President Henderson convened the meeting with the assurance from management that all requirements of the "open meetings" laws had been met.

1.

All present were given the opportunity to join in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

2.

On a motion made by Director Leonard and seconded by Director Lane, the Directors unanimously voted to approve the minutes from the meeting held October 17,

2006. It was accordingly ordered that such minutes be placed in the permanent files of Tarrant Regional Water District.

3.

There were no persons of the general public requesting the opportunity to address the Board of Directors.

4.

The President and presiding officer next called an executive session at 9:40 a.m. under Chapter 551.072 of the Government Code to consider real property issues – water rights and Tarrant County College land exchange.

5.

Upon completion of the executive session at 11:05 a.m., the President reopened the meeting.

6.

With the recommendation of management, Director Sparks moved to approve the conveyance of two tracts of land totaling approximately 11.131 acres to Tarrant County College. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

# RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT REGIONAL WATER DISTRICT

November 21, 2006

WHEREAS, Tarrant County College ("TCC") is a community college district created and operating as an institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003 of the Texas Education Code and is a countywide agency and authority;

WHEREAS, TCC has announced plans to construct a campus in the Central City area of Fort Worth straddling the West Fork Trinity River;

**WHEREAS**, TCC's proposed campus would benefit and enhance uses of the Trinity River by the public in the Central City area, and would promote and contribute to the advancement of higher education and other worthwhile public purposes related thereto;

WHEREAS, TCC has requested that the Tarrant Regional Water District ("TRWD") grant it certain lands owned by TRWD at or adjacent to the location of TCC's proposed campus for educational uses, which lands are described in <a href="Exhibits">Exhibits "1"</a> and "2" attached hereto (the "Property");

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of TRWD has determined that the use of the Property by TCC in connection with its proposed campus, subject to reasonable limiting terms and conditions which would preserve TRWD's uses of the property for its public purposes, would be appropriate and in the public interest;

WHEREAS, in partial exchange for the grant of the Property to TCC, the Board of Directors of TRWD requires that TCC grant TRWD a right of first refusal with respect to that certain option described in an Option Contract between TXU Generation Company, L.P., and TCC dated to be effective October 20, 2004, with regard to certain property therein described:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of TRWD requires that certain costs incurred by the parties, together with the value received by TRWD, be shared or equalized so that TRWD receives fair market value for the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of TRWD has determined that the terms and conditions embodied in this Resolution are necessary or advantageous to TRWD.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TARRANT REGIONAL WATER DISTRICT:

- 1. That R. Steve Christian, Real Property Director of the District, should be and is hereby authorized to execute and deliver a deed conveying the Property to TCC, subject to the terms and conditions herein set forth and as otherwise stipulated and agreed by TRWD and TCC.
- 1. That the transactions contemplated hereby and uses of the Property by TCC shall be subject to any required approval by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.
- 2. That the Real Property Director of TRWD should be and is hereby authorized to enter into and execute such agreements and undertakings as may be reasonably necessary to implement the foregoing resolution.

With the recommendation of management, Director Stevens moved to amend contract scopes with KBR and Patrick, Miller and Kropf to continue their ongoing evaluation of water rights issues for an amount not to exceed \$262,965. Funding for this amendment is included in the 2006 Bond Issue. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

8.

With the recommendation of management, Director Stevens moved to approve a contract with Trinity River Communications Joint Venture to provide development and coordination of communication strategies promoting water supply planning, water conservation and minority contracting programs at a monthly cost not to exceed \$15,000 with a 60 (sixty) day cancellation provision for either party. Funding for this contact is included in the FY 2007 Revenue Fund Budget. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

9.

With the recommendation of management, Director Lane moved to approve the following operations and maintenance expenditures.

Director Leonard seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

With the recommendation of management, Director Leonard moved to approve the transfer of \$950,000 to Trinity River Vision Authority for project management and land acquisition related activities. Funding for this transfer is included in the FY 2007 General Fund Budget. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

12.

With the recommendation of management, Director Sparks moved to approve the 3,410 square feet interior finish out for the Trinity River Vision Authority office and exhibit space at 307 W. Seventh St., Suite 100, Fort Worth, TX for the low bid of \$239.800 submitted by Stillwell Building System. Funding for this contract is included in the FY 2007 General Fund Budget. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

13.

With the recommendation of management, Director Leonard moved to approve a contract with TransSystems for the initial survey work related to property acquisition for the TRV Central City Project in the amount of \$82,685. Funding for this purchase is

included in the General Fund-Budget. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

14.

With the recommendation of management, Director Sparks moved to approve a contract with Turner, Collie & Braden for the design of the 121/Southwest Freeway – Clear Fork Crossing stream bank stabilization and City Dam modification in the amount not to exceed of \$112,910. This project is an unbudgeted expense in the FY 2007 General Fund Budget.


Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote was in favor with Director Lane absent for this vote.

15.

With the recommendation of management, Director Leonard moved to approve the lease of the Water District's mineral rights to XTO Energy Inc. in and to 10.368 acres in the M. Anderson Survey, A-9 Tarrant County, Texas in the amount of \$25,920, with a 25 percent royalty, three (3) year primary term for the Water District's mineral interest in the 10.368 acres as described in the exhibit below. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.




With the recommendation of management, Director Lane moved to ratify a pooling agreement for the XTO TRWD-Girl Scouts Unit Tarrant County, Texas. The attached plat shows the configuration and tract participation of the various parties to the unit. The Water District's unit participation will be calculated on ownership of ½ of the royalty on the Girl Scout tract (111.72) and full ownership on a 26.472 acre tract in the 156.00701 acre unit. The Water District's net revenue interest in the unit will be .1313726. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

With the recommendation of management, Director Lane moved to ratify the pooling agreement for the XTO TRWD Wildlife B2H Unit Tarrant County, Texas. The attached plat shows the configuration and tract participation of the various parties to the unit. The Water District's unit participation will be 106.12 acres in the 140 acre unit. The Water District's net revenue interest in the unit will be 0.1895. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.




With the recommendation of management, Director Lane moved to amend the Winter 2004 Oil and Gas Lease to include four (4) additional tracts that were inadvertently not included in the original lease description in the amount of \$63,392.84, with a 25 percent royalty, three (3) year primary term for the 31.228 acres.

In addition, Ken Brummett is granted authority to execute the lease amendment and all other documents necessary to complete this transaction Director Leonard seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

19.

With the recommendation of management, Director Leonard moved to ratify the pooling agreement for the Four Sevens Oil Co., Parrot D-4H Unit Tarrant County, Texas. The attached plat shows the configuration and tract participation of the various parties to the unit. The Water District's unit participation will be 23.344 acres in the 88.288 acre unit. The Water District's net revenue interest in the unit will be .066018. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.



The Board was updated on an engineering award presented to KBR, the District's engineer on the Richland-Chambers High-Capacity Project, for work associated with this project.

There being no further business before the Board of Directors, the meeting was adjourned.
