On a motion made by Director Leonard and seconded by Director Lane, the Directors unanimously voted to approve the minutes from the meeting held October 20, 2009. It was accordingly ordered that these minutes be placed in the permanent files of Tarrant Regional Water District.

Dick Fish of Save Eagle Mountain Lake reported that the Watershed Protection presentation given by Darrel Andrews and David Geary at their annual meeting was well received.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Leonard moved to approve a contract with R W. Beck for program management support of Phase I of the Integrated Third Pipeline Project at a cost not to exceed of \$8,725,911. Funding for this contract is included in the 2009 Bond Fund. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.







In addition, Ken Brummett is granted authority to execute the lease and all other documents necessary to complete this transaction. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations committee, Director Lane moved to waive the previously approved take-or-pay provision from the water contracts with the Trinity River Authority for Ennis and Midlothian for the 2011 fiscal year. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

The Board of Directors recessed for a break from 9:54 a.m. to 10:01 a.m.

The President and presiding officer next called an executive session at 10:02 a.m. under V.T.C.A., Government Code, Section 551.071 to consider pending or contemplated litigation — Oklahoma water resources and Trinity River Vision-Central City Project; and under Section 551.072 to deliberate the purchase, sale, lease or exchange of real property.



With the recommendation of management and the Land Committee, Director Sparks moved to approve the exchange of certain easement rights between Union Pacific Railroad Company (UPRC) and the Water District on land located beneath and adjacent to the UPRC's existing railroad bridge over the Clear Fork of the Trinity River near IH-30, situated in the E. S. Harris Survey, A-688, Tarrant County, Texas as follows:

- TRWD agrees to grant **0.12** acre of permanent bridge easement and 50 foot wide temporary construction easement to UPRC.
- UPRC agrees to grant 0.08 acre of permanent access easement to TRWD.



In addition, R. Steve Christian is granted authority to execute all documents necessary to complete these transactions. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.
