MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE ON DECEMBER 15, 1931, AT 3 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of all Directors as follows, viz:

W. R. Bennett
E. E. Bewley
W. K. Stripling
C. A. Hickman
Joe B. Hogsett

Director W. R. Bennett presided in his capacity as President; Director W. K. Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this meeting the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1.

President Bennett stated that the object of the meeting was to consider the request of the District's Contractors for final payment to them for, and upon, completion of the District's Bridgeport Dam and appurtenant works, together with the clearing of lands, situated in that Reservoir site.

2.

Attached to these Minutes, as Exhibits, or herein referred to, as part hereof, will be found certain base data upon which the request for payment has been made, which are as follows, viz:

- (a) Letter of November 21, 1931, signed by the Contractors, directed to the District, giving advice that they have substantially completed the Bridgeport Work. Also recognizing their obligation to care for and maintain the Bermuda grass on the main dam and Berkshire Levee, during the twelve (12) months next to come.
- (b) Letter dated November 24, 1931, directed to the District, signed by Hawley and Freese, Engineers, in which they certify that they have examined the Bridgeport Works and that the same are fully completed under the terms of the contract, subject only to the contractual conditions relating to maintenance for twelve (12) months, and the obligation of the

Contractor to install the gates in the conduits of the Bridgeport Dam.

- (c) Letter directed to the District, dated November 24, 1931, signed Hawley and Freese, by John B. Hawley, certifying to the Board that the Contractor is now entitled to final settlement for the Bridge-port Works.
- (d) Certificate of Hawley and Freese, as Engineers, certifying to the Directors of the District the "Final Statement of the Value of all Work performed and material Furnished," under the terms of the contract between this District and the Contractor, as evidenced by the written contract of date February 4, 1930, and as shown by the Minutes of this District in Minute Book No. 10, pages 33 to 35, together with the Exhibit therein embraced.
- (@) Here referred to, as though part hereof, is that part of the General Conditions of the Agreement between the District and the Contractor, shown under "Addenda," as the same appears in Minute Book No. 10, of the District, between pages 34 and 35, which in the part here material, and in substance, is as follows:

"It is agreed that the Contractor will first complete the Reservoir known as the Bridgeport Reservoir, together with its appurtenances. It is agreed that when the same has been completed and accepted by the Owner, that the Owner shall pay to the Contractor the Fifteen (15%) per cent. compensation therefor, which will have been reserved during the Progress of the Work. x x x x x It is provided, however, that this provision shall not be held to impair the obligation of the bond concerning the maintenance and repairs for one year after the completion of said Dam and its appurtenances."

(f) Certificate by Hawley and Freese that the delay in setting the Gates in the Bridgeport Conduits, and in filling the gap in the Berkshire levee, was due to orders by the District and was without fault on the part of the Contractor: Also recommending that the Contractor be expressly relieved of any obligation to fill the gap in the Berkshire Levee. Further, certifying that the Contractor is engaged in setting the gates in the Bridgeport South Conduit; that this work had hot been completed due to high water stages, and

that in the opinion of the Engineers, a retainage of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00)

Dollars will be sufficient to protect the District in the completion of the setting of these gates: Further, recommending that the Contractors should be relieved of any obligation to set the gates in the Bridgeport North Conduit.

- (g) Letters dated December 5, 1931, written by The State Board of Water Engineers and Daniel W. Mead, the District's Consulting Engineer, certifying to inspection of the Bridgeport Works, and the adequacy of same.
- (h) Letter of the Contractors, dated December 14th, 1931, verifying the correctness of the District's Engineers' Estimate "No. 22, Final," stating \$242,940.36 to be the sum now due and payable as full compensation for completion of the Bridgeport Works, as of December 5th, 1931: Also certifying that all sums accruing during progress of the work on the Bridgeport Works, as compensation to subcontractors, for equipment rentals, for materials and supplies and for labor, have been fully paid.
  - (i) District Auditors' report approving "Estimate No. 22, Final."

The Directors had advice of the Engineers, Auditor and Counsel for the District, to the effect that the Contractors were now entitled to payment of the balance due upon the Bridgeport Works, in the sum Two Hundred Forty Two Thousand Nine Hundred Forty and 36/100 (\$242,940.36) Dolkars, subject, however, to the following reservations, viz:

- (a) That the Contractors and the Surety upon their construction bond do be and remain obligated to the District to protect it against all claims or demands growing out of work done by subcontractors, the furnishing of equipment, the furnishing of materials and supplies and the furnishing of labor, any one or all.
- (b) That the contractors and the Surety on their construction bond, do be and remain bound to this District, to protect it against the obligation of the Contractor "to make alterations, repairs or replacements (any, or all) which may be necessary to remedy any defect in the materials furnished by, and,

or, work done by, the Contractor, and to care for and maintain the Bermuda sod on the Bridgeport Dam and the Berkshire Levee, for the period of one year next after the acceptance of the Bridgeport Works as completed.

