MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 17th DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1953, AT 1:30 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of Directors as follows:

Also present were Messrs. Sidney L. Samuels and John M. Scott of the legal staff of the District, Mr. C. L. McNair, General Manager of the District, and Marvin C. Nichols of the firm of Freese and Nichols, consulting engineers of the District.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done as follows:

ı.

The Directors had previously received copies of the minutes of meetings held on the following dates:

September 29, 1953, at 1:30 P.M. October 20, 1953, at 1:30 P.M. October 28, 1953, at 1:30 P.M. November 3, 1953, at 1:30 P.M.

Having found no objections thereto, it was ordered that they be approved, signed and placed on record.

2.

Attached to these minutes as Exhibit "A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District to which reference is

made.

Exhibit "A" shows that proposed voucher-checks #4505 to #4617, inclusive, for the total sum \$191,098.70 had been issued since the last meeting. There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, whereupon Director Priest moved, seconded by Director Pier, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed and the accounts payable be approved as dovered by the proposed voucher-checks and that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive them. It was so ordered, subject to the usual audit.

3.

President Hogsett reported to the Board that the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth had handled for the District, the \$1,850,000.00 proceeds of United States Treasury Bills described in the following Fort Worth National Bank Safekeeping Department Trust Receipts:

- (a) SK No. B 51068 for \$1,500,000.00 United States Treasury Bills, dated 8-6-53, maturity 11-5-53, owned by the "Construction Fund."
- (b) SK No·B51064 for \$200,000.00 United States Treasury Bills, dated 8-6-53, maturity 11-5-53, owned by the "Interest and Sinking Fund."
- (c) SK No. B51123 for \$50,000.00 United States
 Treasury Bills, dated 8-13-53, maturity 11-12-53,
 owned by the "Interest and Sinking Fund."
- (d) SK No. B51124 for \$100,000.00 United States
 Treasury Bills, dated 8-13-53, maturity 11-12-53,
 owned by the "Maintenance Fund."
 The proceeds of the maturing Treasury Bills were handled

by the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth, in the following manner:

- (a) Out of the proceeds of \$1,500,000.00 United States Treasury Bills dated 8-6-53, maturity 11-5-53, owned by the Construction Fund, the Fort Worth National Bank issued its Cashier's Check No. B719678 for \$400,000.00, payable to the order of this District, the said Cashier's Check was on November 10, 1953, deposited in the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, the District's Depositary, to the credit of the Construction Fund; of the remaining \$1,100,000.00 balance of the proceeds, there was reinvested for the use and benefit of said fund, the sum \$1,096,480.00 in United States Treasury Bills, dated 11-5-53, maturity 2-4-54. The difference in the balance of the proceeds (\$1,100,000.00) of the maturing bills and the cost of the bills dated 11-5-53, maturity 2-4-54, amounted to \$3,520.00, for which sum the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth issued its Cashier's Check No. B719679 for \$3,520.00, payable to the order of this District. The said Cashier's check was on November 10, 1953, deposited in the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, the District's Depositary, to the credit of the Construction Fund.
- (b) Out of the proceeds of \$200,000.00 United States Treasury Bills, dated 8-6-53, maturity 11-5-53, owned by the Interest and Sinking Fund, there was reinvested for the use and benefit of said fund the sum of \$199,340.00 in United States Treasury Bills, dated 11-5-53, maturity 2-4-54. The difference in the balance of the proceeds (\$200,000.00) of the maturing bills and the cost of the bills dated 11-5-53, maturity 2-4-54, amounted to \$660.00, for which sum the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth issued its Cashier's check No. B719680 for \$660.00, payable to the order of this District, the said Cashier's Check was on November 10, 1953, deposited in the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, the District's Depositary, to the credit of the Interest and Sinking Fund.
- (c) Out of the proceeds of \$50,000.00 United States Treasury Bills, dated 8-13-53, maturity 11-12-53, owned by the Interest and Sinking Fund, there was reinvested for the use and benefit of said fund the sum \$49,813.00 in United States Treasury Bills dated 11-12-53, maturity 2-11-54. The difference in the balance of the proceeds (\$50,000.00) of the maturing bills and the cost of the bills dated 11-12-53, maturity 2-11-54, amounted to \$187.00, for which sum the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth issued its Cashier's Check No. B720067, for \$187.00 payable to the order of this District, the said Cashier's Check was on November 17, 1953, deposited in the

Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, the District's Depositary, to the credit of the Interest and Sinking Fund.

