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MINUTES OF A REGULAR WEEKLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE ON JANUARY 7, 1929, at 3 O'CLOCK P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence, or absence, of directors as follows, viz:

W. K. Stripling
C. A. Hickman

W. R. Bennett, (out of city)

Director E. E. Bewley presided in his capacity as Vice-President; W. K. Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this meeting the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

- 1. Minutes of the meeting of December 31, 1929, were read, approved and ordered of record.
- 2. Director Bewley presented a Reciprocal Receipt, executed by the Texas National Bank, as the District's Depository, which was proposed to be executed and the intent complied with by this District. This Receipt specifically describes certain securities now held and pledged by this District, which securities are specifically described in "Exhibit A" here to attached and made part hereof. The total amount of the securities proposed to be withdrawn from pledge is \$155,000.00 in par value. Director Bewley, as Custodian of Pledges, stated that the balance of the District now in the Depository had been drawn down to such a point as made it proper for the District to release from pledge the securities so proposed to be withdrawn. He further stated that after such withdrawal the District would still be amply secured concerning its actual cash balance. Upon examination of this proposal, Director Stripling make a motion that the Securities proposed to be withdrawn do be released by the District's Cutodian of Pledges to the Texas National Bank: that the Reciprocal Receipt do be executed in triplicate: that one of said Receipts be delivered to the Texas National Bank, and one attached to the Depository Bond as "Exhibit 13" and that it become a part of said Bond as is provided by the terms of said Bond. Further, that Director Bewley, as Custodian, do be authorized to do any and all things required to carry out the intent of this motion. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken, the motion was carried and it is so ordered.
- 3. Thereupon the Directors vised, and analyzed, the current accounts and land purchase accounts now payable by the District. The accounts so presented for authorization and payment were covered by Vouchers Serial Numbers 1787 to 1830, both inclusive, which aggregate the total sum \$30,815.54. Specific detail of each of said accounts is shown by "Exhibit B", here to attached as part here of. Director Stripling moved that the accounts, as presented, do be allowed and that vouchers therefor do be executed and delivered to the persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

- 5. Thereupon there was presented to the Directors a request of Mr. G. W. Tippens that the \$130.27, held by the District out of the check in payment for his interest in certain lands sold the District, be remitted and paid to him. It was explained that Mr. Tippens had formerly indicated his desire to rent said land for the year 1930, but that he had determined not to use the land. After consideration of this request Director Hickman made a motion that the check for \$130.27 be executed and delivered to Mr. G. W. Tippens upon condition, however, that prior to the delivery of said check that Mr. G. W. Tippens establish to the District that the premises in question have been actually vacated by Mr. Tippens and others who formerly held interest with him. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.
- 6. The reupon there was presented to the Directors a proposal by the Royal Typewriter Company to deliver to the District a new Royal Typewriter at the net cost, \$83.03, less an allowance of \$22.50 for the five year old Underwood Typewriter \$60.53. Director Hickman made a motion that Mr. Cheatham be authorized to consummate purchase on the stated terms. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. The motion was carried and it is so ordered.
- 7. The reupon there was presented to the Directors controversy growing out of the claim of Steve Watson that he was entitled to lease the lands, purchased by the District from the McDaniel Estate, for the year 1930; that if this was not to be granted that he be allowed damages in the sum of \$150.00 to reimburse him for cost of moving and for work done on the land in anticipation of using it for another year. Upon analysis of this claim it was the sense of the Directors that Mr. Watson should be requested to give immediate possession of the property and that any claim on his part concerning a wrongful injury be denied. It was so ordered.
- 8. Reports by Land Committee: The reupon, Director Hickman and Director Stripling, composing the Land Committee, did make recommendation

for the purchase of lands and, or, the lease of lands for the year 1930 as follows, viz:

- (a) Mrs. Mae Hunter, et al, to purchase in fee a stated 1/10th interest in the lands of Mrs. N. C. Hopper and her children. It was explained that the actual interest of Mrs. Mae Hopper was 12/140ths of the total consideration and that the purchase should be approved on that basis.
- (b) To purchase from Mrs. Lennie Kidd, a widow, approximately 40 acres of land, at the rate \$65.00 per acre. This contract carries the pencil provision "Is to have preference of lease of this land at \$1.00 per acre for the year 1930."
- (c) To acquire from J. L. Slimp a water easement on approximately 17.85 acres of land at the rate of \$3.00 per acre.

Upon consideration and analysis of each of these proposals, Director Hogsett made a motion that the said listed purchases, as stated, do be approved and authorized, subject only to the usual condition concerning satisfaction as to title. The motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

There was no further business presented and the meeting was declared adjourned.
