MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 16TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1947, AT 1:00 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors, as follows:

ABSENT

Also present were Sidney L. Samuels, General Attorney, and C. L. McNair, General Manager.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

1.

The Directors had previously received copies of the Minutes of a Regular Meeting held on November 17, 1947, at 2:00 P.M. Having found no objections thereto, it was ordered that they be approved, signed and placed of record.

2.

attached to these Minutes as Exhibit "A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District to which reference is made. Exhibit "A" shows that interim voucher-checks #10977 to #10994, inclusive, for the total sum \$2,010.97 had been issued since the last meeting; also proposed voucher-checks #10995 to #11000, inclusive, and new series #1 to #15, inclusive, for the total sum \$450.24.

There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, whereupon Director Priest moved, seconded by Director Stone, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed, and that the accounts payable be approved as covered by the proposed voucher-checks and that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive them. It was so ordered, subject to the usual audit.

3.

The monthly report of the Auditors, Pitner & Adams, for the month of November, 1947, was ordered received and filed.

4.

The written report dated December 16, 1947, of Mr. C. L. McNair, General Manager, for the month of November, 1947, was received, presented, and ordered filed as Exhibit "B" to these Minutes.

5.

Ment between the District and the Upper West-Fork Soil Conservation District of the State of Texas, by which soil conservation should be fostered and encouraged in respect to lands owned by the District, some of said lands being already under leasehold contracts. It was the sense of the Board that such an agreement be consummated between this District and the said Upper West-Fork Soil Conservation District whereby the two organizations would cooperate in a program to arrest soil erosion and increase the soil fertility on lands owned by the District.

It was thereupon ordered by the Board that the agreement

submitted by the Upper West-Fork Soil Conservation District should be accepted with the proviso that lands now under lease contract be excluded, and apply only to lands covered by leases in which the District had included soil conservation measures as a part of the lease contract. All members voted "aye" in this matter and it was adopted.

6.

Mr. McNair presented thirteen certain proposals for renewal lease of District Lands for the year 1948, which he recommended for approval as follows:

Upon consideration of each of the above lease proposals,
Director Stone moved, seconded by Director Pier, that the said
proposals be approved and closed in the usual manner, subject to
payment of the agreed rentals and execution of written contracts

in the form required by the District; said contracts will contain a further provision under which the lessees take said lands subject to the right of the District to enter into arrangements for the prevention of soil erosion and conservation of the life giving and producing properties of such lands; and the additional provision that the lessees, in such leases, shall be required to cooperate in the accomplishment of such program. Such lease contracts shall further stipulate that the District reserves the right to lease any part or all of the leased premises for oil and gas, but to interfere as little as practicable, under the circumstances, with the right of uses of such premises by lessees.

Mr. McNair also presented renewal lease proposals of.

(a) W. A. Nelson

1117.41 acres

(b) C. R. Halman

He stated that while these gentlemen requested renewal leases for three-year periods, he would recommend that a renewal lease for the year 1948 be approved with option of renewal for each of the years 1949 and 1950, provided soil conservation plan is complied with.

Upon consideration of this matter, it was the sense of the Directors that the recommendation of Mr. McNair be approved. It was so ordered.

Mr. McNair then presented two lease proposals, as follows:

- (a) Une from G. E. Splawn for renewal of his lease on 99.54 acres of land for \$125.00.
- (b) One from W. B. Randolph in which he proposed to pay \$75.00 for the land to the west of his house (now under lease to Mr. Splawn) and \$125.00 for the balance of the land.

After careful consideration of the proposals, it was the sense of the Directors that in view of the fact that Mr. Splawn had

been leasing the tract of land for a continuous period of more than ten years, and has been a satisfactory tentant, that Mr. Splawn's lease proposal for the year 1948 be accepted and closed in the usual manner, subject to the payment of the agreed rentals and execution of written contract in the form required by the District.

The proposal of Eugene Ashe for renewal of his lease for the year 1948 was held in abeyance, for later action by the Board.

7.

There came up for consideration the sale of approximately 148 acres of land, more or less, situated in Wise County, Texas, forming margins to the Bridgeport Lake, which tract is known as the Liles Heirs Tracts Nos. 9 and 10. It was made to appear to the Board that this property had been advertised in the manner prescribed by law and that bids had been invited for the purchase of said tracts. In response to said advertisement there was but one bid and that bid was made by the North Texas Methodist Conference, acting through V. E. Baldridge, Chairman of the Committee, and by Earl E. Frost, J. W. Lewis, W. H. Hutcheson, E. W. Jones, and Dale Eales, members of the committee, which bid proposed to pay for said property the sum of \$50.00 per acre cash, the total acreage to be computed by actual survey of the premises.

