MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD ON THE 13TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1976 AT 3:30 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors as follows:

PRESENT

Wayne E. Newton Clyde A. Penry J. Oliver Shannon C. Victor Thornton Murray Kyger

Also present were Messrs. Joe B. Hogsett, Honorary Chairman of the Board of Directors and Ben Hickey, General Manager of the District. Director Newton acted in his capacity as President and Director Shannon acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done as follows:

1.

On motion duly made and seconded, the minutes of the meeting held August 2, 1976 were read and approved by the Directors and it was accordingly ordered that such minutes be placed in the permanent files of the District.

2.

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On motion of Director Thornton, seconded by Director Penry, voucher-checks #18137 thru #18402 inclusive, Maintenance Fund, in the amount of \$271,298.47; voucher-checks #5111 thru #5214 inclusive, Revenue Fund, in the amount of \$2,079,828.32; voucher-chekcs #3513 thru #3521 inclusive, Construction Fund, in the amount of \$175,090.50; voucher-checks #538 thru #544 inclusive, Interest and Sinking Fund,

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in the amount of \$120,343.65 and voucher-check #4241, Cedar Creek Construction Fund, in the amount of \$2,130.84 were approved and ordered paid. All Directors voted aye thereon.

3.

President Newton stated that under the covenants set forth in the Resolution and Trust Indenture for the Water Supply Bonds (Cedar Creek Project) the District shall, on or before the 15th day of July of each year, prepare a preliminary annual budget for the ensuing calendar year; and that on or before the first day of October of each year it will adopt the final annual bidget for such fiscal year.

Each Director was given a copy of the proposed Cedar Creek Budget for 1977 as herein shown, to wit:

During a lengthy discussion, developing from a review of the many factors involved in budget preparation, special attention was given to estimated revenues - for the foreseeable future - from existing, and future, contracts for the sale of raw water by the District, with

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special recognition given to sales of raw water in Tarrant County, both within and outside of the boundaries of the District; also much careful consideration was given to maintaining a fair and equitable price for users of raw water purchased from the District in all of Tarrant County; also a detailed review of the Contract with the City of Fort Worth under which, at the request of the City, the contract was amended in 1968 to provide a one (1¢) cent premium for all raw water sold in Tarrant County outside of District boundaries and it was the unanimous opinion of the Directors that at this time and for so long as the requirements of the District in maintaining, operating and servicing its bond requirements are met no sales of raw water will be for less than nine (9¢) cents per each one thousand (1000) gallons (save and except the City of Fort Worth); also consideration was given to the question with respect to the equity of the One (1¢) cent premium per one thousand (1000) gallons for raw water paid by cities or municipalities outside of District boundaries in Tarrant County in relation to the price paid by those users inside District boundaries, with the unanimous determination that the existing one (1¢) cent differential for raw water now under contract and sold to cities or municipalities outside District boundaries in Tarrant County was equitable; however, the question regarding a policy for those raw water users not now under contract in Tarrant County was discussed in detail and it was the unanimous decision of the Directors, and their order, that effective this date the policy of the District in determining the equity factor premium for raw water sold to users outside of District boundaries as to that sold to users inside of

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District boundaries shall be determined as follows:

- A = Raw Water used by Municipality from 3-1-60 to date of Execution of Contract.
- B = Raw water used by City of Fort Worth from 3-1-60 to date of Execution of Contract.
- C = Payment for Raw water by City of Fort Worth from 3-1-60 to date of Execution of Contract.
- D = Estimated use of water by Municipality during the term of the Contract.
- M = Thousand Gallons.
- Y Premium per thousand gallons to be added to Raw Water price in effect on the date of Execution of Raw Water Contract.

Following a discussion of the formula to be used in arriving at an equitable ratio to be used for the pricing of raw water to be sold by the District in Tarrant County, outside of District boundaries, Director Thornton made a motion, seconded by Director Kyger and unanimously approved that the pricing policy of the District as herein above shown be now adopted and that the Cedar Creek Reservoir Budget for 1977 as herein above shown be accepted.
