MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS ON THE 6TH DAY OF MARCH, 1953, AT 2:00 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors, as follows:

ABSENT

Houston Hill Dan H. Priest A. T. Seymour, Jr. Joe B. Hogsett (Out of city) W. L. Pier

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Also present were Messrs. Marvin C. Nichols, of the firm of Freese and Nichols, Consulting Engineers for the District, John L. Scott, member of the Legal Staff of the district, and C. L. McNair, General Manager of the District.

Director Hill acted as President, in the absence of Director Hogsett, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

1.

Attached to these minutes as Exhibit "A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District to which reference is made. Exhibit "A" shows that proposed voucher-checks #3558 to #3663, inclusive, for the total sum \$356,385.20 had been issued since the last meeting. There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, whereupon Director Seymour, moved, seconded by Director Priest, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed and that the accounts payable be approved, as covered by the proposed voucher-checks and that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive

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them. It was so ordered, subject to the usual audit.

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2.

Mr. Nichols presented a suggested letter to be written by the engineers for the District to the City of Fort Worth and Texas Electric Service Company concerning the removal of Nutt Dam and the construction of a new dam. It was decided that the letter should not be written until the District had been definitely ad-Vised in writing by its counsel concerning the legal liability of the District for damages. On motion of Director Seymour, seconded by Director Priest and carried by the affirmative vote of all Directors present, the secretary was directed to request a written opinion from counsel for the District advising the Board as to whether the District is liable to the owners of Nutt Dam for removal thereof and if so, the measure of damage and likewise advising the District as to whether it is liable or obligated to construct another dam under the terms of the bond issue program passed by the voters of the District. Recommendations are to be requested from counsel as to the proper way and manner in which the District should proceed to perform its obligation under its agreement with the United States Government as such obligations relate to the removal of Nutt Dam and the rights of the City of Fort Worth and the Texas Electric Service Company.

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A letter dated February 26, 1953, written by the Corps of Engineers of the United States Army to this Board and relating to certain channel changes requested by Texas Electric Service Company was considered by the Board. Likewise a letter from Texas Electric

Service Company dated March 6, 1953 and addressed to this District concerning the same subject was read and considered by the Board. On motion of Director Seymour, seconded by Director Priest and carried by the affirmative vote of all present, Mr. Nichols was authorized to write the Corps of Army Engineers to the effect that the Board had reached an agreement with the Texas Electric Service Company on the subject of the Engineers' letter of February 26, 1953, and that the District did approve the changes in plans discussed in such letter and would reimburse the Government for the additional costs in accordance with the estimates and procedures set out in such letter to the District dated February 26, 1953.

4.

The Board discussed the question of whether it should contribute any portion of the cost of constructing a bypass to the 7th Street Bridge while alterations in the bridge under the channel improvement program were in progress. It was unanimously agreed that a decision on the question should not be reached until all members of the Board were present and the matter was accordingly tabled.

5.

The Board discussed the claims of Simon Smith relating to the channel improvement program, but it was unanimously decided that no decision should be made in the light of the letter written by the Corps of Army Engineers dated February 20, 1953, until all members of the Board were present.

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On motion of Director Seymour, seconded by Director Priest and unanimously carried by the affirmative vote of all Directors present, Mr. Nichols was requested to advise the Corps of Army Engineers that it is the judgment of this Board that the next contracts to be let for channel improvement should involve improving the Clear Fork channel rather than the West Fork channel because of the increased hazard of floods to industry located on W. 7th Street if the West Fork work be completed before the Clear Fork channel is improved.

7.

Mr. Ben F. Hickey, Land Agent for the District, presented to the Board for its action thereon field notes for two (2) tracts of land within the corporate boundaries of the City of Fort Worth, immediately contiguous to the work now being performed by the Federal Army Engineers pursuant to an Act of Congress for the straightening and widening of the channel of the Trinity River, which extends through Fort Worth and part of the territorial area of this District. Mr. Hickey reported that each of said tracts hereinafter described are absolutely necessary to the completion of the plans and work of such Federal Army Engineers now in process of construction and that such engineers require that the District acquire such tracts by the exercise of eminent domain. Mr. Hickey further man into Webk reported that he had been unable to contact owners of the two (2) said tracts of land and that it was necessary, in his opinion, that such tracts be condemned in fee simple to the use of the District under the law governing eminent domain. Mr. Hickey further

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reported that the two (2) tracts of land with the owners thereof are as herein set forth, to-wit:

1. From J. W. Swiller and Harriet C. Swiller, his wife:

A portion of the A. Gouhenant Survey, Abstract No. 582, in Fort Worth in Tarrant County, Texas, and embracing a portion of the tract conveyed to J.W. Swiller and Harriet C. Swiller, his wife by a deed of record in Vol. 626, page 533 of the deed records of said Tarrant County.

