MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD ON THE 9TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1979 AT 10:00 A. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors as follows:

Director Newton acted in his capacity as President, and
Director Shannon acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done as follows:

l.

On motion duly made and seconded, and with assurance from management that all requirements of law relating to the "open meeting" law had been met, the minutes of the meeting held January 26, 1979 were read and approved by the Directors and it was accordingly ordered that such minutes be placed in the permanent files of the District.

2.

Management of the District presented and recommended the purchase of the low bid proposals received for equipment needed in the operation of the District, to wit:

(a) Bids were opened January 31, 1979 for vehicles and dump bodies. Century Chevrolet was the low bidder for all four categories of vehicles. Hobbs Trailers returned the low bid for three new six yard dump bodies. It is recommended that the District accept these bids and place orders immediately. It is further

recommended that one diesel powered pickup truck be bought and used as a test vehicle. Continually rising gasoline prices and poorer fuel economy may force the District to eventually convert the entire fleet to diesel. A full listing of bids received follows:

Following a detailed review and discussion of each of the above listed items, Director Geren moved, seconded by Director Shannon and unanimously approved, that the low bids as herein above listed, with the exception that item (c) be increased to two radios, be now accepted by the District.

Mr. Ben Hickey, General Manager of the District, reported to the Directors that effective February 15, 1979 Blue Cross and Blue Shield, the Insurance Carrier for the Group Hospitalization Insurance covering the Employees' and their dependents, had proposed a 36% increase in premium cost. Based on this proposal the staff management of the District, obtained proposals from several different carriers with comparable benefits as provided by the Blue Cross/Blue Shield Company and it was their unanimous opinion and recommendation that the Group Hospotalization Insurance be placed with the Hartford Insurance Company as the coverage proposed would be comparable to the present and the premium proposed would be less than the rate charged by Blue Cross/Blue Shield for the period February 15, 1979 thru February 15, 1979.

Following a general discussion Director Shannon moved, seconded by Director Geren and unanimously approved, with recommendation of management of the District, effective February 15, 1979, the District's Group Health and Insurance program be placed with the Hartford Insurance Company.