(d) Out of the proceeds of \$100,000.00 United States
Treasury Bills, dated 8-13-53, maturity 11-12-53,
owned by the Maintenance Fund there was reinvested for the use and benefit of said fund the sum
of \$99,626.00 in United States Treasury Bills, dated
11-12-53, maturity 2-11-54. The difference in the
balance of the proceeds (\$100,000.00) of the maturing
bills and the cost of the bills dated 11-12-53,
maturity 2-11-54, amounted to \$374.00, for which sum
the FortWorth National Bank of Fort Worth issued
its Cashier's Check No. B720068, for \$374.00 payable
to the order of this District. The said Cashier's
Check was on November 17, 1953, deposited in the
Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, the District's
Depositary, to the credit of the Maintenance Fund.

President Hogsett then reported that the above described securities are deposited in the safekeeping department of the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth, for which the District holds the said bank's official Trust Receipts, described as follows:

SK No. B51635, dated 11-6-53, for \$1,100,000.00 United States Treasury Bill SK No. B51634, dated 11-6-53, for \$200,000.00 United States Treasury Bill SK No. B41686, dated 11-13-53, for \$50,000.00 United States Treasury Bill SK No. B51687, dated 11-13-53, for \$100,000.00 United States Treasury Bill The Trust Receipts were then presented to the Board for examin-

All the Directors present voted to receive the said Trust Receipts and ordered that they be deposited for safekeeping in lock box 984 at the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas, the Depositary of the District; further, that the action taken in the foregoing trans-

ation.

actions, all and singular be ratified and confirmed. It was so ordered.

Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, engineer for the District, presented to the Board a certain written communication on the letterhead of Freese and Nichols, dated November 16, 1953, with regard to the Wage Rate Schedule to be used in construction of Crawford Addition Drainage Structures, which letter was as follows:

"Attached hereto is a minimum wage rate schedule which we propose to use in the contract documents for the subject project. This schedule is the same one as used on the LaGrave Field sewer crossing project. Please advise if this wage rate schedule would meet with your approval for use on the subject project."

On consideration of this matter by the Board, it was moved by Director Seymour, seconded by Director Pier, that the wage rate schedule attached to said communication be adopted and that the engineers in charge be authorized to adopt and recommend for payment the wage rate set forth in the schedule attached to said written communication. All the Directors voted "aye" thereoh, and it was accordingly so ordered.

5.

There was also presented to the Board for consideration and allowance a statement of charges by Mr. Brookes Baker for services that had been conducted at the instance of the Board by Mr. Brookes Baker and the statement of account for the performance of such services was dated October 2, 1953, and embraced a period of service from June 1, 1953, to September 30, 1953.

The service included the 5th and 6th phase of levee work, Brookside phase of Levee Work, Crawford Addition Area, and in the investigation of preparation of report on properties acquired from Fort Worth Improvement District Number One, generally known as Levee Board, for setting monuments for taking line, completed sections, and relocating angle points in taking line and setting monuments with respect to the 11st, 2nd and 3rd phase of Levee Work. The sum total of which amount was \$6,854.78.

On motion of Director Pier, seconded by Director Seymour, it was ordered that said account be paid and that voucher-check issue therefor, all the Directors voted "aye" thereon, and it was so ordered.

6.

The next subject for consideration consisted in the report of Pitner and Adams, which contained a summary of the estimated cost of construction by District Engineers. The report was in considerable detail and specified the various items, and it was ordered that such report be received, approved and attached to these minutes, and made a part hereof, all the Directors voting "aye" thereon.

7.

There was presented to the Board and read to the members thereof, a certain communication, dated November 6, 1953, from American Cyanamid Company, and signed by Mr. J. E. Manifold, Manager of Tax Department, concerning an invoice in the total amount of \$158.46, taxes to be paid to the State of Texas and Tarrant County, which letter and invoice are attached in folio to these minutes and made a part hereof.

This invoice grew out of a certain easement contract from the American Cyanamid Company in which the District was granted the use of a part of parcels 4,5, 5-A, 5-B, 7,8,9 and 10 of the Tract

conveyed to Defense Plant Corporation by Deed of record in Vol. 1704, page 31 of the Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas, and for the right to use parts of the streets lying adjacent to said parcels closed by Fort Worth City Ordinance No. 2336 of record in Vol. 2063, page 112, of said Deed Records.

The said easement contract from said American Cyanamid Company to the District bears date of February 5, 1953, in which written easement it was recited that the District contemplated the construction and maintenance of a channel on the land hereinabove mentioned, and that the consideration mentioned in the easement contract above mentioned included compensation for any damage that might be sustained by American Cyanamid Company by reason of the construction and maintenance of such channel or the waters therefrom to the abutting property owned by Grantor and its assigns.

The letter of November 6, 1953, referred to the easement which was stated to embrace 5.8 acres of land, and in which easement it was agreed that the District should pay all ad valorem taxes, which are specifically set out in the invoice which accompanied said letter.

On motion of Director Hill, seconded by Director Priest, it was ordered that the fractional amount of taxes set forth in the letter of November 6, 1953, from American Cyanamid Company and the statement thereto attached from said company should be paid, and that the District's voucher-check be accordingly issued; all the Directors voting "aye" thereon.

