MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 11TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1953, AT 1:30 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors, as follows:

Also present were Messrs. Sidney L. Samuels, General Counsel, C. L. McNair, General Manager of the District, and Marvin C. Nichols, of the Firm of Freese and Nichols, consulting engineers of the District.

In the absence of Mr. Joe B. Hogsett, President of the Board, Mr. Houston Hill, Vice President, presided over the meeting, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

1.

The Directors having received copies of the minutes of a meeting held August 4, 1953, at 1:30 P.M., and having found no objections thereto, it was ordered that they be approved, signed and placed on record.

2.

Attached to these minutes as Exhibit "A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District to which reference is made. Exhibit "A" shows that proposed voucher-checks #4064 to #4234, inclusive, for the total sum \$115,202.69 had been issued since

the last meeting. There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, whereupon Director Seymour moved, seconded by Director Priest, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed, and that the accounts payable be approved, as covered by the proposed voucher-checks; that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive them. It was so ordered, subject to the usual audit.

3∙

Director Priest, in his capacity as Alternate Custodian of pledges, presented reciprocal receipt marked EXHIBIT No. 2, dated August 7, 1953, showing that the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas, the Depositary of the District had on said date delivered to him a certain United States 1-3/8% Treasury Note (fully described in said EXHIBIT No. 2) having par value \$100,000.00, in lieu of other bond to secure deposits of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, and in accordance with the terms of said Depositary Bond and contract for pledge of collateral security the said bond was by him placed in the dual lock or combination control deposit box, in the burglar-proof vault of the Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas.

Thereupon, Director Pier moved, seconded by Director Seymour, that the act of Director Priest in his capacity as Alternate Custodian of pledges be ratified and confirmed, further that one copy of said reciprocal receipt be attached to these minutes as Exhibit "B", and made a part hereof, and that another copy thereof be attached to the depositary bond and contract for pledge of collateral securities as EXHIBIT No. 2 thereto, and to become a part thereof, as provided

therein. Upon a vote being taken the motion was unanimously carried and it was so ordered.

4.

Mr. Ben F. Hickey, Land Agent for the District, submitted to the Board of Directors two certain contracts for the acquisition of floodway lands as follows, to-wit:

- 1. Contract of sale and purchase of property executed August 6, 1953, by Charles L. Sexton and wife, Laura Sexton, as sellers, and for the District by Director Houston Hill. The consideration to be paid by the District was \$550.00. the property covered by this contract is described as Lot No. 5, in Block No. C-3, Fields-Hillside Addition to the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas. The transaction to be conducted through Rattikin Title Company of Fort Worth, Texas;
- 2. contract of sale and purchase of property executed August 6, 1953, by Roy Rich and wife, Mary Rich, as sellers, and for the District by Director Houston Hill. The consideration to be paid by the District was \$4,050.00. The property covered by this contract is described as Lot No. 10, in Block 16, Evans, Pearson, Westwood Addition, and all improvements located thereon, lying in the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas. The transaction to be conducted through Rattikin Title Company, of Fort Worth, Texas.

On motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Pier, said contracts were ratified with instructions that upon completion of the same by deeds of conveyance duly executed and acknowledged by the vendors and title policy issued in each such case, that voucher-check be drawn to cover each transaction and be delivered to the respective sellers when trade concerning each piece of property is completed. All the Directors present voted "aye" thereon.

3

Motion was made by Director Priest, seconded by Director Seymour, that the Board ratify and approve the contract heretofore made, dated July 19, 1953, with Arlington Heights Building and Repair Service for the moving and relocation of improvements from Lot No. 6, in Block No. C-3 of Fields Hillside Addition to Lot No. 2, in Block "Z" of the same Addition to the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas, and that a voucher-check issue to Arlington Heights Building and Repair Service in the amount of \$1,803.21, for the performance of such services above mentioned, and in addition thereto a commission of 10 per cent be allowed the contractor amounting to \$180.32, making the total to be paid to Arlington Heights Building and Repair Service the sum of \$1,983.53, and that the voucher-check when issued read for that amount. All the Directors present voted "aye" thereon, and the motion was declared carried.

6.

