MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE ON MARCH 7, 1932, AT 1:30 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence, or absence, of Directors as follows:

At this meeting E. E. Bewley, in the absence of President W. R. Bennett, presided in his capacity as Vice-President; and W. K. Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1.

Minutes were read, approved and ordered of record as follows, viz:

Minutes of February 2, 1932;

Minutes of February 10, 1932.

2.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit A," and as part hereof, is a statement of the condition of the Finances of the District as of February 10, 1932. This statement shows Voucher Check No. 2769, issued since last monthly payments, in the sum \$10.87. It also shows proposed voucher checks, consecutive numbers 2770 to 2798, both inclusive, for the total sum \$176,092.82, to cover sums now due and payable by the District.

There was consideration of proposed Voucher Checks Nos. 2770 to 2792, both inclusive, and Number 2797 (Numbers 2793, 2794, 2795, 2796 and 2798, being reserved for later consideration). There was examination of the accounts upon

which the stated checks were proposed to be issued, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion that each of the accounts do be approved for payment and that the Voucher Checks based thereon, as above listed, do be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

3.

Attached to these Minutes is "Exhibit B," the Engineer's Estimate of the Progress of the District's Work, Number 25, showing the sum now due and payable to the Contractor to be \$53,409.68. There was full examination of this Estimate, together with the data to support the same, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion that said Estimate do be approved for payment and that the District Voucher Check No. 2795, for the sum \$53,409.68, payable to the District's Contractors, do be approved, issued and delivered to them in payment of said Estimate, subject to all exceptions heretofore made, and all exceptions which hereafter may be made, to the account as between the District and the Contractors. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

4.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit C," is the Engineers' Estimate No. 30, claiming the balance due them as of this date for Engineering to be the sum \$4,060.46. The Engineers requested the payment of \$1,000.00 on account. There was examination of this account, whereupon Director Stripling moved that the same do be approved for payment and that the District's Voucher Check, No. 27%, payable to Hawley and Freese, for the sum \$1,000.00, do be issued and delivered to them as a payment on account, subject to all exceptions heretofore

made. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

5.

It was called to the attention of the Directors that it would be necessary to procure the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth to transfer to the Central Hanover Bank and Trust Company of New York, prior to March 15, 1932, the sum \$117,966.76, to cover interest coupons of the District maturing on that date. Further, that it would be necessary to procure the Continental National Bank to transfer to the Central Hanover Bank and Trust Company the sum \$117.97, to cover the handling charges involved in the payment of said coupons. There was consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Hickman made a motion that the District's Voucher Check No. 2798, payable to the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, for the sum \$117,966.76, do be issued and delivered to said Continental National Bank of Fort Worth. Further, that the District's Voucher Check No. 2793, payable to Continental National Bank to cover handling charge on interest coupons in the sum \$117.97, do be issued and delivered to said Continental National Bank. Further, that the Continental National Bank do be procured to transmit said stated funds to the Central Hanover Bank & Trust Company of New York, in time to make payment of the interest coupons maturing on March 15, 1932. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

There was called to the attention of the Directors the fact that it would be necessary for the District to issue its check, payable to the Fort Worth National Bank, to cover interest in advance on the loan this day negoti-

ated between the District and said Bank, being interest on \$30,000.00, for six months at the rate of 6% per annum. Upon consideration of this matter, Director Hogsett made a motion that the item be allowed for payment and that the District's Voucher Check No. 2794, payable to Fort Worth National Bank, in the sum \$900.00 do be issued and delivered to it in payment of said account. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit D," is Estimate of the Enginners, predicting the probable payments to the contractors up to such time as it may actually complete the work on the Eagle Mountain Dam.

7.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit E," is one of the reciprocal receipts showing pledge of collateral by the Continental National Bank to secure deposits of this District, executed on behalf of the Bank and the District. This reciprocal receipt describes United States Certificates of Indebtedness, Series A-1932, 3-1/8%, with August 1st, 1932 coupons attached, for the principal par sum \$100,000.00. Director Bewley in his capacity as Custodian of Pledges, reported that he had the stated securities in his possession and that in his opinion it was good and sufficient security for the additional deposit made by the District in said Bank. There was consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion that the acceptance of said securities into pledge do be ratified and confirmed as the act and deed of the District; further that one of said multiple reciprocal receipts do be attached to the bond of the Bank as District Depository, as "Exhibit No. 33," as is provided for in said bond. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