On motion of Director Pier, seconded by Director Stone, such bid was accepted by the District and the General Manager, assisted by the General Attorney, was authorized and instructed to prepare a proper deed of conveyance with such restrictions, terms and also reservations of mineral rights on the part of the District as would be deemed appropriate. The motion was unanimously carried and adopted, all the members voting "aye" thereon.

Sidney L. Samuels, General Attorney of the Board, then made report to the Board concerning the suit of W. C. Putman against the District, pending in the 48th District Court of Tarrant County, Texas, and numbered 40081-A on the docket of said court.

The General Attorney reported that Putman owned a tract of land in Tarrant County, Texas, in excess of 700 acres laid out in pasture and farm and used for the raising of garden stuff, cotton, corn and other cultivated crops. Further, that in the spring and summer of 1941, and again in the spring and early summer of the year 1942, water impounded in Eagle Mountain Lake rose to a point where it backed upon and flooded about 75 acres of plaintiff's land. It was further claimed by Putman that as a result of the water thus impounded, Indian Creek, which flowed through the land of Putman, was filled and overflowed and that the land surrounding the creek was submerged and remained inundated during the periods of time above mentioned. The plaintiff claimed damages in the sum of \$10,000.00, with interest from the date of the overflow. The suit was filed april 1, 1943, in the District Court.

The General Attorney further reported that in this suit
Putman sought to recover for the loss of gravel that was imbedded
in the channel of the creek, but that such claim was untenable because the creek measured more than thirty feet wide and was, therefore, a navigable stream under the laws of the State of Texas, by
reason of which the gravel belonged to the State of Texas and not
to Putman; and that when this was pointed out to counsel for

Putman, it was finally agreed that Putman would accept \$2,500.00 in full satisfaction of his claim and in full of all damages that might accrue in the future from that source. The settlement of the claim on that basis was recommended by the General attorney in which position he was supported by Mr. McNair, the General Manager.

On motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Stone, the claim was ordered settled by the payment of \$2,500.00, and that voucher be drawn therefor and that same be delivered to the General Attorney for final closing of the matter. The motion was unanimously adopted, all the Directors present voting "aye" thereon.

9.

On motion of Director Stone, seconded by Director Pier, the matter of executing a lease to the Federal Government of the property which heretofore had been condemned by the Federal Government in the United States District Court at Fort Worth in Cause Civil #432, entitled "United States of America vs. Certain Parcels of Land, Situate in Tarrant County, Texas, and William Fleming, et al.", involving Tract No. 16, embracing approximately 535.84 acres in the vicinity of Eagle Mountain Lake, should be taken up, considered and disposed of. The matter was then discussed by the members of the Board and it was considered expedient to make such lease with appropriate terms and conditions so that the full fee simple title to the tract should be revested in the District free and acquit of any claim to such title by the United States Government.

The General Attorney, assisted by the General Manager, was instructed to prepare such lease to be tendered to the Federal Government, embracing such terms and conditions as might be deemed appropriate and that the annual rental for such property for the use by the Federal Government should be fixed at \$1,200.00 per year for the first five years, and thereafter at the rate of \$1,800.00 per year; and that such lease in terms run from year to year with renewal privilege to the Federal Government, but that the sum total of such lease in point of years not to exceed altogether the period of twenty years from the date of the instrument of lease. All such rents to be paid in advance from year to year during the term. The motion having been heard and canvassed, it was unanimously adopted, all the Directors voting "aye" thereon.

10.

There being no further business before the Board, adjournment was had.

To: The Board of Directors. Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One.

REPORT FOR NOVEMBER. 1947.

Gentlemen:

On November 4th, an inspection of sanitary conditions on the East side of Eagle Mountain Lake was made by the following: Mr. George Williams County Sanitarian, Mr. J. I. Burgess, Land owner, Mr. B. W. Bintliff and myself, representing the District, and Mr. Ambrose, Chairman of the Eagle Mountain Lake Civic League. It was agreed to abandon and clean up a temporary dumping ground near the lake and begin using a tract of land east of the county road furnished by Mr. Burgess, provided the Civic League could work out an agreement with the County to properly maintain the premises and release Mr. Burgess from any responsibility of damage suits that might arise from fires started on the dumping ground.

An oil test well is being drilled, approximately two miles north of the District's property, on the Manning Tract in Wise County. Considerable interest is being displayed in leasing. Offers of \$500.00 per acre. has been made for acreage near the test well.

By request of the Rock Island Railway Company, we have released water from Bridgeport Lake sufficient to raise the level in Eagle Mountain Lake to the intake at their Newark pump station. I requested the Railroad to remedy the situation at their pump plant so that in the future they would not be inconvenienced by a below normal lake level.

A part of the Liles Estate land adjoining Bridgeport Lake has been advertised for sale.

Cooperation of all employees is commendable.
