MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 15th DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1953, AT 1:30 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of Directors, as follows:

PRESENT .

Joe B. Hogsett Houston Hill Dan H. Priest W. L. Pier A. T. Seymour, Jr.

Also present were Messrs. Sidney L. Samuels, General Counsel, C.L. McNair, General Manager of the District, and Marvin C. Nichols, of the firm of Freese and Nichols, consulting engineers of the District.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

1 _

Attached to these minutes as Exhibit "A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District to which reference is made. Exhibit "A" shows that proposed voucher-checks #4235 to #4370, inclusive, for the total sum \$376,773.34 had been issued since the last meeting. There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, whereupon Director Seymour moved, seconded by Director Pier, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed, and that the accounts payable be approved, as covered by the proposed voucher-checks; that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled

to receive them. It was so ordered, subject to the usual audit.

2.

Director W. L. Pier reported to the Board of Directors that in conformity with resolution had and passed at the meeting of the Board of Directors at a meeting held on August 25, 1953, he had arranged with the Fort Worth National Bank for them to make the exchange with the Treasurer of the United States of \$3,500,000.00 par value, Registered 2% United States Treasury Bonds of 1951/53, dated September 15, 1943, maturity September 15, 1951/53, owned by the District's Construction Fund, for \$3,500,000.00 par value United States 2-5/8% Certificates of Indebtedness, Series E-1954, dated September 15, 1953, maturity September 15, 1954, with interest coupon due September 15, 1954, attached thereto; the exchange of said securities was made for the use and benefit of the District's Construction Fund. Thereupon, Director Priest moved, seconded by Director Seymour, that the action of Director Pier in making the foregoing exchange was approved by the Board and ratified and validated in all respects. All the Directors voting "aye" thereon, the motion was declared carried and adopted.

3.

It appearing to the Board that in part of paragraph #3 of the minutes of August 18, 1953, relative to the property known as Lazy Land Trailer Court, purchased by the District from Mrs. Zena A. Wright, that Mrs. Wright was thereafter to pay to the District the sum of \$150.00 per month beginning the 1st day of September, 1953, whereas, the beginning date was the 20th of August, 1953, and in order that the true date for the beginning of the payment of such monthly rental

should be changed in accordance with the facts, it was moved by Director Seymour, seconded by Director Hill, that such minutes should be corrected and should be made to read, that the monthly rental began on the 20th day of August, 1953. All the Directors present voted "aye" thereoh, and accordingly the minutes should read as herein stated.

4.

There was read to the Board a letter under date of September 8, 1953, from the Town of Westover Hills, acting through Honorable W. R. Wheeler, Mayor thereof, in which it was stated that the Town of Westover Hills, a part of which is now within the territorial limits of this District, desired to obtain from the Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One the right to take water from the West Fork of the Trinity River, conditioned as follows:

- 1. That the water so required would be used for municipal supply of Westover Hills;
- 2. that the proposed point of diversion would be at a point approximately 5,000 feet south of and down-stream from White Settlement Road, as shown on the attached map;
- 3. that the maximum annual requirement of water would be 175 million gallons (537 acre feet);
- the maximum monthly requirement of water would be 34.5 million gallons (105.9 acre-feet.)
- 5. the maximum daily requirement of water would be 1.5 million gallons (4.6 acre-feet.)

Following this enumeration, the letter concluded that the Town of Westover Hills desired to enter into an agreement with the District covering the above water requirements, and that the commissioners of Westvoer Hills would be pleased to meet with the Directors of this District at a convenient time and discuss the terms and

conditions of such agreement.

On motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Pier, it was ordered that the letter from Westover Hills should be acknowledged by Mr. Nichols, Engineer of the District, and that a committee be appointed to negotiate a contract between Westover Hills and the District, which committee should consist of Houston Hill, Vice President of the Board of Directors of the District, Marvin C. Nichols, Engineer of the District, and Sidney L. Samuels, Counsel for the District, and that Mr. A. T. Seymour should sit in with the committee during the process of negotiations. It was further ordered that when the negotiations for such agreement had been completed between the committee of the District and the officials of Westover Hills, the results of such negotiations embodied in a mutual contract be reported to the Board of Directors of this District, then such contract when so embodied in writing be executed by the authorities of both the District and the aforesaid Town of Westover Hills. It was so ordered, all the Directors present voting "aye" on both motions.

5.

The Board then took up for consideration the application of River Oaks for water supply therein, and it was again moved by Director Seymour, seconded by Director Pier, that the same committee that had been appointed to negotiate an agreement between Westover Hills and the District be appointed to negotiate a contract for the supply of water to River Oaks, and that meanwhile Mr. Nichols be instructed to notify the River Oaks officials of the action of this Board in respect to this matter.

