MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD ON THE 4TH DAY OF MAY, 1970 AT 10:00 A. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors as follows:

## PRESENT

Joe B. Hogsett Lacy Boggess Wayne E. Newton Clyde A. Penry Edward R. Hudson

Also present were Messrs. John M. Scott, General Counsel for the District and Ben Hickey, General Manager of the District.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President and Director Newton acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done as follows:

1.

On motion duly made and seconded, the minutes of the meeting held April 14, 1970 were read and approved by the Directors and it was accordingly ordered that such minutes be placed in the permanent files of the District.

2.

On motion of Director Hudson, seconded by Director Penry, voucher-checks #8435 thru #8477 inclusive, Maintenance Fund; voucher-checks #2130 thru #2139 inclusive, Revenue Fund; voucher-checks #2543 thru #2550 inclusive, Construction Fund and voucher-checks #311 and #312 Interest and Sinking Fund were approved and ordered paid. All Directors voted aye thereon.

A request for payment of damages, relating to the Cedar Creek Pipeline, from Mr. John L. Roberts was presented to the Directors; and following a discussion of the matter and upon recommendation of Counsel and Management of the District, the request was denied by unanimous vote of the Directors.

4.

A letter was presented to the Directors dated April 23, 1970 and signed by Mr. Bill Shiels of Dallas, Texas, requesting that the District sell Ten (10) Acres of land located at the Cedar Creek Reservoir. Following a discussion, and on recommendation of Management of the District, it was the unanimous decision of the Directors, and their order, that the ten (10) acres as described by Mr. Shiels be not sold at this time.

5.

President Hogsett presented to the Directors the Monthly Financial Report regarding receipts and Disbursements for Program "A", "B" and "D" and Cedar Creek Project, for the months of January, February and March, 1970 from the Auditor of the District, which was ordered accepted and placed in the District's Records.

6.

President Hogsett stated to all present that the Board of Directors would at this time go into executive session and requested that all leave the room except Counsel. Following an interval of time, President Hogsett called Mr. Hickey into the Director's Room and stated that it had been the unanimous decision of the Di-

rectors, and their order, that the salary of the General Manager be established on the basis of \$30,000.00 per year.

President Hogsett then presented to the Directors a written recommendation from the Committee on Personnel, Messrs. Boggess and Newton and General Manager Hickey, on classification and salary schedule of all District employees. Following a lengthy discussion of the recommendation, Director Hudson, seconded by Director Penry, made a motion that the following classification and salary schedule be adopted, to wit:
