WHEREAS, the Statutes provide that where the County Auditor is required by law to audit the books and accounts of certain governmental districts including water control and improvements districts, that the Commissioners' Court shall fix the salary of the County Auditor for such additional work and call upon such district to repay to the County such salary so allowed; and

WHEREAS, the County Auditor of Tarrant County has been and is required by law to audit the books and accounts of the Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1, and the Commissioners' Court of Tarrant County is of the opinion he should receive reasonable compensation for such service and that Two Hundred Fifty(\$250.00) Dollars per month is reasonable compensation for such service:

IT IS THEREFORE moved by Commissioner Owens, seconded by Commissioner Wright, that the salary of the County Auditor for his services in auditing the books and accounts of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 be fixed at \$250.00 per month beginning November 1st, 1954, and that said District be notified of this action and requested to reimburse the County for such salary.
