MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT REGIONAL WATER DISTRICT HELD ON THE 15TH DAY OF MAY 2012 AT 9:30 A.M.

President Henderson convened the meeting with the assurance from management that all requirements of the "open meetings" laws had been met.

All present were given the opportunity to join in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

2.


On a motion made by Director Leonard and seconded by Director Sparks, the Directors unanimously voted to approve the minutes from the meeting held April 17, 2012. It was accordingly ordered that these minutes be placed in the permanent files of Tarrant Regional Water District.

3.

There were no persons of the general public requesting the opportunity to address the Board of Directors.

4.

With the recommendation of management and the Oil and Gas Committee, Director Lane moved to amend the Maddox Oil and Gas Lease with current owner Chesapeake Exploration, L.L.C. to include three additional tracts of land containing 4.167 acres inadvertently not included in the original lease with Dale Resources, L.L.C. Chesapeake has agreed to pay the Water District a bonus amount of \$2,500 per net mineral acre (\$2,500 x 4.167 acres = \$8,334) for the lease amendment and place all of the acreage covered by the lease into existing units and pay royalty from the date of first production.



In addition, Ken Brummett is granted authority to execute the amendment and all other documents necessary to complete this transaction. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

5.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Leonard moved to approve a contract with Northstar Construction Inc. for Twin Points Phase 2A improvements providing for the infrastructure required to operate the boat ramp portion of the facility for the lowest and best bid of \$959,000. Funding for this contract is included in the FY 2012 General Fund Budget. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

6.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Sparks moved to approve a contract with Malcolm Pirnie for professional engineering design and bid phase and construction phase services related to the medium voltage electrical system current and voltage issues at Richland-Chambers Pump Station (RC1) Harmonic Mitigation Project-Part 2 in the not to exceed amount of \$86,106. Funding for this contract is unbudgeted. Director Stevens seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

7.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Sparks moved to approve a contract with Leonard Rice Engineers Inc. for engineering services for Cedar Creek Constructed Wetlands for preliminary design of a River Bank Filtration system as a pretreatment step to improve the water

quality of diversions from the Trinity River for use in the Cedar Creek Wetlands Water Supply Project at a cost not to exceed \$1,354,400. Funding for this contract is included in the Bond Fund. Director Leonard seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

8.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Lane moved to approve a contract with CH2M Hill for engineering services for design of a river intake, river intake pump station and a re-lift pump station to the 30% level for the proposed Cedar Creek Constructed Wetlands for the amount of \$970,025. Funding for this contract is included in the Bond Fund. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

9.

With the recommendation of management and the Construction and Operations Committee, Director Stevens moved to approve a contract with Freese and Nichols, Inc. to begin Cedar Creek Comprehensive Evaluation Phase 3 – Design and Improvements for the design of multiple improvements to the dam and spillway; the construction phase services for some of the smaller improvements and the automation of data collection in real-time at a cost of \$988,400. Funding for this contract is included in the Bond Fund. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

10.

With the recommendation of management and the Environmental Committee, Director Leonard moved to approve a contract in the amount up to \$68,500 with W.I.S.E. Guys – Vepo, L.L.C. to perform landscape irrigation evaluations among Water

District customer cities. Funding for this contract is included in the FY 2012 Revenue Fund Budget. Director Sparks seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous with Director Lane being absent for this vote.

Upon completion of the executive session at 11:28 a.m., the President reopened the meeting.

With the recommendation of management and the Environmental Committee,

Director Sparks moved to approve a contract in the amount of \$300,545 with RPS

Espey for the evaluation of impacts from in-stream flow requirements on four potential

water supply alternatives. Funding for this contract is included in the FY 2012 Revenue Fund Budget. Director Lane seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

16.

With the recommendation of management and the Real Property Committee, Director Lane moved to approve a contract with Lemley Consulting, Inc. for consulting services related to the Integrated Pipeline Project land acquisition at a cost not to exceed \$976,129. Funding for this contract is included in the Bond Fund. Director Leonard seconded the motion and the vote in favor was unanimous.

17.

With the recommendation of management and the Real Property Committee, Director Leonard moved to approve the sale of the following described surplus land necessary for the construction of a rail spur to Keystone Equity Partners, LLC for the appraised value of \$40,000.

The surface estate only of a 50 foot corridor being approximately 0.5398 acres or 23,514 square feet out of the J. T. Hobbs Survey, Abstract No. A-806, Tarrant County, Fort Worth, Texas, said 50 foot corridor being a portion of a larger tract conveyed to TRWD by deed recorded as Instrument No. D155034267 in the Official Public Records of Tarrant County, Texas

THENCE South 18 degrees 12 minutes 09 seconds West, departing the southeasterly right-of-way line of said Northwest Loop 820 and along the common line of said Tarrant Coursey Water Control tract and said Keystone Equity Partners tract, a distance of 720.93 feet to a 5/8 inch iron pipe found;

THENCE South 37 degrees 07 minutes 55 seconds East, continuing along the common line of said Tarrant County Water Control tract and said Keystone Equity Partners tract, a distance of 116.37 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING;

THENCE North 46 degrees 42 minutes 35 seconds East, a distance of 11.04 feet to the beginning of a curve to the left, having a central angle of 22 degrees 15 minutes 00 seconds, a radius of 578.80 feet and being subtended by a 223.36 foot chord which bears North 35 degrees 35 minutes 05 seconds East;

THENCE, along said curve to the left in a northeasterly direction, an arc distance of 224.77 feet to the end of said curve;

THENCE North 24 degrees 27 minutes 35 seconds East, a distance of 140.50 feet to an angle point;

THENCE North 18 degrees 06 minutes 00 seconds liest, a distance of 78.78 feet to a point for corner;

THENCE South 71 degrees 54 minutes 00 seconds East, a distance of 50.00 feet to a point for corner;

THENCE South 18 degrees 06 minutes 00 seconds West, a distance of 81.56 feet to a point for corner,

THENCE: South 24 degrees 27 minutes 35 seconds West, a distance of 143.28 feet to the beginning of a curve to the right, having a central angle of 22 degrees 15 minutes 00 seconds, a radius of 628.80 feet and being subtended by a 242.65 foot chord which bears South 35 degrees 35 minutes 05 seconds West;

THENCE, along said curve to the right in a southwesterly direction, an arc distance of 244.19 feet to the end of said curve;

THENCE South 46 degrees 42 minutes 35 seconds West, a distance of 16.44 feet to a point on the aforementioned common line of said Tarrant County Water Control tract and said Keystone Equity Partners tract, from which an 18 inch dead Hackberry tree for a corner bears South 37 degrees 07 minutes 55 seconds East, 1336.64 feet;

THENCE North 37 degrees 07 minutes 55 seconds West, a distance of 50.29 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING and containing 23,514 square feet or 0.5398 of an acre of land, more or less.