There came before the Board the matter of a lease dated the 15th of August, 1951, between Ware A. Higginbotham, sublessor, on the one hand, and the Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, sublessee, on the other. The instrument in question recited that Higginbotham, at the date of the execution of the instrument (August 15, 1951), held a ten-year lease from Mrs. Arilla Evans on a tract of land out of the R. Crowley Survey in Tarrant County, Texas, and more particularly, out of that part of said survey numbered 3, in the decree of the 48th District Court, Tarrant County, Texas, in Cause No. 19641-A, and set out by metes and bounds in the foregoing lease contract. This lease further recited that Higginbotham desired to sublet the foregoing premises for a part of

the said term to the District. Further, under the terms of the instrument, Higginbotham did lease, demise and assign to the District a certain building 20x30 feet in dimension located at 608 Jacksboro Highway, situated on the land hereinabove described for the term of two years, beginning August 15, 1951, and ending August 14, 1953; the District to pay the sum of \$600.00 for the entire two-year period, and it was further stipulated that the District would expend the sum of \$500.00 in the construction and repair of the building, and that such expenditure would be credited as part payment on the \$600.00 the District was to pay as rent for the two-year period; and since the District had made such expenditure of \$500.00, it should be entitled to the credit thereof on the total rent for two years as above stated of \$600.00, and therefore the balance due to Higginbotham under such agreement amounts to \$100.00. Further, that the District had exervised the right to renew and extend the lease for an additional year from August 15, 1953, and the District should pay as rent therefor the sum of \$25.00 per month, beginning August 15, 1953, which \$25.00 for one month when added to the balance above mentioned, would make the sum total of \$125.00 owing to Higginbotham, for which proper vouchercheck should issue.

On motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Pier, the foregoing matters were approved and voucher-check ordered by the Board to be issued to Ware A. Higginbotham in the amount of \$125.00.

All the Directors present voted "aye" thereon, and the motion carried.

7.

On motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Pier, Mr. Hickey, Land Agent, was directed to cancel the original lease

contract on what is known as The Lazy Land Trailer Court, situated on the Zena A. Wright property, and in lieu of contingent rent thereon, that the lease of the premises to said Lazy Land Trailer Court should be a flat sum and not dependent on profits of the lessee in the conduct of its business, and that Mr. Hickey report to the Board the flat sum agreed upon between the District and the Lazy Land Trailer Court. Further, that the lease to the Lazy Land Trailer Court should be upon a month to month basis so that the District would be at liberty at the expiration of any one month to terminate the relationship. All the Directors present voted "aye" thereon.

8.

There was presented and read to the Board a letter emanating from Freese and Nichols, engineers of the District, dated August 5, 1953, to the effect that the Ottinger Construction Company had completed, according to the specifications, the construction of the East 4th Street Bridge, and that the District should accept the bridge as completed from the contractor. In this connection, the Board discussed the question of penalties to be assessed under the contract against the Ottinger Construction Company for the delay in the completion of the contract according to the specific terms of such contract. It was the recommendation of Mr. Nichols, that the penalties for such delay should not exceed \$3,000.00, and in respect to that amount that in issuing voucher-check to Ottinger Construction Company, such amount should be deducted and withheld from Estimate #19, and final, (\$54,685.00), and in addition thereto there should likewise be deducted and withheld, pending adjustment the amount which was asserted by Preston Scott, the subcontractor, to be owing by Ottinger Construction

Company to Scott. There also appeared in the correspondence on file in respect to the Ottinger Construction Company in the matter of the East 4th Street Bridge, a claim asserted by the Federal Government for delinquent tax owing to said Government by the said Preston Scott; Mr. Samuels, the Counsel for the District, held that such claim did not impound or halt the payment of any moneys owing by the District to Mr. Ottinger growing out of the East 4th Street Bridge, because the effort of the Federal Government was confined to impounding funds that might be owing by Ottinger Construction Company to Scott, and that such Government did not in anywise seek to impound funds owing by the District to the Ottinger Construction Company. Thereupon, it was agreed that for the present, and until such matters had been adjusted, that there be paid on account to Ottinger Construction Company a voucher-check for \$40,000.00, and that the remainder of the contract price be withheld until the matter of penalties and the release of the Preston Scott claim had been secured. Accordingly, it was ordered that for the present, voucher-check be duly issued payable to Ottinger Construction Company as part credit on the contract price. The motion to take this action was made by Director Pier, seconded by Director Priest, all Directors present voted "aye" thereon.

