MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 14TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1947, AT 1:00 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of Directors, as follows:

Also present were Sidney L. Samuels, General Attorney, and C. L. McNair, General Manager.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, where-upon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

1.

The Directors had previously received copies of the Minutes of a Regular Meeting held on September 15, 1947, at 2:00 P.M. Having found no objections thereto, it was ordered that they be approved, signed and placed of record.

2.

Attached to these Minutes as Exhibit "A" is a state-ment of the financial condition of this District to which reference is made. Exhibit "A" shows that interim voucher-checks #10877 to #10899, inclusive, for the total sum \$2,030.37 had

been issued since the last meeting; also proposed voucher-checks #10900 to #10929, inclusive, for the total sum \$1,221.80. There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, whereupon Director Pier moved, seconded by Director Hill, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed, and that the accounts payable be approved as covered by the proposed voucher-checks and that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive them. It was so ordered, subject to the usual audit.

3.

The written report dated October 14, 1947, of Mr. C. L. McNair, General Manager, for the month of September, 1947, was received, presented, and ordered filed as Exhibit "B" to these Minutes.

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The monthly report of the Auditors, Pitner & Adams, for the month of August, 1947, was ordered received and filed.

The Directors then proceeded to take up the matter of the tax levy and the allocation of the tax between the "Interest and Sinking Fund" on the one hand, and the "Maintenance Fund" on the other. After full discussion by all the Directors present, Director Priest moved, seconded by Director Stone, that the Tax of 32¢ on the \$100.00 of property valuation heretofore levied for the year 1947, be divided and allocated so that 25¢ thereof

be appropriated and set aside to the use of the "Interest and Sinking Fund" and 7¢ thereof be set aside and devoted to the "Maintenance Fund". The motion having been put to the Board, same was unanimously carried and adopted.

There being no further business before the Board, the Meeting thereupon adjourned.

REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER, 1947.

Gentlemen:

On September 4th, I escorted Congressman Tom Pickett, member of Federal Public Works Committee, and others, on an inspection of Eagle Mountain and Bridgeport reservoirs; and on September 25th, another inspection was made with Colonel Robertson, the newly appointed division Army Engineer in charge of the Galveston office.

A tour of the upper West Fork drainage area was made Thursday, September 11th, by a group of interested citizens of which I was a member, for the purpose of showing this badly eroded territory to Congressmen Lucas of Fort Worth and Ed Gossett of Wichita Falls.

Congressman Gossett came to Fort Worth September 12th at the request of the District to confer with Attorney Samuels for the purpose of determining a course of action to get the United States Navy to relinquish their claim to any interest in lands of the District. Congressman Gossett wrote a letter to the United States Navy in behalf of this District, the Methodist Church and City of Bridgeport. We have had no reply from this communication.

I have been advised by Mr. V. E. Baldridge of Bridgeport that a committee now has sufficient money on deposit to purchase the site selected by the North Texas Methodist Conference for development of a Youths! Camp.

On Sunday, September 14th, Director Priest accompanied me on an inspection of the District's properties in the vicinity of the Bridgeport Dam, including the east side of the Rominger Ranch.

A Committee representing the Optomist Club has selected a site on Eagle Mountain Lake for a boys' camp, provided they can negotiate a satisfactory purchase or lease.

October 14, 1947. Page # 2.

Custodian Hutcheson and I made a tour by boat of the surface of Bridgeport Lake on September 19th. We found that the deposit of silt in the creek channels entering the lake is continuing at a very high rate. We also located the old Magnolia test well at the south end of the lake in the Moses Survey. The casing above the ground has rusted away. There was no discharge from the well. Several years past some salt water seepage was detected.

Mr. Porter, Soil Conservationist at Jacksboro, has inspected the District's lands in the Bridgeport Lake area and, at my request, has submitted a general report on these lands.

Dr. J. V. Anderson, owner of the South Texas Commercial Bank Tract and a part of the Cora Davenport Tract of Land bordering the Bridgeport Lake, desires to exchange certain tracts of land with the District which would be of mutual benefit. I have been working on this exchange of land for about three years and recommend that the Land Committee be authorized to work out a satisfactory deal.

No water is being discharged from Bridgeport Lake. The storage in Eagle Mountain Lake is now being drawn on for use by the City of Fort Worth and for maintaining a flow in the river through Fort Worth in the interest of health.
