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MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF  
TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE, HELD  
IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE AT FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THURSDAY, JANUARY 23, 1930, AT  
3 O'CLOCK P.M.

① This meeting was held for the purpose to announce to persons who, on January 21, 1930, had filed bids for the construction work proposed by the District, and to all other persons interested therein, the result of the consideration of the filed bids. The holding of this meeting at this time and place was in conformity to the open announcement made at the called meeting of January 21, 1930, at 10 o'clock a. m., at which time sealed bids were received, opened, and publicly read.

At this time and place Directors of the District were present as follows, viz:

W. R. Bennett  
E. E. Bewley  
W. K. Stripling  
Joe B. Hogsett  
C. A. Hickman

There were also present the Engineers for the District, and various officers and agents of those corporations who had filed bids on January 21, 1930. Especially to be noted as present were the following, viz:

(a) W. E. Callahan, President, Callahan Construction Company, and McFarland, representing Peterson, Shirley & Gunther, and Callahan Construction Company.

(b) E. P. Harwell and T. H. Harbin, representing the Trinity Farm Construction Company; A. J. McKenzie, representing McKenzie Construction Company; W. P. Bentley, representing Uvalde Construction Company.

(c) Mr. R. S. Womack and C. S. Henning, Jr., representing Womack, Henning & Rollins, Inc.

The above named bidders were known to represent the three low bids received upon the work. There were also present representatives of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram; Fort Worth Press; and the Dallas News.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

I. By request of President Bennett Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, one of the Engineers for the District, presented to all present the Engineers' report of an analysis of the bids made on January 21. A blueprint, setting out the name of each bidder, together with the specified, and classified, materials, with the unit prices, the extension for each item in dollars, and the total of dollars for each bidder, is embodied in a report of Hawley and Freese, as Engineers for the District. Said report is attached to these minutes as "Exhibit A", and is here referred to as a part hereof. The said blueprint tabulation of bids was by Mr. Nichols read in all detail to those present, so that all might plainly hear.

II. At the closing of the reading of said report and the analysis thereof, all present were given an opportunity to question Mr. Nichols concerning the analysis of bids as made by the Engineers. It appeared that no one present in any wise disagreed with the analysis of the bids as prepared by the Engineers, and transmitted to the Directors of the District. Thereupon, the President announced that the Board was not ready to announce their decision on bids, and for that reason would desire to recess for the holding of an executive session. He thereupon explained that the Directors were ready to return to unsuccessful bidders their good faith checks, save and except the checks deposited by the Trinity Farm Construction Company, et al; by Callahan Construction Company, et al; and by Womack, Henning and Rollins, Inc. He further stated that if there was any bidder present who desired to make any statement, the Board would be glad to hear him. No one present indicated any desire to make any statement. Thereupon, all present, save the Directors for the District and the other persons employed by the District, retired, with the understanding that the representatives of the three named low bidders would be subject to immediate call. In this executive session there was the fullest discussion of all possible combinations of bids, which might prove to be more advantageous to the District than any single bid for the completion of both reservoirs.

III. <sup>①</sup> Thereupon, Messrs. Harwell, Harbin, McKenzie, and Bentley, were invited into the executive session. The Board stated to them that they desired to have an agreement that this syndicate would release the Bridgeport Reservoir from their bid and permit the Board to award the Bridgeport reservoir to Womack, Henning and Rollins, Inc., on their low bid for the one reservoir. This request the Bidders declined to grant, making explanation that in their opinion they would save not less than \$150,000.00 in being able to move equipment and men from one reservoir to the other reservoir site; and that for this reason they had fully credited ~~some~~ their economy in making their bid on the Eagle Mountain Dam.

IV. The Directors stated to these Gentlemen that before determining awards they desired to know the willingness of the bidders to include in the formal written contract specific interpretation of certain clauses in the Standard Form of Contract to be used. These two questions are substantially as follows, viz:

(1.) If at the Eagle Mountain Dam site there should not be found to be sufficient material suitable for the proper construction of Hydraulic embankment, then will you agree to complete, or build, this dam with wetted, or rolled, materials in lieu of Hydraulic materials to be compensated at the same unit cost as that specified in the bid for Hydraulic fill?

