MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THIS THE 9TH DAY OF JUNE, A. D. 1930, AT 3 O'CLOCK P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of all of the directors as follows, viz:

W. R. Bennett C. A. Hickman Joe B. Hogsett W. K. Stripling E. E. Bewley

W. R. Bennett presided in his capacity as President; Director Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1. The minutes of the meeting of June 2, 1930, were read, approved. and ordered of record.

2. There was presented to the Directors a letter from the Hon. S. B. Cantey, concerning a reservation of a claim in behalf of Mrs. Lennie J. Burgess for excess of land, for which she claimed payment of consideration. This excess of land grew out of her claim that the surveys should have run to the center of the river, whereas the Engineers and Attorneys for this District had furnished description which called for the banks of the river. Both the Engineers and the Attorneys had advised that they had examined the patents from the State of Texas, and that these descriptions called for the banks of the river, and not the center of the river. Upon full consideration of the matter it was ordered that the letter be acknowledged, received and filed.

3. John B. Hawley presented to the Directors written statement that conditions at the Eagle Mountain Dam had been disclosed to require heavier sheet steel piling than that specified in the contract; that the maximum increase of cost would be \$5500.00. There was full discussion of this matter, whereupon Director Bewley made a motion that the Engineers be authorized to make the change in the specifications for Sheet Steel Piling and that the American Surety Co., as Surety for the contractors, be given notice of the proposed change; and that said letter giving the Surety Co. Notice do be attached to these minutes as "Exhibit A". This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken, the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

4. Thereupon there was presented to the Directors bond of the Trinity Farm Construction Company, Inc., signed by the American Surety Company, as Surety, for the sum \$1076.58, which had been delivered in order to obtain release of \$538.29, heretofore withheld by the District from the Engineers' Estimates, in order to secure claims as follows:

The Directors were advised by the Attorneys for the District that the bond complied with the law, and the Directors were of the opinion that the Surety given was a good and sufficient Surety under the law, whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that the bond tendered be accepted as good and sufficient bond, and that the sums formerly withheld do be paid to the contractors. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

5. Thereupon there was presented to the Directors claim against the Contractors, growing out of an account made by H. H. Lemon, as Subcontractor, which claim was filed so that the sum of the claim would be withheld from the Engineers' Estimates to become payable to the contractors. Said claim was as follows, viz:

#### Magnolia Petroleum Company

\$513.97

Upon consideration of this matter, it was ordered as follows: That notice of the claim be given to the Contractors; that the claim be filed and that the sum of the claim be deducted from the next Engineers' Estimates to become payable to the Contractors.

6. Thereupon there was presented to the Directors Engineers' Estimate of the progress of the Work No. 4, showing the balance due of the sum of \$22,648.68, as follows:

Eagle Mountain Dam	\$12,963.57
Bridgeport Dam	9,685.11

T O T A L \$22,648.68 The original Estimate is attached as "Exhibit B", and is made part hereof. Upon full consideration of the proposed payment, Director Bewley made a motion that the Estimate as presented do be approved; and that the payment be authorized and made. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

7. Thereupon there was presented by Director Stripling a letter proposed to be executed by Director C. A. Hickman, in the name of the District, addressed to C. E. Cunningham, which letter should constitute evidence of the agreement of the District to convey to Mr. Cunningham the lands which might prove to be not needed by the District. Copy of said letter is attached to these minutes as "Exhibit C", and is made part hereof. Director Stripling made a motion that the execution of the letter do be authorized; and that the original thereof be delivered to Mr. Cunningham. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. The motion was carried and it is so ordered.

8. Thereupon there was presented to the Directors for approval voucher for 62.50, showing that Ireland Hampton had paid out that amount for wages of Miss Jeanette Miller, as a supply stenographer for  $12\frac{1}{2}$ days, at the rate of 5.00 per day. Director Stripling made a motion that the account do be allowed and that the amount thereof be paid to Ireland Hampton. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

9. The account of Mr. Sidney L. Samuels, for \$33.59, to cover the cost of a trip to Austin for conference with the Attorney General of Texas was presented. Upon examination thereof Director Hickman made a motion that the account as presented do be allowed and paid. The motion was seconded by Director Stripling. The motion was carried and it is so ordered.

10. Thereupon there was presented to the Directors for examination a financial statement for the District to cover the transactions for the month of May. The Exhibit, showing in detail all accrued accounts payable, totaling \$28,561.98, is attached to these minutes as "Exhibit D", and is here referred to as part hereof. With said accounts were also presented the District vouchers Nos. 2105 to 2131, both inclusive (including Nos. 2127 and 2128, which were presented as cancelled). Also, included in this amount was the voucher No. 2129, for the sum \$22,648.68, to cover the Engineers' Estimate No. 4 of the Progress of the Work. After full consideration of each of the stated items, and the vouchers proposed to be issued to effect payment of the same. Director Hickman made a motion that the statement as presented do be approved; that the accounts as listed do be approved and ordered paid: further. that the several voucher checks as listed do be executed and delivered to the several persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.

There was no further business presented and the meeting was adjounned.

Gentlemen:

After driving considerable interlocking steel sheet piling at Eagle Mountain Dam, we found it necessary to have the Contractor make advance soundings, due to stratigraphic changes.

These soundings developed the need for slightly heavier piling from near Station 29 to near Station 40, a distance of about 1100 feet.

Present ispecified section weighs 30.9 lbs. per square foot (and costs us \$1.50 per square foot, or \$4.85 per pound, driven), for 40 ft. to 60 ft. lengths, and \$2.00 per sq. ft. (or \$6.47 per lb.) for 60 ft. to 100 ft. lengths.

The heavier piling weighs 34.2 lbs. per square foot, an excess of 3.3 lbs., which the Contractor agrees to furnish at 3 1/3¢ per pound, in place. This is merely a fair price for the material delivered on the job, nothing being added for driving.

The total extra-weight piling will be about 50,000 square feet which at 11¢ per square foot will amount to \$5,500.00.

With your approval, we will issue order for this extra material, today.
