The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors as follows:

Director Thornton acted in his capacity as President and Director Alexander acted as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done as follows:

On motion made and seconded, and with assurance from management that all requirements of law relating to the "open meeting" law had been met, the minutes of the meeting held January 30, 1984 were read and approved by the Directors and it was accordingly ordered that such minutes be placed in the permanent files of the District.

Director Alexander moved and the motion was seconded by Director Geren and unamimously approved that the following list of vouchers be approved:

MEETING CLOSED, Executive Session.

MEETING OPENED.

Director Newton made a motion authorizing compensation to Navarro County for roads and rights-of-way impacted by the Richland Creek Project in the amount of \$4,800,000.00. The agreement will be approved by counsel and will achieve total satisfaction of obligations of the District for adjustments of existing county roads. Director Geren seconded the motion and with Director Alexander obstaining the resolution was approved by the other three Directors.

Management of the District requested authority for the District to enter into contract for the purchase of the following described tracts of land required for Program E - Richland Creek Project, on the following basis for payment to wit:
