MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT REGIONAL WATER DISTRICT HELD ON THE 18TH DAY OF JANUARY 2011 AT 9:30 A.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of the Directors as follows:

President Henderson convened the meeting with the assurance from management that all requirements of the "open meetings" laws had been met.

All present were given the opportunity to join in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

2.

On a motion made by Director Stevens and seconded by Director Leonard, the Directors unanimously voted to approve the minutes from the meeting held December 21, 2010. It was accordingly ordered that these minutes be placed in the permanent files of Tarrant Regional Water District.

3.

Kathleen Hicks, City Councilwoman of Fort Worth, thanked the Board for matching grant funding for Cobb Park improvements. The construction on this 222 acre, \$4 million project begins on January 18, 2011.

Dick Fish, reported that Save Eagle Mountain Lake, Inc. is initiating efforts to educate residents and visitors of Eagle Mountain Lake and its watershed regarding concerns about invasive plants and zebra mussels.

4.

With the recommendation of management, Director Sparks moved to approve the Annual Financial Report by the District's auditors, presented by Terry Kile of Deloitte & Touche, for the year ended September 30, 2010. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

5.

With the recommendation of management, Director Leonard moved to approve a resolution authorizing the General Manager to act on behalf of the Board of Directors to apply to the Texas Water Development Board's Water Infrastructure for State

Participation Funds for financing of an amount up to \$50 million. Financing will support the design and construction of raw water transmission facilities to serve both the City of Dallas and Tarrant Regional Water District and is consistent with the scope and purpose of strategies included in the 2006 Region C Regional Water Plan and the 2007 State Water Plan. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

6.

With the recommendation of management and the Constructions and Operations Committee, Director Stevens moved to issue a Notice to Proceed to Beavers Dozer Service and Equipment of Bowie, Texas to remove debris from and adjacent to the West Fork of the Trinity River in the amount of \$37,621.85. Funding for this contract is included in the Bond Fund. Director Leonard seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

7.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Stevens moved to approve the Unit Price Reconciliation Change Order #2 in the amount of a \$344,609.70 addition to Contract G with DCI Contracting, Inc., on the Eagle Mountain Connection Balancing Reservoir Project and the reduction of retainage. The remaining retainage in the amount of \$10,000 was authorized to be released upon the satisfactory establishment of grass in the coming spring. Funding for this project is included in the Bond Fund. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Sparks moved to approve a Second Amendment to the Reimbursement Agreement between the Water District and Southwest Operating, Inc. to include a not to exceed cost of \$457,171 for necessary pipeline work and a not to exceed cost of \$100,000 for access contingencies at the George W. Shannon Wetlands Water Reuse Project. Funding for this agreement is included in the Bond Fund. Director Leonard seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

9.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Sparks moved to approve a contract with Alpha Testing in the amount of \$398,532 to perform Construction Material Testing during construction of Phase II of the George W. Shannon Wetlands Water Reuse Project. Funding for this contract is included in the Bond Fund. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

10.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Leonard moved to approve a one year pricing agreement with Hydros Consulting for technical support and services for RiverWare modeling software implementation at a cost not to exceed \$75,000. Funding for this agreement is included in the FY 2011 Revenue Fund. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

The Board of Directors recessed for a break from 10:25 a.m. to 10:37 a.m.

12.

The presiding officer next called an executive session at 10:37 a.m. under V.T.C.A., Government Code, Section 551.071 to consult with legal counsel on a matter in which the duty of counsel under the Texas disciplinary rules of professional conduct clearly conflicts with Chapter 551, Texas Government Code; to conduct a private consultation with attorneys regarding pending or contemplated litigation; and under Section 551.072 to deliberate the purchase, exchange, lease or value of real property.

13.

Upon completion of the executive session at 11:04 a.m., the President reopened the meeting.

14.

With the recommendation of management, Director Lane moved to approve the exchange of the following described tracts of land between Tarrant Regional Water District and City of Fort Worth.

5,283 Square Feet or 0.121 Acre of land, more or less, out of the W.D. Conner Survey, Abstract 288, in the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas (owned by TRWD) in exchange for 4,572 Square Feet or 0.105 Acre of land, more or less, out of the W.D. Conner Survey, Abstract 288, in the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas (owned by City of Fort Worth).

In addition, R. Steve Christian is granted authority to execute deeds and all other documents necessary to close these transactions. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.




