MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD ON THE 15TH DAY OF APRIL, 1966 AT 1:30 P. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors as follows:

Also present were Messrs. William Brown, General Counsel for the District and Ben Hickey, General Manager of the District.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President and Director Newton acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done as follows:

1.

On motion duly made and seconded, the minutes of the meeting held March 25, 1966 were read and approved by the Directors and it was accordingly ordered that such minutes be placed in the permanent files of the District.

2.

On motion of Director Boggess, seconded by Director Hudson, voucher-checks #3617 thru #3690 inclusive, Maintenance Fund; voucher-checks #965 thru #997 inclusive, Construction Fund; voucher-checks #193 thru #196 inclusive, Interest and Sinking Fund; voucher-checks #123 thru #125 inclusive, Social Security Fund; voucher-checks #3077 thru #3119 inclusive, Cedar Creek Construction Fund and voucher-check

#161, Revenue Fund were approved and ordered paid upon receiving the approval and verification of Mr. J. M. Williams, County Auditor, who by virtue of the Statutes is the Auditor of this District as well. All the Directors voted age thereon.

3.

President Hogsett presented the following letter for the consideration of the Directors, to-wit:

April 14, 1966

Mr. Ben Hickey, General Manager Tarrant County Water Control District 506 Danciger Building Fort Worth, Texas 76102

Ben, you are well acquainted with the work of the Trinity River Beautification Committee of the Chamber of Commerce and the hopes our committee has of an early start toward beautification of the floodway within the city limits of Fort Worth.

Our committee has aroused citizenship interest in this project which would make a real asset of the Trinity River Floodway.

Obviously, a Chamber of Commerce Committee is limited in what it can accomplish, so our question to you is, would the Tarrant County Water Control District accept the sponsorship as local sponsoring agency for the Trinity River Beautification Project?

We feel that your willingness to accept such a sponsorship would assure the success of a real beautification program as well as to assure the success of a continuing program through the years.

My committee asks that you accept the sponsorship of this program.

Following the reading of the above letter, a general discussion regarding the obligations involved by the acceptance as the local sponsoring agency was held; and while the Directors and management

were enthusiastic regarding the proposed beautification, it was specifically called to the attention of the Directors by Counsel for the District, that the District does not by law have authority to spend tax funds for beautification purposes. In conclusion it was the unanimous opinion of the Directors, in view of the fact that the District was charged with the responsibility of maintenance and operation of the Trinity River floodways, that it would be appropriate for the District to be the sponsoring agency, to the extent allowed by the laws governing the District, and that a letter, in answer to the above letter, be prepared setting forth the District's position.

4.

Mr. Ben Hickey, General Manager of the District, requested authority for the District to enter into a contract for the purchase of the following described tracts of land required for Program D -West Fork, Clear Fork, Cedar Creek Pipeline Right-of-Way and Cedar Creek Spillway Damage Claim and on the following basis for payment, to-wit:
