MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON FEBRUARY 21ST, A. D. 1930 at 30°CLOCK P. M.

A call of the roll disclosed the presence and absence of Directors as follows, viz:

PRESENT

ABSENT W. R. Bennett (out of city) ost.

E. E. Bewley, C. A. Hickman, J. B. Hogsett, W. K. Stripling

In the absence of W. R. Bennett, President, Director Bewley presided in his capacity as Vice President. Director Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary. At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

(1) Thereupon, it was presented to the Directors the annual report of Pitner and Adams, Auditors, concerning the condition of this District on December 31, 1929. Each of the Directors was furnished with a true copy of said audit and the original thereof is attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit A". It was the sense of the Directors that no formal action be taken upon this audit until each of the Directors has had an opportunity to analyze the report: It was so ordered.

(2) Ed B. Cheatham, Accountant for the District, presented an itemized list of vouchers proposed to be issued by the District to meet current obligations of the District, together with the distribution of the same; also the condition of the District funds as of February 20, 1930 and the depositories in which such funds are deposited. Said itemized, detailed information is attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B" and is here referred to as a part hereof. It appeared that vouchers, Serial Nos. 1831 to 1864, both inclusive, were drawn on the Texas National Bank of Fort Worth; that said vouchers were outstanding at the time the bank failed; that the same have not been paid and will not be paid and that it had been necessary to issue substitute vouchers therefor. Further that the vouchers listed in "Exhibit B" as numbers 1865 to 1883, both inclusive, were the substitute vouchers issued in lieu of said vouchers 1831 to 1864, inclusive, on which default had been made. It was ordered by the Directors that the said vouchers so in default be marked"void"and retained in the District's files.

Thereupon there was an examination and consideration of each and all of the vouchers proposed to be issued (Serial Nos. 1865 to 1929, inclusive); aggregating \$88,791.31: Director Stripling made a motion that each and all of the accounts presented do be approved valid and due obligations of the District; that the vouchers as presented do be executed and delivered to the persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett: Upon vote being taken the motion was carried: It was so ordered: (3) Thereupon there was presented and considered by the Directors the bondsocollateral pledged contracts executed respectively by The Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth, the First National Bank of Fort Worth and Continental National Bank of Fort Worth. There was also presented a certificate of Honorable S. D. Shannon, County Judge of Tarrant County, Texas, approving The Fort Worth National Bank and the Continental National Bank as District depositories. Each of said bonds and the pledge contract therewith was examined by the Directors and the same and each of the same were declared to have been executed in the manner and form required by the law and the prior orders of this Board of Directors.

Especially did the Directors give consideration to the collateral securities shown in exhibits attached to said bonds as follows:

(a) To the bond of The Fort Worth National Bank, "Exhibit 1"; listed bonds and securities totaling \$420,000.00.

(b) To the bond of Continental National Bank, "Exhibits 1 and 2"; showing bonds and securities in the total par value \$600,000.00.
(c) To the bond of First National Bank, "Exhibits 1 and 2"; showing bonds and securities in the par value \$450,000.00.

After full discussion of the sufficiency of the collateral now in the possession of this District as pledges to secure the District, Director Hickman made a motion that each of said banks do hereby be declared to have qualified as a District Depository, in accordance with the former orders of this Board of Directors and the law. Further, that the securities so placed in pledge by each of said banks do be approved as good and sufficient security and that each of said banks do hereby be qualified as a depository for this District within the limits of the security now, and hereafter to be, placed in pledge by said respective depositories. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling: On a vote being taken motion was unanimously carried and it is so ordered.

(4) Thereupon there was a discussion of the advisability of procuring a new voucher check form and also to procure a check writer. It was the sense of the Directors that Director Hogsett, as Chairman of the Committee on Organization, and Mr. Cheatham should propose a check form and that the same adopted should be printed: Further that the safety of the District's funds and the economy of time in the writing of checks would well justify a protective check writer: It was so ordered.

(5) Thereupon Directors Hickman and Stripling, composing Committee on Land Matters, presented proposed contracts for the purchase of lands, and, or, to lease lands, and did make recommendation for purchase and rentals as follows, viz:

(a) S. Castleberry (written contract in file) to purchase in fee 109 acres of land located in Wise County, Texas, for \$50.00 per acre. This contract contains a provision that the grantor was to lease this land for the year 1930 at \$1.00 per acre. It was explained that this contract did not cover an easement upon the land of Mr. Castleberry lying contiguous to the land to be purchased in fee; due to the unwillingness of the grantor to execute an easement contract. It was, however, orally agreed that the grantor in the execution of the deed would enter into a covenant that if,

in time to come, the land shown by the District's Engineers to be land which will temporarily be submerged, in whole or in part, at times of abnormal flood, becomes actually submerged, and that such submergence proved actually to damage said land, or some part thereof, then that the District shall have an easement upon so much of said land as proves to be so damaged; for which easement the District shall yield and pay unto the Grantor, or his successors in title, the sum of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars per acre for such damaged land as is agricultural land, and at the rate of Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars per acre for such damaged land as is grazing land. Further, that this covenant shall run with the land, and that there may be as many successive adjustments as may be shown to be required by a flood higher than any flood which may have given rise to a prior adjustment: It is understood that there may be as many such adjustments as experience with floods may require. Further, that the easements so to be acquired in the future shall be such as will perpetually thereafter release this District from claim or demand of any kind or character, arising from water coverage, or water levels.

(b) H. H. Flowers (written contract in file) to purchase in fee simple 79 acres of land, more or less, located in Wise County, Texas, at the rate of \$50.00 per acre. There is a special provision that the grantor was to lease the land for the year 1930 at \$1.00 per acre, payable in advance. This contract was subject to an oral agreement in regard to easement which was in all things identical with the agreement set forth with S. Castleberry.

(c) 0. L. Kimbrough (written contract in file) to purchase in fee 21.86 acres of land at \$60.00 per acre. This contract bears notation as follows: "It is agreed that 0. L. Kimbrough has leased for year 1930 at \$1.00 per acre".

(d) Mrs. C. T. Rowland (written contract in file) to purchase in fee 16.38 (including submergences and easement) acres at \$50.00 per acre.

(e) Mrs. Mary Morris (written contract in file) to purchase in fee simple 20 acres of land at \$50.00 per acre.

(f) M. M. Ford (written contract in file) to purchase in fee 51-1/3 acres at the rate of \$60.00 per acre. This contract bears notation as follows: "It is agreed that the grantor is to have lease for 1930 at \$1.00 per acre."

(g) G. W. Duke (written contract in file) to purchase in fee 47.93 acres at \$55.00 per acre: To purchase in easement on 35 acres at the rate of \$3.00 per acre.

(h) L. H. Hill (written contract in file) to purchase in fee 81.5 acres at \$50.00 per acre. This contract bears notation as follows: "It is agreed that L. H. Hill is to have lease on said land for 1930 at \$1.00 per acre."

Upon consideration of each of said proposals, Director Hogsett made a motion that the purchases and rentals proposed do be authorized and consummated, subject only to the usual conditions concerning the sufficiency of titles. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman: Upon a vote being taken, all Directors present voted for the motion and no director voted against the motion: It is so ordered.

There was no further business presented. The meeting was adjourned.

As per your request we have made an audit of your books of account and record covering the year ended December 31st 1929, and submit results of examination as shown by exhibits and schedules included herewith as follows:

FINANCIAL CONDITION

The Assets and Liabilities as of December 31-1929, shown in detail on Balance Sheet, are summarized as follows:

ASSETS

Balances in bank were verified in detail and reconciled with the records of the depository bank.

Accounts receivable represent advances for abstract deposits and expense and will be deducted from remittances when deals are closed.

We inspected deeds for land purchased, all being on hand and recorded except one from C.E.Gilmore for purchase of 86.22 acres.The check for this purchase \$2,155.50 was outstanding on January 31-1930 when the depository bank closed.If this deed is received and tranaction is completed as shown, another check will of course have to be issued and the original one taken up. Analysis of land cost, included herewith, takes into account all purchases to December 31-1929 on which any payment was made, except 48/140ths of 357 acres from Mrs.N.E.Hopper etal.This portion of the tract had not been purchased at December 31-1929 and no payment had been made on it.The other 92/140ths was completed at December 31-1929.

The cost of engineering data, maps and profiles is built up from the cost of prior years. All payments on engineering have been capitalized and the balance as shown represents the net payments to date of audit.

Equipment items are carried at book cost less depreciation, and are without inventory or appraisal bu us.

Of the uncollected taxes \$19,084.13 was collected during December 1929 and was not remitted until January 1930, according to the records of the Tax Collector's office.As the collector does not report the collections by tax years and this information is not readily obtainable from the county records, it is not possible to report the uncollected taxes by years.This information is valuable and it will be necessary that you have it if the tax levy is ever divided between two or more funds.

Unexpired insurance pepresents the unearned portion of fire insurance and bond premiums.

The bond discount of \$70,000.00 is amortized on the basis of interest payments.For the year 1929 \$1,614.84 is charged off on the accrued bond interest for the year of \$62,505.00,the balance of \$68,385.16 being carried as a deferred charge.

LIABILITIES

A schedule of accounts payable is included herewith.We verified these items from your records but made no verification by correspondence with the creditors.

A complete record of the bonded debt is on hand in your office. The bonds are annual series on the level tax plan, the idea being that the payments of principal and interest will be about the same each year over the life of the bonds. The bonds mature from March 15th, 1933 to 1969 and the interest is due March 15th and Sept 15th each year being March 15-1930 when interest for ten months \$83,340.00 will be due. The \$2,000,000.00 bonds issued and sold is a part of the \$6,500,000.00 authorized.

Farm rent for 1930 collected during 1929 is shown as deferred income.

We made no special investigation to ascertain the amount of any liabilities, either actual or contingent, if any, not shown by the books.

RECEIPTS & DISBURSEMENTS

All receipts of record were traced into the bank deposits and disbursements were verified by inspection of cancelled voucher checks, vouchers and deeds to land purchased. We have suggested to Mr.Cheatham that he put in a numbered receipt record and issue receipts for all moneys received, retaining the carbon copy in permanent book form for the office records, and believe he has made arrangements to do this.

GENERAL

In addition to the regular audit we verified the bank accounts for the month of January 1930 and reconciled the balances at January 31-1930 the closing date of the depository bank.

We also inspected the depository bond securities as shown on January 31-1930 the date the bank closed, and found these in agreement with your record as furnished to us.

Your books and records were written up to date and in very good condition.