It was further ordered that when such negotiations had been

completed and embodied in a mutual contract, the committee should report its action in the premises to the Board of Directors of the District for ratification.

6.

There was read to the Board a letter from Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, Engineer of the District, dated September 3, 1953, addressed to the District to the effect that the 5th and final estimate for the project known as LaGrave Field Sewer Crossing on Sewer Main 1-I-1, had been issued on work done by Sira and Payne, the contractors. In this connection, among other things, Mr. Nichols called attention to the fact that an extra work item of \$5,305.25 was included in such final estimate to cover work done in rerouting the American Cyanamid discharge line, and that it was necessary to reroute this line to accommodate the new floodway section and that the work was added by change order to Sira and Payne's contract at the negotiated unit prices shown on the estimate. He further added in his communication that the work on both the LaGrave Field Sewer Siphon, and the American Syanamid Discharge line have been completed in accordance with the plans and specifications, and it was recommended that the balance due on the final estimate of \$13,330.23 be paid. The letter was signed Freese and Nichols, by Joe B. Mapes, and by Marvin C. Nichols, individually. The letter, together with itemized estimate, was ordered to be filed among the archives of the District.

7.

There was read to the Board a further communication in writing dated September 9, 1953, addressed to the District, signed by Freese

and Nichols, by Mr. Joe B. Mapes, and Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, individually, concerning the 20" Sewer Main, M-162 and Cold Springs Road Water Line, in which communication the District was informed that the 5th and final estimate for the project covering the work done by Whittle Contracting Company had been issued. Attention was particularly called to the fact that the final cost of the project is \$51,772.76, as compared to \$51,506.00, and that the latter figures represented the original estimated cost, but that the additional cost comprises the salvaging 29.83 linear feet of 24" cast iron pipe more than was originally estimated and the extra work items consist of hauling some salvage 20" cast pipe to the water district warehouse yard and making three additional taps in the new water line as requireed for chlorinating and flushing the line. Further, that the original proposal consists of three items whereas, the estimate shows fourteen itmes. It was further recommended by the Engineers that the balance due on this final estimate in the amount of \$8,809.29 be paid.

On motion of Director Pier, seconded by Director Seymour, following the reading of both communications hereinabove mentioned, that the 5th and final estimate of Sira and Payne and Whittle Contracting Company be paid, and that proper voucher-checks be issued for the respective amounts due to each of the contractors.

The motion having been submitted, all the Directors voted "aye" thereon, and it was accordingly so ordered. It was further ordered that both letters from Mr. Nichols, together with the estimates attached thereto, be preserved in the archives of the District.

8.

There appeared before the Board as attorney and representative

of the Ottinger Construction Company, Mr. Baylor L. Agerton, who represented the matter of the balance owing to Ottinger Construction Company on the E. 4th Street Bridge over the Trinity River in Fort Worth, a part of Program B of the Flood Prevention Program.

It was made to appear to the District that the final estimate, No. 19 issued by the engineers of the District, showed that the total amount set forth in said final estimate was \$54,685.00. It was further made to appear as reflected in the minutes of prior meetings, that Preston Scott, a sub-contractor, through his attorneys had notified the District that the Ottinger Construction Company was owing to Scott the sum of \$5,267.97, and that the contract with the Ottinger Construction Company provided for penalties to be paid by such company in the event that the completion of the said bridge was delayed beyond the ultimate date fixed for such completion according to the terms of the contract, and that in the meeting of the Board of Directors held on the 11th of August 1953, there was authorized to be paid to the Ottinger Construction Company the amount of \$40,000.00 on account pending the release of the Preston Scott claim and the adjustment of the matter of the penalties above mentioned, and that accordingly there was issued to the Ottinger Construction Company Voucher-check No. 4238, dated August 14, 1953, for \$40,000.00 payable out of the construction fund of the District, and said voucher-check was drawn and delivered to the said Ottinger Construction Company to apply as a credit, leaving a balance of \$14.685.00 withheld because of the two matters hereinabove set out.

It appeared from the statements of Mr. Agerton at the instant meeting that the matter with Scott had not yet been cleared up, and

further, after a round-table discussion of the matter of penalties, it was agreed that settlement of this matter should be postponed until further information was vouchsafed by both Mr. Agerton and Mr. Nichols, the engineer of the District, but that meanwhile a voucher-check be drawn in the amount of \$6,415.03, payable to the order of the Ottinger Construction Company and delivered to Mr. B. L. Agerton, attorney for the said Ottinger Construction Company, as an additional credit payment on the final estimate issued on the construction of the East 4th Street Bridge, which, with the \$40,000.00 heretofore paid, would make up a total sum of \$46,415.03 paid to Ottinger Construction Company on the aforesaid final estimate, leaving the balance yet to be disposed of at a future meeting. Accordingly, voucher-check #4382, dated September 15, 1953, for \$6,415.03 was drawn and executed by the Directors and delivered into the hands of Mr. B. L.Agerton, attorney for Ottinger Construction Company, as a further payment on account to Ottinger Construction Company. All the Directors voted "aye" on the foregoing matters.

