MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH TEXAS, ON OCTOBER 6, 1930, AT 3 OC'LOCK P M

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of the Directors as follows, viz:

W. R. Bennett
W. K. Stripling
E. E. Bewley
C.A. Hickman
Joe B. Hogsett

At this time and place Director Bennett presided in his capacity as President, Director Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary, and the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1.

The minutes of the meeting of September 23rd, were read, approved and ordered of record.

2.

Each Director announced that he had made full examination of the report of Pitner & Adams, general auditors for the District, covering the period from January 1st,1930 to August 31st, 1930, both inclusive. It was the sense of the Directors that the auditors did not demand any specific action be taken and that the same should be received and filed as a permanent record of this District. It was so ordered. Said original report of the auditors is attached to these minutes as "Exhibit A", and is hereby made part hereof.

3.

There was brought to the attention of the Directors a letter from the TrinityFarm Construction Company, Inc., in which they state that they have satisfied the claims of A. E. Want & Company and Nash Hardware Company against H. H.Lemon, a sub-contractor in default. There was also exhibited the letter of McGowan & McGowan, attorneys for the two stated claimants, in which they acknowledge full satisfaction of the claims and authorize this District to release the indemnity bonds formally given by TrinityFarm Construction Company, Inc., on which the American Surety Company appeared as Surety. It was the sense of the Directors that the two stated bonds should be released subject only to confirmation of satisfaction of the debts of A.E. Want & Company and Nash Hardware Company, which confirmation might be either by telephone or letter: It was so ordered. Mr. Wardlaw, of A. E. Want & Company, gave telephone advice that their cliam had been satisfied and authorized the release of their bond. Mr. Singleton. of Nash Hardware Company, gave telephone advice that their claim had been satisfied in full and authorized release of the bond to secure them.

4.

There appeared before the Board, Mr. C. E. Farmer and three other persons representing the Trades Assembly of Ft. Worth, and made a presentation

of matters as follows:

- (a) They claimed that there were rumors that the contractors were not using local materials: as to this they did not present any specific instance.
- (b) They stated that while they were not able to say that the contractors were not using local skilled labor that they did know that no local carpenter had been put on the work.
- (c) Mr. C. E.Farmer particularly addressed himself as to whether or not the District had the power to control the conditions under which the land was being cleared and the compensation whichwas being made to persons engaged in that work. He being advised of the law controlling the Board, and after examining the exact contract under which the work was done, advised his fellow committeemen that the Directors of the District were helpless in the matter and could not be charged with any blame concerning either the conditions of the labor or the compensation being made for clearing. The committee were advised that the Directors of the District were awaiting a general statement by the contractors concerning this matter, and it was agreed that as soon as a written statement had been received by the Directors, the statement would be released for publication.

5.

#### REPORT OF LAND COMMITTEE

- (a) The land committee presented for confirmation a lease contract between the District and Dickey Bros. & J. M. Rickles, whereby the District was to lease to them approximately 4161 acres of the land out of the Rominger Ranch for the purpose of grazing, the lease to expire on December 1st, 1931. This lease covers only so much of said land as is situated at 830 feet or more above mean sea level; it also excepts from lease that part of the land required for construction of the Berkshire Levee together with all necessary waste and borrow grounds; the lease provided further that the contractors might use water from the wells located on the leased land, and contained the standard conditions relating to the lessees assuming all risks incident to the progress of the District's works. The consideration for said lease was the sum, Three Thousand Three Hundred (\$3,300.00) Dollars, reported to have been paid in cash now in deposit in the District's funds. The signed lease is in the District's records and is here referred to as a part hereof. There was full consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion that the stated lease be confirmed as the act and deed of this District: This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon vote being taken the motion was carried and it is so ordered.
- (b) The proposal of R. L. Morris to lease such portions of the Morrow, Jacob Lyda and Ben & Chas. Lyda lands, as lie at or above 830 feet above mean sea level, to expire January 31st, 1930, and also to purchase the improvements on parts of said land which lie at an elevation lower than 830 feet above sea level, for the consideration of Three Hundred Fifty (\$350.00) Dollars, to be paid in advance. It was the sense of the Directors to say to Mr. Morris that the District would not lease any part of the stated lands but that the District will sell the improvements located upon said lands for the stated consideration, provided the purchaser will remove said improvements

from said land with such dispatch as would prevent any possible claims to grow out of the progress of the District's work.

6.

There was presented the monthly statement of the financial condition of the District, together with a list of the voucher-checks proposed to be issued to cover sums now due and payable by the District, which voucher-checks bore the serial numbers 2229 to 2247, both inclusive. The said itemized statement is attached to these minutes as "Exhibit A", and is hereby made part hereof. There was an examination of each of the accounts upon which said voucher-checks were based and as well an examination of the said voucher-checks, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion that each of the claims payable as stated do be approved as an obligation by this District: Further that the presented voucher-checks described do be executed and that the same be delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same, upon condition, however, that this District receive proper acquitance concerning each claim. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

7.

There was presented to the Directors the engineer's estimate of the progress of the work, Number 8. Said estimate together with the supporting data is attached to these minutes as "Exhibit B", and is made part hereof. This estimate showed the amount to be due the contractors as of October 6,1930, the total sum, \$179,841.38. There was presented with the estimate the District's voucher-check No. 2248 for the stated sum of \$179,841.38. There was a full examination of this estimate, together with a full explanation by Mr. Nichols of the engineers. Thereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that the estimate as presented do be approved as an obligation due and payable by the District; further that said Voucher-check No. 2248 do be executed and delivered to the contractors in full satisfaction of the estimate as presented. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

8.

There was presented to the Directors the bill of Miss Clara Lagow for the sum of \$8.00 to cover stenographic work done on Sunday, October 5th,

1

1930. Director Hogsett made a motion that the claim as stated be allowed and that the District's Voucher-check No. 2249 do be executed and delivered to Miss Lagow in payment of this claim. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.