Beginning at the southwest corner of said Swiller tract, being the intersection of the middle of the West Fork of the Trinity River and the west line of said survey.

Thence North, along said line, to the southwest corner of the tract conveyed to Ruth Googins by a deed of record in Vol. 694, page 602 of said Deed Records, being a point on the east bank of said river.

Thence Southeasterly, along the southwest line of said Googins tract and the east bank of the Trinity River, to the south corner of said Googins tract in the south line of said Swiller tract and the north line of a tract conveyed to St. Louis Arkansas and Texas RR. Co. by a deed of record in Vol. 48, page 127 of said Deed Records.

Thence south 45-1/2 degrees West, along said common line, to the south corner of said Swiller tract in the middle of said river.

Thence Northwesterly, up said river with its meanders, to the place of beginning and estimated to contain seven-tenths (0-7/10) of an acre.

2. From David T.EVans:

A portion of the A. Gouhenant Survey, Abstract No. 582, situated in Fort Worth in Tarrant County, Texas, and embracing that portion of the tract conveyed to David T.Evans by a deed of record in Vol. 188, page 169 of the deed records of said Tarrant County between the middle of the channel of the West Fork of the Trinity River and the west or southwest bank of said river.

Following the recitation of the description of the two (2) tracts of land hereinabove set out for which condemnation under eminent domain to the uses of the District is necessary, Director Hill, seconded by Director Pier, moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

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"BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER It appearing to the Board, and the Board having ONE: so found, that it is necessary to the uses of the District in widening and straightening the channel of the Trinity River, within the borders of the District for the purposes of flood protection, a step which is essential to the welfare and safety of lives and property within the District, it is necessary that the said Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One acquire for such purposes the tracts of land hereinabove set forth and described in the minutes of this meeting preceding the enactment of this resolution, and it further appearing that negotiations were had between the representatives of this District and the owners of said properties and that the said District, through its agent and representatives, has been unable to agree upon a price or compensation with said owners for the acquisition of said lands,

NOW, THEREFORE: Be it further resolved that the attorneys for the District be, and they are hereby authorized, empowered and instructed to proceed with the condemnation under the right of eminent domain of said properties, and that the procedure to be employed for this purpose is contained in the pro-

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visions of Title 52 Eminent Domain of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of the year 1925, as therein provided for counties, reference to which is made in subdivision a. of Art. 7880-126 on page 329 of Vol. 21 of Vernon's Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, and to take such other and further steps in connection therewith as may be appropriate and necessary to condemn such properties to the uses of said District as hereinabove provided."

The resolution having been submitted to the Board by the President, all the Directors present voted "aye" thereon, and the motion to adopt such resolution was declared carried and adopted.

There being no other business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

The Construction Fund owns \$6,100,000.00 par value United States Government Securities, which are in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas, for which the District holds the Bank's official receipts therefor.

The Interest and Sinking Fund owns \$800,000.00 United States Securities which are in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas, for which the District holds the Bank's official receipts therefor.

In addition to the \$800,000.00 United States Securities mentioned, the Interest and Sinking Fund also owns Fourteen (14) Vendor's Lien promissory notes of J. D. Craft, bearing date of July 1, 1952, aggregating the sum \$70,000.00; each of said notes being in the principal sum of \$5,000.00, with interest thereon at 4% per annum, payable annually at the office of the District in Fort Worth, Texas, said Fourteen notes maturing on or before seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen and twenty years. The Fourteen (14) notes of J. D. Craft are in the District's office.

On August 18, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the first two (2) notes with interest thereon. On October 20, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the Third and Fourth notes with interest thereon, on the 28th of October, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the fifth note with interest thereon. On December 22, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the sixth note with interest thereon.
