MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE, IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 21ST DAY OF DECEMBER, 1937, AT 3:00 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence, or absence of Directors, as follows. viz:

#### PRESENT

At this meeting C. A. Hickman, President, presided; owing to the absence of Secretary Stripling, President Hickman appointed Director Hogsett as Acting Secretary of this meeting; whereupon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

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Minutes of prior meetings were read, approved and ordered of records, as follows: December 10, 1937, at 2:00 P.M.; December 10, 1937, at 2:30 P.M. and December 10, 1937, at 3:00 P.M.

Attached to these minutes as Exhibit "A" and hereby made part hereof, is a statement of the financial condition of the District as of this day. This statement shows consecutive and inclusive interim Voucher-Checks Nos. 5657 to 5667 for the aggregate sum of \$835.60. It also shows proposed Voucher-Checks, consecutive and inclusive serial Nos. 5668 to 5699 for the aggregate sum of \$1,841.69. The proposed Voucher-Checks, together with the data to support the same, were considered by the Directors and all accounts proposed for payment were found to be now due and payable by the District; whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion, seconded by Director Cooke, that the listed interim checks be confirmed; that the accounts proposed for payment by the listed proposed voucher-checks, bearing consecutive and inclusive serial Nos. 5668 to 5699, be approved for payment and that said proposed checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same in payment of the stated accounts. Upon a vote being taken,

the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

Attached to these minutes as Exhibit "B" and here referred to as part hereof is one of the several reciprocal receipts executed on December 17, 1937, as between the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, as the District's statutory depositary, and Director Bewley, as Custodian of the District's Pledges of Securities, which shows the pledge of securities pledged by the bank for the total sum of \$150,000.00. Director Cooke made a motion, seconded by Director Hogsett, that the recited transactions be approved as the act and deed of the District, having effect on and after said 17th day of December A.D. 1937; further that, one of said reciprocal receipts be attached to the statutory bond of the depositary as Exhibit #33 hereof, as is provided for in the bond. Upon a vote being taken, the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

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There were presented to the Directors accounts due and payable by the District, not received in time to be included in the financial statement, as follows:

- (a) Itemized account to cover expenses of Marvin C. Nichols, of the District's Engineers, on his trip to Washington and return, for the purpose of inducing the Administrator of PWA to reverse the prior action and to grant to this District extension of time to May 30, 1938, within which time it might complete its levee project and retain its grant benefits, which had been denied, due to the fact that the project had not been completed by November 30, 1937 . . \$126.55
- (b) Claim of W. S. Pugh for reimbursement for certain work done
  on the well and house situated on the District's Tract No. 306 to be held
  by Mr. Pugh under lease for the year 1938, as formerly agreed to by President Hickman

Upon consideration of these matters, Director Cooke made a motion, seconded by Director Hogsett, that each of said accounts be approved as due and payable by the District; that the District's Voucher-Check No. 5700, payable to Hawley,

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Freese and Nichols for the sum of \$126.55 be issued and delivered to the payer to cover the expenses of Marvin C. Nichols, above designated; that the District's Voucher-Check No. 5701, payable to W. S. Pugh for the sum of \$40.00 be issued and delivered to him in payment of his stated account. Upon a vote being taken, the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

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There was presented to the Directors the proposal of the District's Engineers and Attorneys that the District contract, through Mitchell, Gartner and Thompson, for the usual protection afforded by Workmen's Compensation policies for those workmen who may be engaged in the clearing of the River Channel in the Boyd-Paradise Area. It was represented that the coverage would provide: The maximum number of workmen engaged at any one time would be ten; the total pay-roll would not exceed \$600.00; the premium would be \$35.00, which is the minimum premium for such coverage. Upon consideration of this matter, Director Hogsett made a motion, seconded by Director Cooke, that the District procure this coverage and that the premium therefor be paid without other or further order of this Board. Upon a vote being taken, the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

resident Hickman, in his capacity as Chairman of the Land Committee, presented and recommended proposals for lease of lands of the District, for the period to begin January 1, 1938, and expire December 31, 1938, for rental compensations, as follows:

Lourcey to lease for the year 1938 the same land controlled by him for the year 1937 should be approved, subject to the condition that he be advised that the District will contemplate an increased lease compensation for the year 1939: It was so ordered.
- (2) It was the sense of the Directors that the proposal of W. H. Wallerich to lease for the year 1938 the District's O. L. Marshall Tract No. 280 for the lease consideration of \$65.00 should be approved, subject only to the condition that he make such repairs as he deems to be required for the house on this land at his own expense: It was so ordered.