8.

Mr. C. L. McNair, the General Manager, presented a proposed

notice of intent to sell land in conformity with prior instructions concerning intent to sell three parcels of land belonging to the District in Parker County, Texas, situated west of the Azle to Boyd Road adjacent to Walnut Creek, which three parcels were to be combined in two tracts---Tract No. One consisting of 152.03 acres purchased from W. J. Porter, and 25.96 acres purchased from J. L. Hodgkins; Tract No. Two consisting of 204.69 acres of land, being all of the land purchased from J. C. Garlitz, excepting 8.11 acres situated east of the Azle to Boyd Road. The notice of intent to sell was read to the Board, and upon reading was found to be satisfactory, and, therefore, it was unanimously resolved by the Board that this notice of intent to sell framed by Mr. C. L. McNair, and approved by Counsel of the District, should be published in the manner and for the length of time required by law, and that each proposing purchaser should have the right to bid separately on each one of the two tracts and also, if he chooses, to bid on the combined acreage of the two tracts aforesaid and in the event a proposed purchaser should make a bid acceptable to the District that the District was to reserve and retain to itself an undivided one-half of the mineral estate and that the purchaser would take such property subject to flood easement that might arise from water, and that the risk should be that of the purchaser with no claim against the District. All bids were required to be filed in the office of the District not later than 1:15 P.M., Tuesday, December 8, 1953, and that such bids or proposals so received should be publicly opened and read aloud in the office of the District at 1:30 P.M., Tuesday, December 8, 1953, or as soon thereafter

as practicable. Further, that the District, through its Board of Directors, expressly reserves the right to prescribe other and further terms, consideration, restrictions and reservations to be recited in the conveyance of said property, and the right to reject any and all proposals or tenders is reserved by the District.

On motion of Director Hill, seconded by Director Priest, it was resolved that such notice should be published as aforesaid, all the Directors voted "aye" thereon.

In this connection, it was further moved and seconded that Mr. McNair prepare forms for bidders to follow in submitting written proposals of purchase to the District. It was so ordered.

8.

There was presented by Ben F. Hickey, Land Agent of the District, to the Board of Directors a contract of sale of a lease-hold interest, dated November 14, 1953. The said leasehold interest was necessary to be acquired for improvements of the levee. The contract was in writing, executed by H. G. Whitehead, Jr., and R. S. Whitehead, and was signed by the District through Mr. Houston Hill, Vice President. The contract related to a leasehold interest to 2.41 acres of land in the R. Crowley Survey, the description of which is of record in Book 2626, page 592, of the Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas. The price stated in the contract was \$1,500.00.

Mr. Hickey explained that the absolute owner of the property through whom the leasehold contract was derived has executed a contract in writing giving and granting to the two leasehold owners above mentioned the right to make this assignment to the District.

On motion of Director Hill, seconded by Director Priest, it was ordered that said contract be carried out according to its terms and that a voucher-check for the sum of \$1,500.00 payable to H. G. Whitehead, Jr., and R. S. Whitehead be drawn and executed and the same be delivered to said payees on the execution and acknowledgment of the assignment of said leasehold interest and when a title policy to the said leasehold interest is prepared and signed by Rattikin Title Company and the executed contract of assignment by the two Whiteheads and the title policy are delivered by the Rattikin Title Company to the agent of the District. All the Directors voted "aye" thereon.

There being no further business before the Board the meeting adjourned.

Craft, bearing date of July 1, 1952, aggregating the sum \$55,000.00; each of said notes being in the principal sum of \$5,000.00, with interest thereon at 4% per annum, payable annually at the office of the District in Fort Worth, Texas, said elevens notes maturing on or before ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen and twenty years.

Gentlemen:

On February 5, 1953, we granted you an easement in 5.8 acres of our plant lands at Fort Worth. We refer you to Article 8 on page 5 of the Easement in which you agree to pay all ad valorem taxes that may be assessed or become owing on the tract and to protect and indemnify us against all such taxes.

On May 22, 1953, we sold that portion of our plant grounds which included the Southern 2 acres of the tract covered by the easement to the Texas Electric Service Company; accordingly they should be indemnified against all ad valorem taxes on those two acres.

We have received our State and County tax bill and our City tax bill on our Fort Worth property; however, we have not been assessed separately for the land covered by the easement. In May, we sold 7.842 acres; as a result of this sale, our realty assessment for State and County Taxes was reduced \$3,000. and our realty assessment for City and School taxes was reduced \$9,780. This breaks down to an assessed value of \$383. per acre for State and County taxes and \$1,247. per acre for City and School Taxes. We are billing you on the same basis for 3.8 acres on which you have an easement.

We are enclosing our invoice in the amount of \$158.46. We would thank you to remit this amount to us promptly and enclose a stamped, self addressed envelope for your convenience.