To this question the named officers of the represented bidders stated that they were perfectly willing to make this agreement.

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(2) If it is found that at the Bridgeport dam site it is necessary, due to the character of materials found, to change the type of construction from "Puddle Core, Wetted and Rolled Embankment" to "Wetted and Rolled Embankment", then will you conform to this necessity and construct the dam by the "Wetted and Rolled Embankment" Method at the same unit costs as are specified in the filed bid for "Puddle Core, Wetted and Rolled Levee Embankment"?

To this question the stated representatives said they were willing to have this embodied in the contract.

V. The Directors also desired an interpretation of paragraphs 12 and 22, as set out in the GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE AGREEMENT, as contained in the "STANDARD FORM OF CONTRACT". After full discussion it was agreed by the stated representatives that they were ready to place upon said two clauses the interpretation as follows, viz:

"The contractors are to take the sole hazard of delays, or interference, occasioned by litigation, and, or, other interference, occasioned by persons other than the District: (save, however, that such delay, interference, or litigation is not occasioned by the order of the District, or by the negligence or laches of the District, its officers or agents."

There being no further matter desired to be discussed between the stated bidders and the Board, these Gentlemen retired.

VI. Thereupon, Mr. Callahan and Capt. McFarland, representing Callahan Construction Company, et al, were asked into the meeting. There was a general discussion of their bid, but no matter was presented which tended to show that their bid could in any event prove to be as low as the bid submitted by the Trinity Farm Construction Company, et al. These Gentlemen then retired.

VII. Thereupon, Messrs. Womack and Henning, representing Womack Henning & Rollins, Inc., were admitted. After full discussion of their bid, no matter was found which would indicate that their bid would in anywise be as advantageous to the District as that bid submitted by the Trinity Farm Construction Company, et al. These Gentlemen then retired.

IX. Thereupon there was read in open meeting the written report of John B. Hawley, Engineer for the District, concerning the awarding of a contract, which report in material part was as follows, viz:

"The Trinity Farms Construction Company et al have submitted their proposal conditional upon being awarded the contract for both dams, including the clearing thereof. Considering both dams, this bid is lower than any other possible combination of bids submitted by the other bidders.

"The lowest bidder, Trinity Farms Construction Company, Inc., joined by the McKenzie Construction Company and the Uvalde Construction Company has definitely and firmly declined to separate their bid in such manner as to enable your Board to award the Bridgeport dam to another bidder.

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"I am convinced that the award of the Bridgeport Dam Contract to the lowest bidder on that structure alone, and readvertisement for bids on the Eagle Mountain Dam would result in much higher figures than those submitted by Trinity Farms Construction Company, et al.

"In view of the above facts and conditions, I unqualifiedly recommend the acceptance of the joint proposal of the Trinity Farms Construction Company, Inc.; McKenzie Construction Company and Uvalde Construction Company as the lowest and best bid, and that the certified checks of all other bidders be returned."

X. <sup>(1)</sup> After full discussion of all factors involved, it was determined by the Directors that all provisions of the law applicable to this meeting had been complied with; further that the joint bid of Trinity Farm Construction Company; McKenzie Construction Company; and Uvalde Construction Company, was the bid most advantageous to the District and would result in the best and most economical completion of the District's proposed plant, improvements, facilities, and works; further, that said named joint bidders were such responsible persons as are intended by the law. Further, it was the opinion of the Directors that to proceed under said bid (taken in connection with all other factors entering into the cost of the work) would result in the completion of the proposed plant, works, facilities, and improvements, as stipulated by the District's adopted plans, would result in the completion thereof for a total cost not in any event to exceed the total sum estimated by the District's Engineers in their plans, which plans were adopted by this District prior to the election for the authorization of the bonds, to be sufficient to pay the completed costs of all elements of the proposed works, other than the cost of lands, easements, and other property necessary to be acquired under the provisions of Sections 13 and 14 of Chapter 280 of the Acts of the 41st Legislature, Regular Session.