9.

Mr. McNair, General Manager of the District, presented to the Board the easement contract between the District and the Lone Star Gas Company, which easement extended over the following described property, and defined as follows:

Situated in Tarrant County, Texas, consisting of a 135.45 acre tract of land out of the D. T. Flores Survey, Abstract No. 509, at a point approximately 1400 feet south of the north line of the J. Wilcox No. 42 Survey; thence in a general northerly direction approximately 1194 feet to a point in the Right-of-Way for a 16" gas line granted by the District August 2, 1950, to said Lone Star Gas Company.

The easement to the Lone Star Gas Company was for the purpose of enabling that company to construct a pipe line or lines in and under the aforesaid property, and was dated September 15, 1953, The consideration for the easement so granted by the District to the Lone Star Gas Company was the sum \$36.00.

On motion of Director Hill, seconded by Director Priest, the instrument as drawn and exhibited to the Board was approved and ordered to be made a part of the archives of the District.

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There was presented to the Board for consideration a request emanating from Lake Bridgeport Recreation Park, Inc., in which it was sought by said Recreation Park that it be released from the obligations of a lease heretofore granted by the District to it. The request for such release was coupled with the following statement made in the letter of request, from which we make an exact quotation:

- "1. We cannot comply with the terms of the contract.
 - 2. It has not been practical to open the park this year at all, due to the lack of water, and the destruction by fire of our facilities at the park."

The letter of request was signed by Oscar Cox, Jr., President of Lake Bridgeport Recreation Park, Inc., and was addressed to Mr. C. L. McNair, General Manager, and dated September 1, 1953.

It appearing to the Board that the Lessee was destitute of properties and had no means by which to carry out the terms of the lease or to respect the obligations, which were imposed on it by said contract, it was therefore, considered that the release should be granted and possession of the property immediately turned over to the District. It was further resolved that an instrument be drawn to be

signed by both parties to the lease--the District and the Lessee, in which each release to the other any further claim with respect to the contract, and that the possession of the property be fully vested once again in the District. On motion of Director Hill, seconded by Director Priest, it was so ordered, all the Directors voting "aye" thereon.

11.

There was brought before the Board the matter of the bond of Mr. Reed Stewart, Tax Assessor-Collector for the District. The bond which was attached to the letter was one executed by American Surety Company, New York, and was in the amount of \$50,000.00, payable to the Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, dated November 19, 1952, which bond was given as security for the performance of the duties and obligations of the said Reed Stewart, as the Assessor-Collector of taxes for the Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One for a period of two years beginning on January 1, 1953, and terminating at midnight on December 31, 1954, which contract attached to the bond was dated the 8th of December, 1952.

It appearing that the contract had, through error, been delivered to the office of Mr. Sidney L. Samuels, attorney for the District, by reason of which the bond had not theretofore been ratified
by the District, on motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director
Hill, the contract and bond were ratified and accepted according to
the terms of both instruments; all the Directors voting "aye" thereon.

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Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, engineer for the District, having

reported to the Board of Directors that the East 4th Street Bridge, crossing the Trinity River, forming part of the Flood Prevention Plan covered by Program B, in the construction of which the District had been engaged for some time, had been fully completed according to the plans and specifications prepared by Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, the engineer of the District, approved by the Board of Directors of the District and by the State Board of Water Engineers, and Mr.C. M. Thelin, Director of Public Works of the City of Fort Worth, Texas; thereupon, it was moved by Director Hill, seconded by Director Priest, that a letter from the District to be signed on its behalf by Mr. Joe B. Hogsett, President, be addressed to the Mayor and City Council of the City of Fort Worth informing that body that such bridge had been completed, and that the obligation of the District with respect to same had fully terminated and the bridge fell under the jurisdiction of the City of Fort Worth for the purpose of travel and that the District relinquishes further control from the structure to the City of Fort Worth, to which City it officially belonged. Said letter was accordingly written and signed by Mr. Hogsett, as President of the Board, and one copy delivered to Mr. C. M. Thelin, Director of Public Works of the City of Fort Worth, and another copy to the Mayor of the City Council of the City of Fort Worth.

On motion of Director Hill, seconded by Director Priest, such action was authorized and ratified and action thereon accordingly taken in conformity with the motion, all Directors voting "aye" thereon. The said letter is attached in folio to these minutes.

13.

