MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE ON MAY 26, 1930,3 O'CLOCK P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence, or absence, of directors as follows, viz:

PRESENT:

ABSENT:

W. R. Bennett C. A. Hickman Joe B. Hogsett W. K. Stripling E. E. Bewley, out of city.

W. R. Bennett presided in his capacity as President; Director Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1. The Minutes of the Meeting of May 19, 1930, and the Minutes of the Called Meeting of May 23, 1930, were read, approved, and ordered of record.

2. Messrs. D. J. Porter and C. E. Farmer, representing a Committee of the Depositors of the Texas National Bank, now in the hands of the Receiver, appeared before the Directors to present the request that this District place with the Receiver of the Bank the proceeds of securities heretofore sold by the District, to protect it in replacing its funds theretofore on Deposit with the Texas National Bank, as the District's Official Depository. This request was based on a letter written to this District by Mr. D. J. Porter, on May 22, 1930. Said letter is attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit A", and is made part hereof. Both Mr. Porter and Mr. Farmer made oral argument to support the demand contained in the letter. At the conclusion of their argument, it was stated by President Bennett that the request involved purely matters of law: he stated that the discretion of the Directors would be strictly confined within the limits of the liability of the District, as a matter of law: He therefore requested Mr. C. E. Farmer. as Attorney for the Depositors' Committee, to present a brief of his authorities in support of the demand, in order that the same might be submitted to the Attorneys of the District, who would investigate the same in order to determine whether or not the brief might justify them in reaching a conclusion different from the opinion heretofore rendered by the Attorneys for the District to the Board of Directors. Mr. Farmer agreed to present such a brief. and he and Mr. Porter thereupon retired.

3. Director Hogsett presented a request of the Continental National Bank, the District's Depository, to withdraw from pledge certain securities, aggregating the sum \$105,000.00, and to substitute in lieu of the securities proposed to be withdrawn, certain securities in the sum of \$10,000.00. A specific description of the securities proposed to be withdrawn, and those proposed to be substituted, is attached to these minutes as "Exhibit B", and is here made part hereof. Director Hogsett, as a member of the Finance Committee,

reported that in his opinion the request should be granted, and that the District's balance, as of this date, would be amply secured in case the request was granted. He thereupon moved that the request, as made, do be granted, authorized, and that multiple reciprocal receipts in the usual form do be executed in the usual manner, and that one of said receipts be attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit C", and that one do be attached to the original bond of the Depository, as is provided for by the bond. Further, that Director Bewley, upon his return to the city, do be authorized to deliver the securities proposed to be withdrawn and to take into his possession the securities proposed to be substituted; further, that he be authorized to execute the reciprocal receipt, as hereby provided for. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken, the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

1. Thereupon, there was presented to the Directors a bond, executed by the Trinity Farm Construction Company, Inc., as Principal, and the American Surety Company, of New York, as Surety, for the sum of \$11,068.98, which bond was tendered to the District under the provisions of Chapter 78, Acts of the 41st Legislature of Texas, Second Called Session, whereby it is provided that moneys deducted from an estimate due to a Contractor, to cover labor and material claims, may, and shall, be paid over to the Contractors. in advance of the time the claims may have been litigated and determined. Said original bond is attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit D", and is hereby referred to as a part hereof. Upon consideration of the bond, Director Hogsett made a motion that the District do approve the bond being tendered, as good and sufficient under the law; further, that the District do execute and deliver to the Contractors its voucher check No. 2103, for the sum of \$5534.49, and that the amount of the check be charged to the Contractors, as payment made. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered; the check was executed and ordered delivered.

5. Thereupon there was presented to the Directors a verified claim, filed by Kaker Bros of Bridgeport, Texas, wherein they set up that H. H. Lemon, subcontractor on the District's works, was indebted to them in the sum \$136.81. Upon consideration of this claim, Director Hogsett moved that the claim be received, and filed, that the contractors be advised of the claim, and that the amount of the claim be deducted from the next Engineers' Estimate of the amount to become due and payable to the Contractors. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken, the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

6. Thereupon there were presented to the Directors District Voucher Checks, to cover sums now due and payable by the District, as follows, viz:

Upon examination of each of these accounts, and the vouchers to support the same, Director Hickman made a motion that the stated accounts do be allowed, as accounts now due and payable by the District, and that each of the checks do be executed, and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

7. REPORT OF LAND COMMITTEE: Director Hickman, Chairman of the Land Committee, presented a proposed contract by the District and J. R. Walker and wife, covering 31.28 acres of land, situated in Tarrant County, Texas, consideration to be \$65.00 per acre, the exact quantity of land to be certified by the District Engineers. Under this proposed contract the District was to have immediate possession of the land upon closing of the purchase. Written contract is in file. Upon consideration of this proposed contract, Director Hickman made a motion that the purchase, as proposed, do be approved, and authorized, subject only to the usual procedures for the delivery of valid title. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

There being no further business presented, the meeting was adjourned.

Attention of Mr. Walter Bennett, Chairman

Gentlemen:

I wish to talk with you for a few minutes through the medium of this letter in regard to the assets of the defunct Texas National Bank, which closed its doors with you, the Tarrant County Water Control & Improvement District No. 1, and the City of Ft. Worth holding approximately \$1,600,000.00 of the Bank's assets as security for your deposits. You proceeded to sell these securities (hurriedly, so it seemed to those most interested) and paid yourselves your deposits in full.

So it came to pass, on the 20th day of May, the Texas National Depositors Association, after considerable investigation, met in session and passed a resolution instructing the Chairman (who is the writer) to request Mr. R. L. Van Zandt, Receiver, to take action necessary to recover on the assets mentioned above which were formerly held by the City and Water Control Board. Another clause instructed this Chairman, in case the Receiver within a reasonable time neglects, fails or refuses action, to proceed with necessary legal steps for recovery. Therefore, it will be necessary for me, within a few days, to notify Mr. Van Zandt of the action desired. Before doing so, it is evident that the proper action for me is to take the matter up with you as I am one who does not wish to influence or take action against his City, County, or State, or any constructive business thereof, without first giving them a fair chance to do what I consider right and proper. This is also true of the people I represent. They would not care to be placed in the position of influencing or taking action against anyone before they had given them an opportunity to do what we believe to be the right thing.

It is not the purpose of the writer to enter into a legal discussion of this matter, but the people I represent are convinced, after investigation, that upon the closing of the bank you did not have a legally secured deposit, but rather was your status that of a common depositor. Therefore, The Texas National Depositors Association, representing the best interest of all those depositors who stand to loose anything in the collapse of the bank, are requesting you, and I am taking the liberty of making this request public, that you put your money back with the Receiver of the Texas National Bank and take your loss, as it may appear, along with us.
