your Engineers, it will be safe and proper to leave the remaining "logs" in place, as they are now far in front of the "gate-valve" structure, and so water-logged as to remain there in the lake-mud forever.
