MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT REGIONAL WATER DISTRICT HELD ON THE 17<sup>TH</sup> DAY OF APRIL 2007 AT 9:30 A.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of the Directors as follows:

President Henderson convened the meeting with the assurance from management that all requirements of the "open meetings" laws had been met.

1.

All present were given the opportunity to join in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

2.

On a motion made by Director Stevens and seconded by Director Leonard, the Directors unanimously voted to approve the minutes from the meeting held March 20, 2007. It was accordingly ordered that these minutes be placed in the permanent files of Tarrant Regional Water District.

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During public comments, Dick Fish thanked the Board for everything they did to get the Eagle Mountain Parkland purchase finalized. He also indicated they have 14 volunteers lined up for the May 5th cleanup. Timothy Nold expressed concerns at the District restricting access to, and potentially leasing, property that was dedicated to use by the property owners.

4.

With the recommendation of management, Director Leonard moved to approve an interlocal cooperative contract with the City of Dallas providing for the cost shared study of joint transmission facilities at cost not to exceed \$400,000. Partial funding for this contract is included in the FY 2007 Revenue Fund Budget. The remainder will be included in the FY 2008 Revenue Fund Budget. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

5.

With the recommendation of management, Director Sparks moved to approve JPMorgan Chase as the depository service provider for TRWD. Director Leonard seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

6.

With the recommendation of management, Director Leonard moved to approve the capital expenditures as noted below:

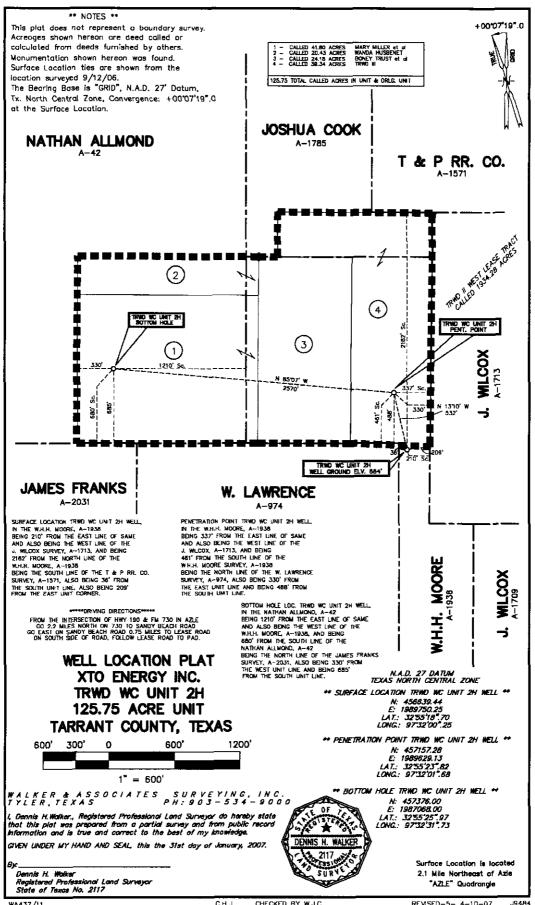

Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

With the recommendation of management, Director Stevens moved to approve a contract with CDM for conversion of all of the existing historical reservoir operations data spread sheet files into the new Engineering Operations SQL Database for a not-to-exceed cost of \$68,453; and for the development of SCADA/MAXIMO condition based maintenance work order interface for a not-to-exceed cost of \$45,000, for a total cost not to exceed \$113,453. Funding for this contract is included in the FY 2007 Revenue Fund Budget. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

With the recommendation of management, Director Leonard moved to ratify the pooling agreement executed by Ken Brummett on behalf of the Water District for the (1) XTO TRWD WC #2H Unit oil and gas well located at Eagle Mountain Lake as shown on Exhibit below. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

With the recommendation of management, Director Sparks moved to conditionally approve a lease to Chesapeake Exploration Limited Partnership, as the highest and best bidder in the Jacksboro Highway to University Oil and Gas lease with a bid of \$200,250, 25 percent royalty, three (3) year primary term for the Water District's mineral interest in 22.5 net acres as shown on Exhibit A. This lease will be approved based on further review and determination of a minimum distance for drilling sites from the levee. In addition, Ken Brummett is granted authority to execute the lease and all other documents necessary to complete this transaction. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