9.

Mr. McNair, General Manager of the District, appeared before the Board and asked the authority of the Board to purchase a Model 4-T John Bean Sprayer, 150 gallon tank, 600x16 Tires, equipped with No. 785 DeLuxe Spraymaster Gun, for purposes controlling vegetation growth on District's property, and particularly within the

lake basins. On motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Pier, such authority was directed to Mr. McNair, but that purchase should be made from the lowest bidder. All the Directors present voted "aye" thereon, and Mr. McNair was accordingly so authorized.

10.

There was read before the Board carbon copy of a letter dated August 10, 1953, from the Eighth Naval District, New Orleans, Louisana, which was addressed to Colonel John F. B. Lyons, Commanding Officer, Texas National Guard, Eagle Mountain National Guard Base, Newark, Texas, in which Captain J. A. Stelger, CEC, USN District Public Works Officer, advised Colonel Lyons of the holding by this District of a permit to certain lands in Tarrant County pending formal exchange of lands between this District and the United States Government.

In this letter it was recited to Colonel Lyons that before allowing cattle to graze on land, permission should be obtained from this District in advance of such action.

In connection with this matter, Mr. McNair, the General Manager of the District was requested to notify Colonel Lyons to remove and take the cattle from the premises aforesaid, all the Directors present voted "aye" thereon.

11.

Mr. Cheatham reported to the Board that the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth had handled the \$2,200,000.00 proceeds of U. S. Treasury Bills dated May 7, 1953, maturity August 6, 1953, in accordance with the authorization granted President Hogsett at a meeting held on July 28, 1953, at 1:30 P.M. by the Board of Dir-

ectors of this District, in the following manner:

- (a) Out of the proceeds of \$2,000,000.00 U.S. Treasury Bills dated May 7, 1953, maturity August 6, 1953, owned by the Construction Fund, the Fort Worth National Bank issued its Cashier's check No. B713815 for \$500,000.00 payable to the order of this District, the said Cashier's check was on August 7, 1953, deposited in the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, the District's Depositary, to the credit of the Construction Fund; of the remaining \$1,500,000.00 balance of the proceeds, there was reinvested for the use and benefit of said fund, the sum \$1,491,975.00 in U. S. Treasury Bills, dated August 6, 1953, maturity November 5, 1953, The difference in the balance of the proceeds (\$1,500,000.00) of the maturing bills and the cost of the bills dated August 6, 1953, maturing November 5, 1953, amounted to \$8,025.00, for which sum the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth issued its Cashier's check No. B713814 for \$8,025.00 payable to the order of this District. The said Cashier's check was on August 7, 1953 deposited in the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, the District's Depositary, to the credit of the Construction Fund.
- (b) Out of the proceeds of \$200,000.00 U.S. Treasury Bills dated May 7, 1953, maturity August 6, 1953, owned by the Interest and Sinking Fund, there was reinvested for said fund the sum \$198,920.00 in United States Treasury Bills dated August 6, 1953, maturity November 5, 1953. The difference in the proceeds of the maturing bills and the cost of the bills dated August 6, 1953, maturity November 5, 1953, amounted to \$1,080.00, for which sum the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth issued its Cashier's check No.8713816 for \$1,080.00 payable to the order of this District. The said Cashier's check was on August 7, 1953 deposited in the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, the District's Depositary, to the credit of the Interest and Sinking Fund.

Mr. Cheatham reported that the above described securities are deposited in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth; for which the District holds the said

Bank's official receipts, which he presented to the Board for examination. The Trust Receipts are described as follows:

SK No. B 51068 for \$1,500,000.00, United States Treasury Bills, dated August 6, 1953, maturity November 5, 1953, owned by the "Construction Fund."

SK No. B51064 for \$200,000.00 United States Treasury Bills dated August 6, 1953, maturity November 5, 1953, owned by the "Interest and Sinking Fund."

All the Directors present voted to receive said Trust Receipts and ordered that they be deposited for safekeeping in lock box No. 984 at the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas, the Depositary of the District, and that the action taken in the foregoing matters all and singular, were ratified by the Board.

12.

There being no further business before the Board, the meeting thereupon adjourned.