- (c) The duty to finish installation of the gates in the Bridgeport South Conduit, as quickly as the same may be done.
- (d) That the Contractors and their Insurers do be and remain bound to protect the District against all lawful claims growing out of injury to work-men, property damage and injuries to persons other than employees, which may have been incident to the Construction of the Bridgeport Works.

There was full consideration of these matters, Whereupon Director Hogsett did move that certain findings of fact and resolutions based thereon do be adopted as the act and deed of the District, said findings of fact and resolutions being in words, figures and symbols, as follows, viz:

#### "FINDINGS OF FACT AND RESOLUTIONS BASED THEREON"

"1 - Trinityfarm Construction Company, Inc., McKenzie Construction
"Company, and Uvalde Construction Company, who collectively constitute the Con"tractor for this District under the terms of their contract, dated February 4,

"A. D. 1930, with the exceptions hereinafter noted, have well and truly complied
"with the terms of said contract, and the bond to secure the same, insofar as re"lates to the furnishing of equipment, of materials and the doing of work incident
"to the actual completion of the District's work referred to in said contract,

"paragraph (b), page 1, as "the Bridgeport Dam and appurtenances, and including,
"clearing, located in the valley of the West Fork of the Trinity River in Wise
"County, Texas, at a point about four miles Northwesterly from the business cen"ter of the city of Bridgeport," together with all extra work in connection there"with.

- 2 The exceptions hereinabove referred to are as follows, viz:
- "ed from filling the gap in the Berkshire Levee and from installing the gates in "the Bridgeport North Conduit; they desire to be released from the obligation to "fill said gap and to install the gates in said north conduit, and they hereby "are released from the obligation to fill the same.

- "in placing the gates in the south conduit of the Bridgeport Dam, but they
  "now are engaged in the work of actually placing said gates. They have con"sented that the District do retain estimated compensation for installing
  "said gates, in the sum Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars. The Engineers for
  "the District have advised that said sum Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars is
  "sufficient retainage to cover compensation for said installation of gates:
  "It is ordered that said retainage, later installation of said gates, and
  "the making of compensation therefor, do be ratified and approved.
- "effected), save as elsewhere herein is provided, shall operate to discharge
  "the Contractors and the American Surety Company of New York, as Surety on the
  "Construction Bond, from any other or further liability concerning said work,
  "but shall not operate to discharge the Contractors or the Surety on the bond
  "of the Contractors, from the contractual obligation to care for and maintain
  "the Bermuda sod on the Bridgeport Main Dam, and on the Berkshire Levee, for
  "the period of twelve (12) months next after this day. Further, the Contract"ors and said Surety shall not be relieved of obligation concerning the duty
  "of the Contractors, for the period of twelve months next after this day, to
  "make alterations, repairs, or replacements (any, or all), which may be neces"sary to remedy any defect in the materials furnished by, and, or, work done by
  "the Contractor. This stipulation, however, shall not be construed to cover
  "defects arising from errors in specifications or design: As to such errors,
  "there shall be no responsibility on the part of the Contractors or the Surety.
- "they have no outstanding liability, to any subcontractor, or to any furnisher "of equipment, or of materials, or of labor, arising or growing out of the construction of said Bridgeport Dam, the appurtenances thereto and the clearing "of the land in the Reservoir site: If any lawful claim, or claims, should be "made against this District by reason of any such outstanding obligation, the "Contractor and the American Surety Company of New York, as Surety on the Construction Bond, shall be and remain bound to save and hold this District harm-"less as against any such outstanding claim, or claims.