(a) Thereupon Director Stripling made a motion that the contract for both reservoirs be awarded upon the joint bid of Trinity Farm Construction Company, McKenzie Construction Company and the Uvalde Construction Company: subject, however, to the execution of a satisfactory formal contract and compliance by the Bidders with all other requirements set forth in the "Notice to Bidders", in the specifications, and any other formal matter required by law. Further, that any and all other Bids do be rejected, and that the Cashier's checks, and Certified checks, delivered by the unsuccessful bidders as good faith deposits, do be returned to such unsuccessful bidders, as soon as the same might be accomplished, and appropriate receipts procured therefor. This motion was seconded by Director Bewley. Upon a vote being taken, all Directors present voted for the motion and no Director voted against the motion. The motion was unanimously adopted and it is so ordered. <sup>(1)</sup>

XI. Thereupon the executive session was ended, and the public procedure was resumed. The result of the award was openly announced. There was a call for any objection to the award. No objection was made. Thereupon full details of the award, and the basis for the award, was given to the representatives of the press.

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XII. Director Bewley, as Custodian of the pledges of the District's Depository, presented the request of the Texas National Bank to withdraw from pledge securities now on deposit to secure the District, aggregating the par sum \$50,000.00. Said securities proposed to be withdrawn are described in detail in "Exhibit B" of these minutes, and reference is here made to said Exhibit as part hereof. Director Bewley stated that he recommended consent to the withdrawal of the proposed securities, due to the fact that the District's balance in the Bank would permit the withdrawal of the stated securities and still leave the District ample protection against the present actual cash balance. Thereupon, Director Hickman made a motion that withdrawal of securities, as proposed, do be granted, and that Director Bewley do be authorized to consummate the withdrawal, executing reciprocal receipt as between this District and the Bank. Further, that one of said reciprocal receipts do be attached to the original bond of the District Depository as "Exhibit 15"; that one such reciprocal receipt be attached to these minutes; and that one be delivered to the Depository Bank. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

XIII. Thereupon Messrs. Harbin, McKenzie and Bentley were recalled to have definite understanding as to when they would comply with the provisions of the Engineers' Conditions regarding the execution of formal contract, the giving of bond, and the providing of insurance, which conditions also were embraced in the order to award the contract. It also was desired to know what was the plan of the Contractors as to the actual beginning of the work. It was explained that while the District desired prompt construction, the Directors would not desire that the shipping of machinery and the doing of preparatory work, at a time prior to the execution of formal contract, and the giving of satisfactory bond, should in any way operate to bind the District, or subject it to claims: To these inquiries the Contractors replied:

(1) That they would desire to be in Fort Worth on Monday February 3rd, 1930, to execute formal contract, give construction bond, and provide the stipulated insurance protection.

(2) That they, however, expected to put their clearing foreman, and other necessary men to erect office quarters and other facilities on the ground on the succeeding day; also, that they would start their heavy equipment for loading on the cars and shipment on the succeeding day. That while this was true, they would do so at their own risk, and that the Directors could rest assured that no claim or demand would grow out of this election on the part of the Contractors.

XIV. It was also explained to the proposing Contractors that certain lands acquired by the District had been leased for use until December 31st, 1930, or shorter terms, and that in some cases it might be necessary to delay clearing until after the expiration of the lease: The Directors desired to know, if the Contractors would observe any such condition and delay clearing until no claim could arise through proceeding, or proceed at their own risk and hold the District harmless as against any claim or demand growing out of such accelerated clearing? To this inquiry the Contractors substantially replied: "We will observe all such peculiar conditions and will fully protect you against any claim which may arise through our going

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on land for the purpose of clearing it." ]

There being no further business presented, the meeting was adjourned.
