Judge Sidney Samuels, having recently been retained as
Attorney for the Board was present, and participated in the deliberations of the Board.

The Fort Worth Levee Improvement District No. 1 presented to the Board for payment a bill aggregating \$4,074.91 for money advanced by them in perfecting preorganization engineering work for the District, so they claim, and after some discussion by the Board, and after Mr. K. Robey, Manager-Engineer for the District, had explained to the Board, why he thought the bill ought to be allowed, it was moved by L. C. Abbott which motion was seconded by H. M. Hightower, that said bill be referred to Judge Sidney Samuels for his opinion as to what should be done in the matter.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, Dr. W. M. Winton, of the Department of Biology of the Texas Christian University of Fort Worth, who has been acting as Geologist for the District in its investigations, was requested to file with the Board a full report of the work done by him to date.

Manager-Engineer Robey was requested not to write any more letters, such as werewritten by him on November 4th, 1925 to Walter-Woody and Heimerdinger and others, which, among other things stated.

"Fort Worth needs two things at present- a unified City plan and a Financial Expert to put the plan into Bond Issue covering a ten year program. We are writing now for your best judgment, as to the men, or firm best qualified to produce a plan for Fort Worth and this District and one best qualified to act as Financial Expert." as such letters might incur the disfavor of the City Council and City Manager of Fort Worth, toward the District, although written in good faith, on the part of Mr. Robey for the District.

Assistant Secretary Bullock was requested to begin to make preparation for the election of Directors, which will be held on the second tuesday in January, 1925, same being the 12th day of said month.

There being no further business at this time, the Board adjourned subject to call by the President.