There was read before the District a written communication

on the letterhead of the City of Fort Worth, Texas, of the Public Works Department, executed by Mr. C. M. Thelin, Director of such Public Works, addressed to Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, Engineer of the Disatrict, informing Mr. Nichols with reference to the demolition of the old East 4th Street Bridge, that the City Council in session September 9, 1953, granted permission to Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, to take bids on September 29, 1953, for the demolition of the said Old E. 4th Street Bridge in accordance with plans, and specifications that Mr. Nichols had previously furnished to the Public Works Department of the City of Fort Worth. It was ordered that said letter be received and filed and preserved in the archives of the District, all the Directors voting "aye" thereon.

14.

Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, Engineer of the District, reported that in company with Mr. Sidney L. Samuels, Counsel for the District, he had appeared before the State Board of Water Engineers at Austin, on September 14, 1953, with respect to the amendment to Permit No. 1074 Eagle Mountain Lake, which amendment extended the authority of the District with respect to waters to be supplied from such source to various suburban areas and to industrial enterprises.

The effect of this amendment was to broaden out the authority in the original Permit No. 1074, granted to the District by the State Board of Water Engineers on the 1st day of May, 1928. In this application for such amendment it was pointed out in paragraph one of the application that, under the terms of Permit No. 1074 as it originally stood, the authority of the District to furnish water for municipal uses had been confined to the City of Fort Worth, although other municipal

cipalities are within or partly within the boundaries of the District; that the original permit should be amended to the end that individual irrigators whose lands are within the area described in the original permit may be furnished water by the District, for purposes of irrigation either through the bed and banks of the Trinity river or through raw water conduits; that the District be granted the same flowage rights as were authorized and bestowed on the District in Permit No. 1073, granted by the State Board of Water Engineers, and which had permitted the use by the District of the bed and banks of the Trinity River in flowage of water to any user and that this flowage right to use the bed and banks of the Trinity River to the Dallas County Line be granted in the amendment to Permit No. 1074, that the nature and purposes of the powers sought in the application for the amended permit were for beneficial purposes and domestic purposes in the use of such waters, for municipalities within or partly within the boundaries of the District and the inhabitants thereof, for the supply and use of industrial enterprises that would add to the taxable values and wealth of the District. This, in brief, represented the request for amendments contained in the application addressed to the State Board of Water Engineers. Mr. Nichols further reported that the application, except in some few parts which were not of significance, was fully granted to the District, and that the amended permit would thereafter be approved by the State Board of Water Engineers and forwarded to the District by that Body.

It was further ordered that this report on the part of Mr. Nichols be approved and that the application for the amended permit

be made a part of the permanent records of the District and preserved as such.

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Mr. Ben F. Hickey, Land Agent of the District, presented for the consideration of the Board, a contract for the acquisition of lands for flood purposes, as follows:

Lot No. 15, Block No. 22, Evans-Pearson-Westwood Addition to the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas, and all improvements located thereon, of which Rufino Luna, and wife, Isabel Luna, are sellers. The consideration of the sale is \$2,000.00 to be paid by the District, and title insurance to be procured through Rattikin Title Company of Fort Worth, Texas, The contract was signed by the sellers, Rufino Luna and wife, Isabel Luna, and for the District by Houston Hill, and dated September 14, 1953.

On motion of Director Seymour, seconded by Director Hill, said contract was ratified with instructions that upon completion of the same by deed of conveyance duly executed and acknowledged by the vendor and title policy issued in such case, that voucher-check be drawn to cover the transaction and be delivered to the sellers when the trade has been completed. All the Directors voted "aye" thereon.

There being no further business before the meeting, adjourn-

ment was had.

The Maintenance Fund owns \$350,000.00 par value United States Government Securities, and \$45,000.00 par value this District's Bonds, which are in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas, for which the District holds the Bank's official receipts therefor.

The Construction Fund owns \$5,000,000.00 par value United States Government Securities, which are in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas, for which the District holds the Bank's official receipts therefor.

The Interest and Sinking Fund owns \$1,000,000.00 United States Securities, which are in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas, for which the District holds the Bank's official receipts therefor.

In addition to the \$1,000,000.00 United States Securities mentioned, the Interest and Sinking Fund also owns Eleven (11) Vendor's Lien Promissory Notes of J. D. Craft, bearing date of July 1, 1952, aggregating the sum \$55,000.00; each of said notes being in the principal sum of \$5,000.00, with interest thereon at 4% per annum, payable annually at the office of the District in Fort Worth, Texas, said eleven notes maturing on or before ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen and twenty years.

The eleven (11) notes of J. D. Craft are in the District's office.

On August 18, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the first two (2) notes with interest thereon. On October 20, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the Third and Fourth notes with interest thereon. On the 28th of October, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the fifth note with interest thereon. On December 22, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the sixth note with interest thereon. On June 2, 1953, Mr. Craft paid the Seventh and Eighth notes with interest thereon. On August 12, 1953, Mr. Craft paid the Ninth Note with interest thereon.