There was presented for consideration Report No. 2, covering sale of bonds by First National Company of Fort Worth, as one of the District's Fiscal Agents. It was ordered that said report be attached, as "Exhibit 2" to the original Fiscal Agency Contract, dated January 16, 1932, under which contract the sale was made. This contract appears in the Minutes of the District Book 22, page 29, to which reference here is made as part hereof. This report showed sale of eight (8) bonds of the District of series "D", as follows:

Serial Numbers 5026, 6059, 5070, 5101, 5102, 5103, 5292 and 5293, each for the par principal sum \$1,000.00, with coupon No. 1 attached. The total net consideration tendered to the District was \$7568.77. It further was brought to the attention of the Directors these facts:

It appeared that each and all of the bonds reported as sold, and as above listed, were bonds then in pledge with Continental National Bank of Fort Worth to secure the District's loan from that Bank and it had been necessary to withdraw said bonds from pledge to the Continental National Bank and to substitute therefor 8 bonds which have serial numbers as follows, viz:

5349, 5350, 5351, 5377, 5378, 5379, 5380, 5381, being for the principal par sum \$8,000.00.

Director Bewley reported that under authority of the Minutes of the Meeting of February 22, 1932, he had withdrawn from pledge the bonds sold had been as above listed; that the net proceeds for said bonds/paid to the District Depository and that he had substituted in pledge to the Continental National Bank, in lieu of the bonds so withdrawn from pledge the \$8,000.00 above listed. A list of the bonds so sold and withdrawn from pledge and a list of the bonds substituted in pledge is attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit F," and hereby

referred to as part hereof. There was full consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Hickman made a motion that the sale of said 8 bonds as reported do be approved, subject only to the proceeds thereof having been actually paid into the Continental National Bank; and further that the withdrawal of bonds and substitution of bonds, as hereinbefore stated, do be ratified and approved as the act and deed of the District. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

10.

Mr. M. C. Nichols made request of the Board of Directors that the District's Engineers be authorized to maintain on the District's land at Bridgeport Dam site, a resident Engineer's quarters. Thereupon Director Stripling made a motion that the request be granted until further notice be given Hawley & Freese, Engineers, to the contrary, by the Board of Directors. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

11.

Director Hickman presented a proposal from C. B. Reynolds for the purchase of windmill for \$25.00 off the submerged land of the Carter-Meacham Tract. Said proposal was accompanied by Check for \$25.00, payable to the order of this District, on the Stock Yards National Bank, signed "C. B. Reynolds." Director Hogsett made a motion that the proposal be accepted; the motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

It is agreed that the Bank may from time to time call for additional security of such kind and value as will be satisfactory to it, and on failure of us or any of us to comply with such request, or if in the judgment of said Bank the above security or any additions thereto or substitutes therefor or any part thereof shall have depreciated in value to the extent that this note is not by the Bank regarded as properly secured, then at the election of the Bank the above note shall become immediately due and payable. On and after maturity of said note either by its terms or by election as aforesaid, or on the non-payment at maturity thereof of any of the other liabilities to the Bank as mentioned above, the latter is hereby expressly authorized at any time and from time to time to sell, transfer and deliver the whole or any part of the above described securities and any additions and substitutes therefor, either at public or private sale, at the option of the Bank, without notice and with or without advertising the time or place of such sale, which shall be in the office of said Bank, and the Bank, if the highest bidder thereof, whether at public or private sale, is expressly authorized and permitted to become the purchaser of said collaterals or any part thereof at any such sale or sales; and in event of any sale or purchase hereunder, no matter by or to whom made, any and all equity or right of redemption, whether before or after such sale, is hereby expressly waived. We and each of us further agree that after deducting all costs and expenses of such sale, including ten per cent attorney's fees, and after the payment of the principal and interest due on this note, then the balance of the proceeds of such collaterals, if any, may be applied upon any other indebtedness of us or any of us to said Bank, whether due or not due, whether direct or contingent, and whether owing individually or in connection with others not parties hereto.

It is agreed that the payee may at the request of or by agreement with any party hereto or any endorser hereof accept in exchange other and different collaterals and securities for those above described or for any part thereof, and may take additional collaterals or securities, without consulting the others of us and without in any respect affecting our liability for the payment of this note or any other said indebtedness. It is further agreed that the payee shall not be held liable for loss or damage to me, us, or any of us on account of failure to present for payment or to protest or to sue upon or to collect any of the above described collaterals or any moneys due or that may become due thereon.

To further secure the payment of said note, demands or other indebtedness, said Bank is hereby authorized to at any time charge said note, demands or other indebtedness against the deposit account of the undersigned and each
