Plaintiffs, filed in said Court on the 9th day of January A. D. 1926, against Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1, the water improvement district purported to be established within the boundaries of Tarrant County, Texas, and

W. C. Weeks, A. L. Baker, L. C. Abbott, W. E. Bideker and H. M. Hightower, the five Directors of said Water Improvement District, acting in their said capacityeas directors, Defendants,

for suit, said suit being numbered 72,002.

The nature of which demand is as follows, to-wit:

That the election creating or purporting to create the Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1 was called by the Commissionersy Court of Tarrant County, Texas, in response to a petition which represented, among other matters that the total cost of all the improvements contemplated to be made in said District would not exceed the sum of \$1,000,000.00 and that the election was ordered and the question voted upon as submitted in said petition.

That prior to the election which was ordered by the Commissioners' Court to determine whether or not the Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1 should be organized, the provision of the statute being Revised Statute 5107-17, to the effect that any property owner in Tarrant County, whose property was not susceptible to irrigation by gravity from the system to be provided, could, upon petition properly filed with the directors of the Water Improvement District be excluded from said, district, was advertised through the County and was used as an argument in order to get votes favorable to the organization of said Water Improvement District.

That shortly after the said election was held, plaintiffs herein duly filed with the directors of the Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1 their petition praying that the lands owneduby them in Tarrant County and described by said petition be excluded from the Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1 on the grounds that said lands were not susceptible to irrigation by gravity from the system to be provided, and for other reasons would derive no benefit from being included in said Water Improvement District and ought to be excluded. That the Directors postponed action on Plaintiff's petition and thereafter passed a resolution to the effect that the Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1 should become a "Water Control and Improvement District" and that it would be governed by the law which was passed by the Legislature of the State of Texas subsequent to the date of the organization of this Water Improvement District and subsequent to the date when Plaintiffs' petition was filed with them and subsequent to the date when the first hearing was had on said petition.

Plaintiffs' allege that by reason of their property unjustly, inequitably and illegally included and attempted to be included in the Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1, and by reason of the unjust, inequitable and illegal refusal of the directors of the Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1, to exclude their lands as above described from the Tarrant County Water Improvement District, upon petition duly and legally filed and presented, that these Plaintiffs have been damaged in the sum of several thousand dollars.

WHEREFORE, PLAINTIFFS PRAY THAT BY ORDER OF THIS COURT THEIR PROPERTY BE EXCLUDED FROM AND BE NO LONGER A PART OF THE TARRANT COUNTY WATER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1. and that a writ of Mandatory Injunction issue directing the Directors of the Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1 to make an order excluding from Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1 the property belonging to the Plaintiffs herein. and,

YOU WILL DELIVER to said defendants, in person, a true copy of the Citation, within fifteen days from the date of issuance hereof.

HEREIN FAIL NOT, and have you then and there this WRIT, showing how you have the same.

Secretary, W. E. Bideker stated that he and Manager-Engineer K. Robey carried-out-carried out the desires of the Board, in making application through power of attorney from the Board, to the State Board of Water Engineers at Austin, Texas, for an extension of time in which to make preliminary investigation, prior to calling bond issue, and in this

connection Mr. Bideker stated that, at a cost of \$40.00, Registration fee for four projects contemplated by the District, extension was granted for a term of two and one half years for such preliminary investigation work.

He returned to this office the applications heretofore made by this Board to the State Board of Water Engineers on December 31st, together with the District's Check for \$1,000.00 which was not needed for re-filing, and which the Board ordered Assistant Secretary, Bullock to Cancel.

A check for \$25.00, which was amount of the last Registration fee paid on July 12, 1925, was also ordered to be cancelled as same was not used by the State Board of Water Engineers.

Abbott to serve this District as Directors for a term of two years from and after January 12th, 1926, and that W. E. Bideker and H. M. Hightower are entitled to serve this District as Directors for a term of one year from and after January 12th, A. D. 1926, and,

As a further result of said election, IT IS DECLARED, ORDERED

AND DECREED BY THIS BOARD, a quorum thereof being present and voting, that
in conformity with an order passed by this Board on the 19th day of June,

A. D. 1925, decreeing and ordering that this District become operative under the
Water Control and Improvement District law, known as Senate Bill No. 169 passed at

the regular Session of the Thirty Ninth Legislature, that

Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1, is now, and

henceforth a Water Control and Improvement District and shall

hereafter be known as Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement

District No. 1 and shall be operative under and subject to all

the provisions of said Water Control Law, and further it is considered

to be and is organized fully under the terms of said law.

The following Statement of J. H. Bullock, Assistant Secretary of the Board of Directors was ordered to be recorded in these minutes, to-wit:

January 14th, 1926.

I, J. H. Bullock, Assistant Secretary of the Board of Directors of Tarrant County Water Improvement District No. 1, do hereby affirm and declare that the following statements are true to-wit:

On the morning of January 14th. 1926, at about 10 o'clock Messr's Felix Bransford and Alfred H. Eaton came into the office of Tarrant County Water Improvement District and asked where the envelopes centaining the talley sheets, election returns etc. were, and I told them, whereupon. without further ceremony they took possession of the same, opened them and proceeded to begin comparing the returns with talley sheets, asking all maner of questions about this and that: I asked them if they were within their rights in doing this, as the complete returns had not come in and that the Board had not as yet met to canvass the returns. They answered me that they were wholly within their rights and that the returns were public property. Not being satisfied I, at once, telephoned Judge Sidney L. Samuels what had transpired and he told me to tell them that they had no right whatever to see said returns and talley sheets etc. until after the Board of Directors had met and formally canvassed the returns of the election, and that when this was done, they would have the right to be present and could have access to them then and afterwards. I conveyed this message to said Bransford and Eaton; Mr. Bransford, then telephoned Judge Sidney Samuels,

and when he had finished, he and Eaton resumed their checking and investigation of said returns. I again remonstrated with them, whereupon they both told me they knew that they were within their rights
and refused to allow me to take said papers from them, but kept them
until they had finished checking each envelope, which was addressed
to the Secretary of the Board of Directors. Each told me to tell
Mr. Samuels that they refused to heed his or my request, and that the
only way they would desist was by being made to do so by legal procedure.

Hawley to make an inspection of said Pridgeport project and report to this Board just what further work will ne necessary.

There being no further business at this time, the Board Adjourned Subject to Call of President.
