MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE ON OCTOBER 9, 1931, AT 2 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of all directors as follows, viz:

W. R. Bennett E. E. Bewley W. K. Stripling C. A. Hickman

Joe B. Hogsett

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

W. R. Bennett acted in his capacity as President; W. K. Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

1.

Minutes of the Called Meeting held on Septembr 28, 1931, were read, approved and ordered of record.

2.

Attached to these Minutes, as "Exhibit A," is a statement of the Financial Condition of this District as of October 9, 1931. This shows checks authorized and issued since September 8, 1931, Nos. 2617 and 2618, for the sum \$13.92. This also shows proposed voucher checks to cover sums now due and payable by the District, consecutive numbers 2619 to 2641, both inclusive, for the total sum \$129,276.75:

(a) Upon consideration of proposed voucher checks numbers 2619 to 2635, together with the data to support the same, for the total sum \$1705.92, Director Hogsett made a motion that the accounts for which said checks Nos. 2619 to 2635, inclusive, are proposed to be issued, do be approved and that said voucher checks do be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

- (b) Thereupon came on for consideration the Engineers' Estimate No. 20, showing the amount due and payable to the Contractors as of October 5, 1931.

 This Estimate was for the total sum \$103,669.55, being:
 - \$ 71,415.53 accrued on the Eagle Mountain Reservoir, and
 - \$ 32,254.02 accrued on the Bridgeport Reservoir.

Said Estimate, together with the data to support the same, is attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B," and the same here is referred to as part hereof. There was full consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion that said Estimate do be approved and that the District's Voucher Check No. 2640, payable to the Contractors, for the sum \$103,669.55, do be issued, and delivered to the Contractors, as a payment on account and as an advance of working capital, and subject to any exceptions heretofore, or hereafter to be, made by this District. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a wote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

- (c) The Engineers presented their statement of the amount due and payable to them, being their Estimate No. 25, for the stated sum \$12,715.10. Said Estimate was accompanied by the request that the Engineers be paid \$6,000.00 on account. Said Estimate No. 25, together with the letter, is attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit C." Upon examination of this matter, Director Stripling made a motion that said request do be granted, and that the District's Voucher Check No. 2641, payable to Hawley and Freese, for the sum \$6,000.00, do be issued and delivered to them as a payment on account. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.
- (d) There was presented the agreed settlement between this District and R. R. Harris, whereby the District is to make compensation to him, for htat

part of the telephone system which will be destroyed by reason of the construction and maintenance of the Eagle Mountain Reservoir. This contract of settlement was accompanied by the District's proposed check No. 2636, payable to R. R. Harris, for the sum \$500.00. Director Bewley made a motion that the settlement be now consummated and that the District's Voucher Check No. 2636 do be issued and delivered to R. R. Harris, upon condition that he deliver to the District written acquittance of liability as heretofore agreed upon. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken, the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

(e) There were presented to the Directors for execution proposed Voucher
Checks to be given in consummation of the purchase of the land, and easement upon
land, for the Bridgeport Reservoir, to be conveyed to the District by C. V. Keeter.
Said checks are as follows:

No. 2637, payable to C. V. Keeter (Purchase of First Tract) \$ 5085.29

No. 2638, payable to C. V. Keeter (Purchase of Second Tract) 5648.29

No. 2639, payable to the Federal Land Bank of Houston, Texas, (to discharge a lien on the First Tract to be conveyed by C. V. Keeter, and to be charged to him.)

THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF SAID CHECKS IS: \$ 17401.28,

which represents the full consideration (less 75% for recording fees) to be paid by the District to Mr. C. V. Keeter. Said proposal was accompanied by the certificate of the Engineers as to the necessity for the District to have said land, and easements upon land, and also was accompanied by the certificate of the Attorneys of the District as to the validity of title. There was full consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that said checks Nos. 2637, 2638 and 2639 do be approved, issued and delivered, upon condition, however, that the District do be actually invested with valid title to the lands and easements des-

cribed in the contract between the District and C. V. Keeter. This motion was seconded by Director Bewley. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

3.

Director Hickman presented for consideration a proposed contract for the purchase of land by the District from Nellie R. Carroll.

There was full discussion of this matter, whereupon Director Hickman made a motion that said contract, as presented, do be approved and executed in behalf of the District in the usual manner. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

4.

In keeping with the prior agreement, Messrs. J. R. Lowry, Bert A. Tolbert and J. D. Wells (in their capacity as Supervisors of the Fort Worth Levee District), and Mr. Geo. Polk (in his capacity as Attorney for the Levee District), appeared for the purpose of discussing the matter of a proposed agreement, whereby this District might proceed with the work of increasing the capacity of the levees in the City of Fort Worth, in accordance with the plans adopted by this District on July 29, 1927.

President Bennett called attention to the fact that this District in the Spring of 1930 had sought to reach an agreement with the Levee District which would permit the Levee work to proceed; further, that on August 4, 1930, the Directors of this District had presented to the Supervisors of the Levee District specific contract, to be executed as between this District and the Levee District, whereby this District might be enabled to proceed with the Levee work. He further called attention to the fact that on April 30, 1931,

this District had addressed a letter to the Levee District, in which the readiness of this District to proceed with work on the levee was recited, and urging the Levee District to promptly take such action as would permit the work to be accomplished. He further stated that the Directors of this District realize the flood hazard which exists and will exist until the proposed work on the levee is actually done. He stated that the Directors of this District are not willing to again take the responsibility for the hazard and that they therefore now/urge that there be no further avoidable delay.

Thereupon Mr. Polk, in behalf of the Supervisors of the Levee District, made a statement in substance as follows:

That those tax payers bearing the heavy burden incident to the old levee tax desired at this time to be relieved of that tax and to have the same distributed over the entire city of Fort Worth, in a manner to conform to the benefits which the levee affords to the entire city. That in the opinion of the Levee Board the spread of this tax can more readily be accomplished before the levees are improved than would be possible after they have been improved. After relating the hope held by the Levee District as to obtaining cooperation by the City, Mr. Polk stated that the Supervisors of the Levee District were of the opinion that within two or three weeks the Supervisors of the Levee District would be able to come to the Directors of this District with something definite. He stated that the officers of the Levee District fully appreciated the hazard which exists because of the inadequacy of the Levees and that they would do all in their power to amend the situation at the earliest time at which it might be done without sacrificing other considerations, which to the tax payers of the Levee District seemed very material.

No further business was presented and the meeting adjourned.
