MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 12TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1932, AT 3 O'CLOCK P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of all Directors as follows, viz:

W. K. Stripling

C. A. Hickman

Joe B. Hogsett

President Bennett presided; Director Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1.

Minutes were read, approved and ordered of record as fol-

lows, viz:

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August 22, 1932, and

Memorandum of the Informal Meeting held by the Directors Bennett and Hogsett with Mr. Daniel W. Mead, Consulting Engineer for the District, on August 31, 1930 — It was ordered that this Memorandum be attached to the Minutes of this Meeting as "Exhibit A."

2.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B," and here referred to as part hereof, is an itemized statement of the condition of the District's Finances on September 12, 1932. Said Exhibit shows sums now due and payable and proposed for payment on this day, in the sum \$128,416.46. There was consideration of proposed Voucher Checks, Consecutive Numbers 2964 to 2983, both inclusive, together with the data to support the same, whereupon Director Hickman moved that the accounts, on which said proposed voucher checks were based, do be approved for payment and that said Voucher Checks do be executed and deliver-

ed to the persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

3.

The District's proposed Voucher Check No. 2984, payable to the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, for the sum \$127.98, was intended to procure the transmission of said sum by the Continental National Bank to the Central Hanover Bank and Trust Company of New York, to compensate it for handling and paying the District's bond coupons maturing on September 15, 1932: Proposed Voucher Check No. 2985, payable to Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, for the sum \$127,975.00, was intended to procure the Continental National Bank to remit to Central Hanover Bank and Trust Company of New York, as the District's Fiscal Agent, the said sum of money for the payment of the District's bond coupons maturing on September 15, 1932. Upon consideration of this matter, Director Hogsett made a motion that said two Voucher Checks do be issued and delivered to the Continental National Bank with instructions to it to remit said sum of money to the Central Hanover Bank and Trust Company of New York, for the above stated purposes. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

4.

Director Hogsett made a motion that the District conform to the recommendations of Mr. Daniel W. Mead, and Hawley and Freese, in the matter of abandoning the installation of a sluice gate in the East Conduit of

the Eagle Mountain Dam. Further, that the District do surrender and return to the Fort Worth Structural Steel Company its bid bond for the sum One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, and to Messrs. Phillips and Davies, their certified check for the sum One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

5.

Director Hogsett made a motion that all expenses incurred by the District in preserving proper condition of the earth work and the Bermuda grass on the Bridgeport Dam, whether heretofore incurred, or hereafter to be incurred, do be set up as a charge against the Contractors. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit C," is a request of the Continental National Bank as District Depository, dated August 23, 1932, to be permitted to withdraw from pledge bonds of this District for the par sum \$10,000.00, and to substitute in lieu thereof bonds of the United States in the par sum \$9,000.00. Attached to said exhibit is one of multiple reciprocal receipts executed by the Bank, and for the District by Director Bewley, as Custodian of Pledges. Reference is here made to said exhibit as part hereof. Director Bewley reported that he had approved the substitution of securities. There was consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that said substitution of securities do be approved, ratified and confirmed as the act and deed of the District. Further, that one of said recipro-

manner provided for in said bond. This motion was seconded by Director Hick-man. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

Attached to these Minutes as part hereof, and marked "Exhibit D," is a list of 22 bonds of the District which have heretofore been registered by the District, and so made payable to the registered owner instead of to bearer, as to principal only. Reference is here made to said exhibit for a specific description of said bonds and the owners thereof. Director Hogsett moved that the registration of said bonds do be ratified and and approved. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

7.

It was called to the attention of the Directors that Coupons Number 2, maturing September 15, 1932, were attached to 1,081 bonds of the District of "Series D," which now are unsold; that 84 bonds of said Series, having coupons Number 2 now attached, were owned and held by the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District. Director Hickman made a motion that coupons number 2, attached to said 1,081 bonds do be detached as of September 15, 1932, and produced for the Board of Directors for verification and cancellation. That the Coupons attached to said 84 bonds in the Interest and Sinking Fund do be clipped and sent forward by the District's Depository to the Central Hanover Bank & Trust Company of New York for payment on September 15, 1932. Further, that the amount so collected do be placed to the credit of the District's Interest and Sinking Fund. Further, that Directors Bewley and Hogsett do be requested to do any and all things necessary to

carry out the intent of this motion. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

8.

\$37.50 as consideration for the sale of a house formerly located on the land purchased by the District from Mr. Willoughby, and situated in the Bridge-port Reservoir basin. Director Stripling moved that said sale do be approved, ratified and confirmed as the act and deed of the District. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

9.

Report of Messrs. Pitner & Adams, dated August 22, 1932, is attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit E." Each of the Directors had been furnished a copy of said report and had examined the same. It was the sense of the Directors that the report should be received and filed; provided, however, that the Engineers for the District be requested to report to the Directors at their next meeting concerning Contractors' Estimate No. 28, approved as of June 9, 1932, Extra Work performed in August, 1931, for the sum

10.

