MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 9TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1950, AT 2:00 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors, as follows:

Also present were Sidney L. Samuels, General Attorney, and C. L. McNair, General Manager.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

1.

The Directors had previously received copies of meeting held on July 21, 1950, at 2:00 P.M. Having found no objections thereto, it was ordered that they be approved, signed and placed on record.

2.

Attached to these Minutes as Exhibit "A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District to which reference is made. Exhibit "A" shows that interim voucher-checks #1506 to #1525, inclusive, for the total sum \$2,548.05 had been issued since the last meeting; also proposed voucher-checks #1526 to #1545, inclusive, for the total sum \$1,551.78. There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, where-

upon Director Hill moved, seconded by Director Priest, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed, and that the accounts payable be approved as covered by the proposed voucher-checks and that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive them. It was so ordered, subject to the usual audit.

3.

The monthly report of the Auditors, Pitner & Adams, for the month of June, 1950, was ordered received and filed.

4.

The monthly report dated August 9, 1950, of C. L. McNair, General Manager, for the month of July, 1950, was received, presented and ordered filed as Exhibit "B" to these Minutes.

5.

Mr. McNair presented to the Board the proposal of F. E. Wallace for renewal of his land lease for the year 1950, on approximately 1.00 acre of land out of the District's Stock Yards National Bank Tract No. 342-A, for a total consideration of \$100.00 annually. Said land to be used for commercial purposes only. The proposal having been recommended by Mr. McNair, it was the sense of the Board that said proposal be approved and closed in the usual manner, subject to the payment of the agreed rental and execution of written contract in the form required by the District. It was so ordered.

6.

The right-of-way easement to Lone Star Gas Company from the

District across the land out of the D. T. Flores Survey, Abstract No. 509, and the J. W. Wilcox Survey No. 42, Abstract No. 1726, heretofore authorized, and which had been executed on August 2, 1950, pursuant to instructions by the Board, by Mr. Joe B. Hogsett, President of the Board, and attested by Mr. Dan Priest, Secretary, a copy of same was ordered to be placed among the records of the District, and that the check dated August 2, 1950, for \$48.00 from Lone Star Gas Company be deposited to the credit of the District. All the Directors voted "aye" thereon.

7.

President Hogsett suggested to the Board that in view of the contemplated improvements in the channel of the Trinity River for the purpose of flood prevention, it would be suitable and expedient to procure aerial photographs of the River and existing bridges and of the area so to be improved as same now appear upon the ground and before such contemplated improvements are made; and also photographs from certain points and stations on the ground; that said photographs of the channel and of the various objects and scenses in and about the area of improvements would be a historical memorial to the conditions that had existed prior to the improvements, and that such photographs showing existing conditions previous to the beginning of work, would be of advantage in the future in comparing such improvements with the conditions as had heretofore existed.

Discussion having ensued on the subject, it was the consensus of the Directors that such a photographic record should

be made and that it would be of great benefit in the future in reviewing the history of the past in relation to such matters of improvement now in contemplation.

On motion of Director Stone, seconded by Director Hill, it was ordered that the General Manager of the District be instructed to investigate the cost of having the survey made and photographs taken as suggested by the President, and that the cost of same be reported to the Board of Directors for final action thereon.

There being no further business before the Board, the meeting thereupon adjourned.

All zoning signs used on both lakes during World War Two have been repaired, re-painted and put in place. The custodians at both lakes have been notified to be prepared to place guards at the dams on short notice.

Mr. Oran Speer began mining stone on the Liles Tract, by authority of his contract, on Monday, July 24, 1950.

Rainfall on both Eagle Mountain and Bridgeport watersheds has exceeded the normal for July. Total rainfall recorded during July at Bridgeport Dam was 8.35 inches, and at Eagle Mountain Dam 3.72 inches. On July 27, 1950, the rainfall at Boyd was reported as being 7.65 inches and at Paradise,6.25 inches.