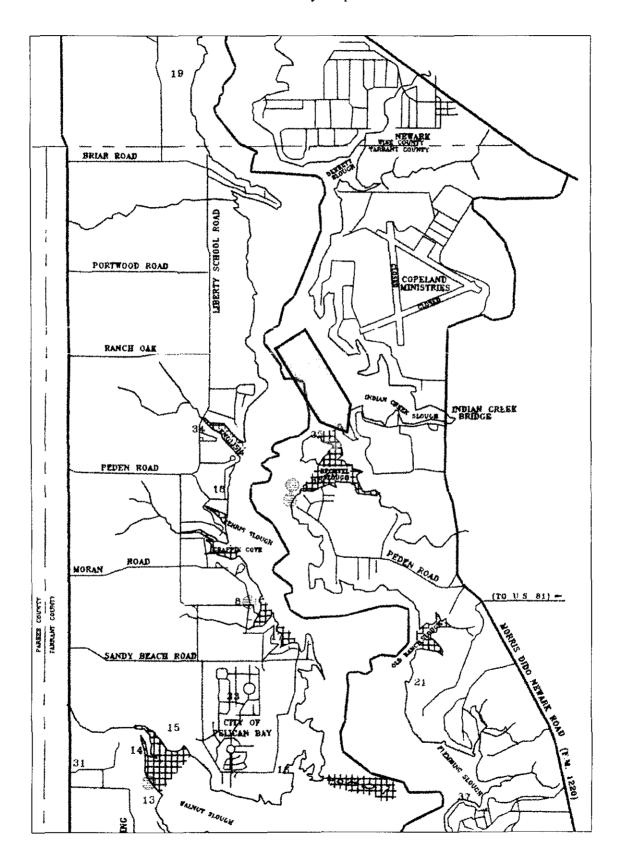
With the recommendation of management, Director Lane moved to approve a settlement agreement for the Wilkinson et al acquisition of the Eagle Mountain Connection Project.

Director Leonard seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

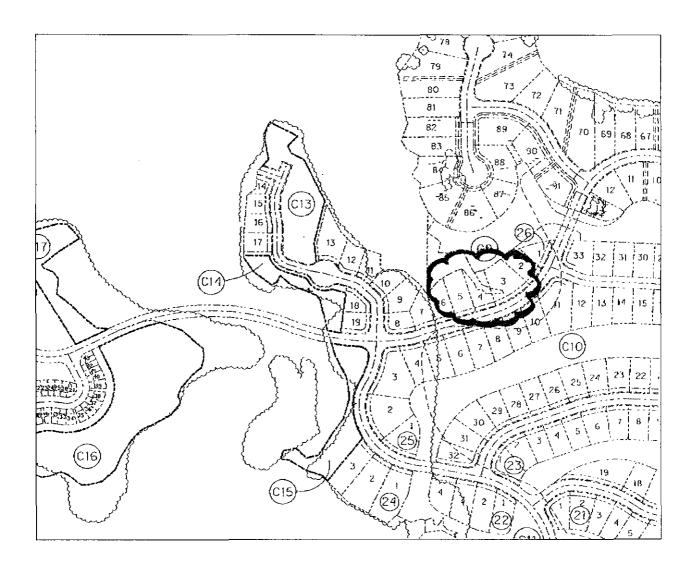

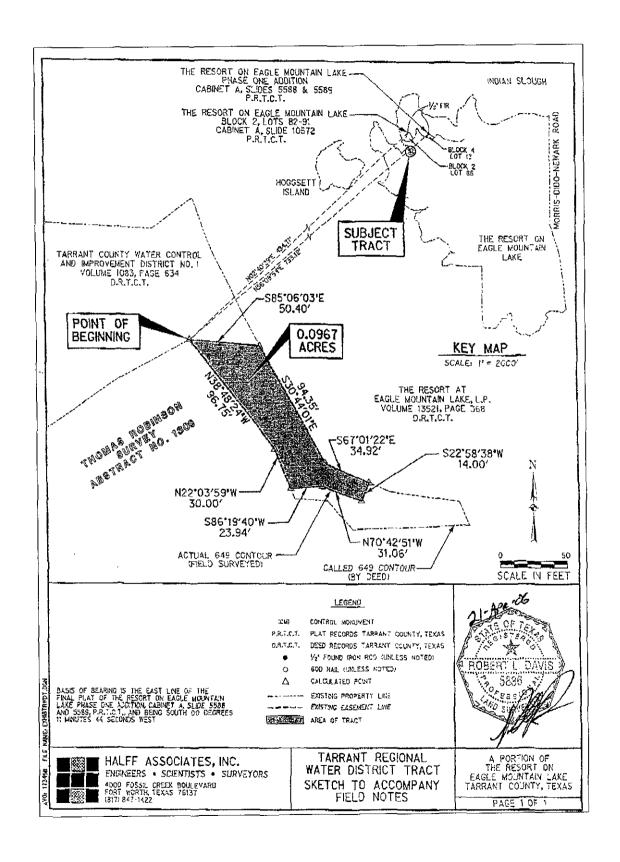
