M, at its office in the Court House, Fort Worth, Texas, on the 14th day of December A. D. 1925; Presiding, W. C. Weeks, President: Present, L. C. Abbott, A. L. Baker, W. E. Bideker and H. M. Hightower,

Order of Election.

Upon motion made by W. E. Bideker, which was duly seconded by H. M. Hightower, which motion unanimously carried, the following order was passed, to-wit:

Whereas, Section No. 37, Chapter 25 of the General Laws as passed by the Thirty-ninth Legislature of the State of Texas, same being Senate Bill No. 169, requires that all Water Control and Improvement Districts hold a general election on the second tuesday in January, 1926, at which time there shall be elected five directors for each District. The three of said Directors receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for a term of two years and the two of said directors receiving the lowest number of votes shall serve for a term of one years, and,

Whereas, on, to-wit, June 19th, 1925, Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1 passed a resolution in conformity with Section No. 143, Chapter No. 25, of the General Laws, as passed by the Thirty-ninth Legislature of the State of Texas, adopting the terms of said law, creating the district a Water Control and Improvement District, and, by said Resolution, this District was designated as Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1, and notices relative to same were published according to law. and,

Whereas, said Section No. 143, Chapter No. 25, further provides, that, if a petition that, if a petition protesting said action of the Board of Directors, signed by not less than twenty qualified voters is filed in the office of the Board of Directors, or delivered to the secretary thereof, at any time within fifteen days after the date of the last publication of notices on same as required by this section, then, said resolution shall not become effective, unless said proposition is submitted an election held in such District and adopted by a vote of a majority of those voting at such election. and,

Whereas, on, to-wit: the 13th day of July, 1925, same being the fifteenth day after the last publication of said notice, a petition containing the names of twenty-four property tax paying voters of said District, protesting said Tarrant County Water Improvement District

No. 1 becoming operative under said Water Control and Improvement Law, as provided in said Section No. 143, was filed in the office of said District., Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, on, to-wit: January 12th, A. D. 1926, an election shall be held within said District, at which election there shall be submitted to the qualified voters within such District, the following propositions.

First:

"For Directors. (Five to be elected)

Second:

"For becoming operative under Water Control and Improvement District Law, known as Senate Bill No. 169, as passed at its regular Session, by the Thirty-ninth Legislature of The State of Texas, Authorized by Section 143, Chapt. 25 of said law."

"Against becoming operative under Water Control and Improvement District Law, known as Senate Bill No. 169, as passed at its regular Session by the Thirty-ninth Legislature of the State of Texas, Authorized by Section 143, Chapter 25 of said law."

No one shall be elected as such director unless he is a resident of the State of Texas and owns land, subject to taxation within such district, and who, at the time of such election shall be mote than twenty-one years of age.

At such election, no one shall be entitled to vote except Resident property tax payers, who are qualified voters under the laws of the State, of Texas, and, whose names appear upon the certified list of property tax payers in Tarrant County, Texas, to be furnished to the officers of said election at each polling place, by the Tax Collector of said County; provided, however, that a qualified voter, who is a property tax payer in said County and, whose name does not appear upon said list, shall be entitled to vote

if he shall first, take the following oath, to be administered by an election Judge, and which the judges of the election are authorized to administer; "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I am a qualified voter under the laws of the State of Texas, and that I am a resident property Tax payer of Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1, and that I did not acquire such property prior to this election for the purpose of voting, but, I am a bonafide tax payer." and, the manner of conducting the election shall be governed by the general laws of the State of Texas, except as otherwise specified by law, in such cases made and provided in proceedings of this character.

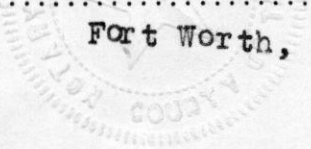