- "shall be and remain bound to hold this District harmless against any lawful "claim or demand growing out of injuries to employees, damage to property and, "or, injuries to any other persons other than employees, which may have been "incident to the construction of said Bridgeport Works.
- 3 WHEREFORE, this District having accepted said Bridgeport Works "as complete, subject only to the conditions subsequent which hereinbefore are "set forth, hereby does approve the Engineers! Final Estimate, showing the sum "Two Hundred Forty Two Thousand Nine Hundred Forty and 36/100 (\$242,940.36) as "being due and payable to the Contractors as the unpaid balance due to them "as of this date, for having completed said Bridgeport Works. It is further "ordered that the District do execute and deliver to the Contractor, the Dis-"trict's proposed Voucher Check No. 2699, for the sum Two Hundred Forty-Two "Thousand Nine Hundred Forty and 36/100 (\$242,940.36) Dollars, which, upon dee "livery and payment, shall constitute full and complete satisfaction of the "sum due to the Contractor for the completion of said work, save only such sum "as hereafter remains to be paid in satisfaction of compensation for the instal-"lation of the gates in the south conduit of the Bridgeport Main Dam, when the "same has been done and the cost thereof has been ascertained. It hereby is "declared that from and after this day the Contractor and said American Surety "Company of New York, as surety for the Contractor, shall have no responsibil-"ity for said Bridgeport Works, other than hereinbefore, and by said Construc-"tion Contract and Bond, is provided for: It, however, is provided that the "settlement hereby effected shall in no wise alter, diminish, or impair, any "obligation of the Contractor, of the Surety on the Construction Bond of the "Contractor, or of the Insurers of the Contractor, relating to that part of "the District's Work which is incident to the Construction of the District's "Eagle Mountain Dam and its appurtenant works: As to this, the obligation of "the Contractors, the Surety on the Construction Bond, and the Insurers for the "Contractor, shall be and remain the same as though the Contract related only "to said Eagle Mountain Dam as an independent undertaking: It is in all things "ordered."

The motion to adopt the foregoing "Findings of

Fact and Resolutions Based Thereon," was seconded by Director Bewley

Upon a vote being taken, Directors W. R. Bennett, E. E. Bewley, W. K. Stripling,

C. A. Hickman and Joe B. Hogsett voted for the motion, and no director voted

against the motion, whereupon said action was declared to be the act and deed

of this District.

No further business was presented and the meeting

Dear Sir:

Enclosed herein find certified copy of the Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Directors of this District, held on December 15, 1931, at 3 o'clock p. m., and authorizing payment to the Contractors for completion of the Bridgeport Works of this District. We on yesterday delived to the Contractors the District's Voucher Check No. 2699, for the sum Two Hundred Forty-Two Thousand Nine Bundred Forty and 36/100 (\$212,910.36) Dollars, which check has been this day paid. We regret that the American Surety Company of New York was not able to give cooperation by giving us written direction to make this payment.

For your information, we desire to state that we required each of the Contractor's affidavit that there were no outstanding claims, and as well required that they give written evidence of the payment of all major items which are known to have entered into the cost of the work. There were two exceptions to this, as follows viz: (a) McKenzie Comstruction Company and Uvalde Construction Company were indebted to Trinityfarm Sand and Gravel Company for haulings They furnished a written order of Trinityfarm Sand and Gravel Company, requesting us to pay in full, and agreeing to look to the contractors.

(b) Trinityfarm Construction Company was indebted to Barker Bros., as a subcontractor. They presented the written order of Barker Bros., requesting that we make final payment, and agreeing that they would look to the contractor entirely.

We will have in our office photostatic copies of many invoices and paid vouchers, issued by McKenzie Construction Company and Uvalde Construction Company, to cover the cost of cement, reinforcing steel, form lumber, gates, valves, pipe, and other like materials. These items are too numerous to list, but they are subject to your inspection in this office.

It was not possible to procure evidence concerning payment of labor, and of the many persons who were independent contractors in clearing land. The District, however, has had no notice of any claim whatever.

We feel that our search has been sufficiently thorough to reduce possible liability to a very low point.

If you require other information to complete your record, kindly advise us.



#### ATTENTION: MR. IRELAND HAMPTON

As you probably recall, Mr. C. W. Stevens of Bridgeport, is claiming certain damages resulting from clearing operations in Bridgeport basin and to one of his cows injured when fence enclosing his property was taken down.

The contractor did the clearing on Stevens tract on instructions from District's agent. We recognize some responsibility in effort to maintain fences intact during process of clearing operations. At the time Stevens' cow was injured, we advised Mr. Stevens that in the event this animal died, we would pay him full value of the loss; and further, that if the animal did not die we would reimburse him with whatever just expenses he had incurred, such as medicine.

We still stand ready to do this upon presentation of such itemized bill.

Several weeks ago, Mr. Lobdell, attorney for Stevens, called the writer over the phone from Decatur regarding this claim. At that time we advised Mr. Lobdell to render statement for medicine and any other expenses that Stevens claimed due to injuries to the cow. Further that we had agreed to pay such just claim in the beginning and still intend doing so. At the present writing, we have not heard further from Mr. Lobdell.
