With the recommendation of management, Director Henderson moved to adopt a resolution endorsing the City of Fort Worth's application for grant funds which will allow the extension of the Trinity Trail Hike and Bike Path along the Trinity River. Director Geren seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.


WHEREAS, the Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One recognizes the importance of protecting and enhancing the recreational and open space asset represented by the Trinity River Hike and Bike Trails; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Worth and Streams and Valleys, Inc. continue to pursue the ultimate development of the Trinity Trails as a major recreational amenity in the Fort Worth area; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation in conjunction with the Texas Department of Transportation continue to provide funding for alternative methods of transportation centered on cycling and walking through the intermodel Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One that the District supports the application by the City of Fort Worth to the North Central Texas Council of Governments for \$733,740 in matching funds for the proposed Trinity Trail Extension project. The overall \$3,494,000 project will expand the existing 15.5 mile trail to a 34.5 mile system of hard surface trails.

With the recommendation of management, Directors Sparks and Campbell moved to adopt a resolution authorizing the issuance, sale and delivery of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One Water Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 1993 in the amount of \$328,495,000, providing for the redemption prior to maturity of bonds being refunded by such revenue bonds, authorizing an escrow agreement in connection with bonds being refunded by such revenue bonds, and approving and authorizing instruments and procedures relating thereto. Director Geren seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.
