MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 14TH DAY OF APRIL, 1952, AT 2:00 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors, as follows:

Also present were Sidney L. Samuels, General Counsel, Marvin C. Nichols of Freese and Nichols, Consulting Engineers of the District, and C. L. McNair, General Manager of the District.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

1.

Attached to these minutes as Exhibit "A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District to which reference is made. Exhibit "A" shows that proposed voucher-checks #2560 to #2643, inclusive, had been issued for the total sum \$150,975.53. There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, whereupon Director Pier moved, seconded by Director Priest, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed, and that the accounts payable be approved as covered by the proposed voucher-checks (save and except the voucher-check for \$500.00, payable to McDonald & Company, dated April 12, 1952, No. 2612, which is to be held in abeyance, pending further inquiry

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on the subject) and that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive them. It was so ordered subject to the usual audit.

#### 2.

The annual Audit Report for the year ending December 31, 1951, of the Auditors, Pitner and Adams, was ordered received and to be attached to these minutes as Exhibit "B".

## 3.

The monthly report dated April 14, 1952, of Mr. C. L. McNair, General Manager of the District, for the month of March, 1952, was received, presented and ordered filed as Exhibit "C" to these minutes.

4.

There came before the meeting a written communication of date April 10, 1952, on the letterhead of "Marine Aircraft Corporation, Fort Worth, Texas," which communication was signed by said Marine Aircraft Corporation by L. C. McCarty, Jr., President, in which the writer adverted to his discussion of the matter with Mr. McNair, General Manager of the District, concerning the establishment of a plant of said Marine Aircraft Corporation on properties adjacent to Eagle Mountain Lake, which properties are now under negotiations for exchange with the United States Government, through the Bureau of Yards and Docks. Following the reading of the letter it was stated by the President that the District was in no position to make an engagement of any kind whatsoever with the said Marine Aircraft Corporation or any other person or corporation until the pending transaction with the Federal Government had been brought to a final conclusion. It was so ordered that the letter be received and filed.

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Mr. McNair then presented certain proposals for lease of District's lands for the year 1952, which he recommended for approval, as follows:

Upon consideration of each of the above lease proposals, Director Priest moved, seconded by Director Pier, that the said lease proposals be approved and closed in the usual manner, subject to the payment of the agreed rentals and execution of written contracts in the form required by the District. It was so ordered.

6.

Mr. Ben F. Hickey, Land Agent for the District, presented to the Board for its action thereon four separate tracts of land within the corporate boundaries of the City of Fort Worth, immediately contiguous to the work now being performed by the Federal Army Engineers pursuant to an Act of Congress for the straightening and widening of the channel of the Trinity River, which extends through Fort Worth and part of the territorial area of this District. Mr. Hickey reported that each and all of the four tracts hereinafter described are absolutely necessary to the completion of the plans and work of such Federal Army Engineers now in process of construction and that such engineers require that the District acquire such tracts either by voluntary purchase or by the exercise of eminent domain. Mr. Hickey further reported in connection with the matter, that with respect to each one of the said four tracts, he had been unable to

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arrive at an agreement concerning price with the respective owners thereof, and that in view of the failure to reach an agreement with such owners, after having made repeated attempts therefor, it was necessary, in his opinion, that such tracts be condemned in fee simple to the use of the District under the law governing eminent domain. Mr. Hickey further reported that the four tracts with the owners thereof are as herein set forth, to-wit:

Tract 1. A part of the F. G. Mullikin Survey in Tarrant County, Texas, within the limits of the City of Fort Worth, situated about 1 mile North 20° West from the Court House in Tarrant County, Texas, and embracing a part of the tract conveyed to Joseph B. Googins, by deed of record in Vol. 159, page 165, of the Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas, and being that part of said Googins Tract lying East of the easterly lines of the platted areas of North Fort Worth shown in the maps of record in Vol. 63, page 146, Vol. 104, page 117, and Vol. 106, pages 66 and 67 of said Deed Records and West of the middle of the Trinity River.

This tract, as Mr. Hickey reports upon information given to him, is owned by David S. Googins, who resides at 1902 Hervie Street, Fort Worth, Texas, and his sister Ruth (Googins) Eidson, a married woman, whose husband is Col. Harry T. Eidson, both of whom live in the City of Fort Worth.

Tract 2. A part of the E. Little Survey, situated about 3-1/2 miles N. 4° West from the Court House in Tarrant County, Texas, embracing a part of the tract conveyed to E. L. Voelkel, R. H. Holden and Robert J. Holden, by deed recorded in Vol. 869, page 125, of the Deed Records of Tarrant County Texas, embracing in all 4 acres of which the District should condemn two (2) acres thereof, which two acres are more particularly described by metes and bounds in the instrument attached in folio to these minutes and marked Exhibit "D".

The owners of which said two tracts so sought to be condemned, with their respective addresses are as follows:

Tract 3. Two tracts of land within the corporate limits of the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas, situated within the territorial limits of the property of this District, (which two tracts owned by the same parties) are particularly described as "A" and "B".

> That designated as Tract "A", consisting of 6.84 acres, a part of the E. Little Survey and F. G. Mullikin Survey, in Tarrant County, Texas, situated about 1-1/2 miles N. 4° West from the Court House in Tarrant County, Texas, embracing a part of the first tract conveyed to Nick Vloitos and Sideria Vloitos (a widow) by Deed of Record in Vol. 1654, page 296, of the Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas;

that part of the above mentioned tract to be condemned by the District amounts in quantity to 6.84 acres, which is described by metes and bounds in the instrument attached hereto in folio and made a part hereof as if specifically set up in these minutes.

> <u>Tract "B"</u>: A tract of land situated in Tarrant County, Texas, containing 21.88/1000 acres, which tract, together with the Tract "A" hereinabove set out, contains a total acreage of 27.928/1000 acres. The herein Tract "B" is more particularly described by metes and bounds in the instrument attached to these minutes in folio and described as"Exhibit "D", and made a part hereof as if specifically set up in the body of these minutes.

The owners of said two tracts, "A" and "B", are as follows:

<u>NAME</u> Nick Vloitos Sideria Vloitos ADDRESS 1201 Samuels, Fort Worth, Texas 1201 Samuels, Fort Worth, Texas Following the recitation of the descriptions of all of the tracts of land hereinabove set out for which condemnation under eminent domain to the uses of the District is necessary, Director Seymour, seconded by Director Pier, moved the adoption of the following resolution:

> "BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE: It appearing to the Board, and the Board having so found, that it is necessary to the uses of the District in widening and straightening the channel of the Trinity River, within the borders of the District for the purposes of flood protection, a step which is essential to the welfare and safety of lives and property within the District, it is necessary that the said Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One acquire for such purposes the tracts of land hereinabove set forth and described in the minutes of this meeting preceding the enactment of this resolution, and it further appearing that negotiations were had between the representatives of this District and the owners of said properties and that the said District, through its agent and representative, has been unable to agree upon a price or compensation with said owners for the acquisition of said lands, NOW, THEREFORE: Be it further resolved that the attorneys for the District be, and they are hereby authorized, empowered and instructed to proceed with

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the condemnation under the right of eminent domain of said properties, and that the procedure to be employed for this purpose is contained in the provisions of Title 52 Eminent Domain of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of the year 1925, as therein provided for counties, reference to which is made in subdivision a. of Art. 7880--126 on page 329 of Vol. 21 of Vernon's Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, and to take such other and further steps in connection therewith as may be appropriate and necessary to condemn such properties to the uses of said District as hereinabove provided."

The resolution having been submitted to the Board by the President, all the Directors present voted "aye" thereon, and the motion to adopt such resolution was declared carried and adopted.

7.

The Board next proceeded to consider the expediency of exchanging a tract of land owned by the District for one owned by the Gulf Oil Corporation, both of which tracts abut upon and are contiguous to the channel of the Trinity River, which extends through the eastern part of Fort Worth, and particularly through what is called the old town, as distinguished from additions made to the City long after the City was organized as a municipal corporation.

It appeared from reports of the engineers of the District, that in straightening the channel of that part of the Trinity River above referred to, such action would have the effect of putting part of the tract owned by the Gulf Oil Corporation, which had theretofore

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lain upon the north side of the river to the south side thereof, and that part of the tract owned by the District which had theretofore lain on the south side of the river to the north side thereof.

It was therefore proposed, that by reason of the shifting of the channel of the river in straightening the same out, it would be desirable that the Gulf Oil Corporation own an unbroken indivisible tract and likewise that/District own an unbroken indivisible tract. To bring this about there was necessitated an exchange of properties so that the tract owned by the Gulf Oil Corporation should be located from the center line of the Trinity River north and that the property of the District should be in the center line south, and that each deed form the consideration for the other, and constitute thereby a mutual interchange of properties between the Gulf Oil Corporation and Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One.

On motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Pier, it was ordered that the tract of the Gulf Oil Corporation and the tract of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One should consist of the following described parcels of land:

#### **GULF TRACT:**

A portion of the E. Little and S. K. Smith Surveys, located about 3-1/2 miles N. 10° West from the Tarrant County Court House in Tarrant County, Texas, as recorded in Vol. 1136, page 480, Vol. 388, page 21, Vol. 1647, page 589, and Vol. 1133, page 391, Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas. After changing the course of the Trinity River, the above tracts will be bounded on the South by the center line of the new channel of the Trinity River.

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A portion of the E. Little Survey, about 3-1/2 miles N. 10° West from the Court House in Tarrant County, Texas, as recorded in Vol. 2401, page 32, Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas. After changing the course of the Trinity River, the above described tract will be bounded on the north by the center line of the new channel of the Trinity River.

(All of the above described tracts being located be-) (tween Station 157/01.01 and Station 185/92.60.)

It was further ordered by the Board that there be a mutual exchange of one to the other of deeds of conveyance so far as possible to make effective the arrangement for such exchange of properties. It is also further ordered that the preparation of said deeds of exchange so far as same covers the property in each case to be conveyed by one party to the other, shall be the work of the engineers of the Gulf Oil Corporation and of this District in conference so that the properties may be described with certainty and thereby eliminate confusion in the description thereof.

The matter having been submitted to the Board, all the Directors present voted "aye" thereon and it was accordingly so ordered.

There being no further business before the Board, the meeting thereupon adjourned.