Director Hickman brought to the attention of the Directors the fact that Mr. W. D. Scoggins has been the District's tenant on the land purchased by the District from Tom Parrish. He explained that in his opinion Mr. Scoggins should be requested to surrender the land at the expiratiom of

his present lease, and that he be advised that the District would not lease the land to him for a new term. Director Hogsett made a motion that the recommendation be approved and confirmed as the act and deed of the District. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

11.

There were presented to the Directors for approval expense accounts to cover money spent in service rendered to the District in the proceeding to Washington in the month of August, for the purpose of urging a loan to the District by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation.

Said accounts were examined, whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that each of said accounts be allowed and ordered paid at such time as the District might have funds available therefor. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

12.

It was brought to the attention of the Directors that the County Auditor of Tarrant County would soon begin to work on his audit of tax collections and payments, for the taxing year 1931, and that it was necessary that he be now advised as to whether the District would desire its tax matters for the taxing year 1931, so audited. Director Bewley made a motion that the

District request such an audit and that the cost thereof do be authorized.

This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

13.

There was brought to the attention of the Directors the result of an informal conference held by Director Bennett and Director Stripling, with Mr. W. U. Blocker, M. D. Tulley, W. S. Blocker, C. B. Strain and J. A. Hunter, as a Committee from Chico, in Wise County. The matters presented were as follows:

- (a) The desire of the Committee to enlist the aid of the District in obtaining consent of the Commissioners' Court of Wise County,

  Texas, to provide a short community road, which would permit the

  Committee and other land owners similarly situated, to travel to

  Highway No. 39, instead of using the present road which was provided as a substitute for the old sand flat road.
- (b) To seek compensation from the District for the destruction of a neighborhood telephone line connecting with the Chico Exchange.
  It was the sense of the Directors that the District's Engineers be requested to proceed to the area in question, obtain the facts and report to this Board.

14.

President Bennett, for the purpose of establishing a record, stated that the Directors in the month of July, had given notice of reductions of salaries of employees of the District, to be effective on August 1, 1932, (which notice was given each interested person prior to said date) as follows:

Sidney L. Samuels and Ireland Hampton, as Attorneys for the	
District, from \$12,500.00 per year to	\$10,000.00
E. B. Cheatham, from \$3,000.00 per year to	2,400.00
Alice McConnell, from \$1,500.00 per year to	1,080.00

It also was explained that the Attorneys for the District had requested an opportunity to present their matter to the Board of Directors, without prejudice to the effective date of August 1, 1932. It was explained that this request had been granted. The Attorneys stated that due to the pressure of other matters they had not sufficiently considered their presentation and that they would desire additional time, which was granted.

No further business was presented and the meeting was ad-

### "EXHIBIT A" 9/12/32 - 3 P.M.

MEMORANDUM CONCERNING AN INFORMAL CONFERENCE HELD IN THE OFFICE OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE ON AUGUST 31, 1932, AT 3:30 P.M.

There were present: W. R. Bennett ( Members of the Board of Directors.

Daniel W. Mead, of Madison, Wisconsin, Consulting Engineer for the District.

S. W. Freese ( Of the Engineers for the District. Marvin C. Nichols )

S. L. Samuels ( Attorneys for the District. Ireland Hampton )

(All other Directors of the District were out of the City)

Mr. Mead was present for the purpose of making an oral report of his findings, based on an inspection of the Bridgeport and Eagle Mountain works. He, in the part here material, and in substance, reported:

- 1. That he was thoroughly satisfied with the quality of the work at both reservoirs; that he specially had inspected the rip rap on the Eagle Mountain Dam and was of the opinion that the District had a better job than had been specified.
- 2. The especially desired to make report on the proposal to omit the 48" gate valves in the East Conduit at the Eagle Mountain Dam and to substitute therefor a sluice gate to be in accordance with specifications already prepared and for which bids were in hand He recommended that this be not done, due to the high cost and his opinion that gate valves finally would be required. He then stated his reasons and gave his recommendations as follows:

- (a) The Rock Island railroad should be gotten out of the Bridgeport Reservoir on the earliest possible day, in order to permit full use of the Bridgeport Works for flood control.
- (b) That while he regarded the Eagle Mountain Dam as adequate to withstand water pressures which would occur when flood water was going over the spillway, and would have no fear for the safety of the dam, it was more prudent to subject to water pressures gradually and give the earth embankments more time for seasoning and solidification. He explained that gradual accumulation of water behind the dam aided in solidification, and that the increased lapse of time permitted the dam to become more free from water incorporated in it during construction.

#### R E C O M M E N D A T I O N S

- (1) He stated that rather than install the large sluice gate, he would prefer at this time to install two 5' x 10' sluice gates in the east Conduit. He explained that these were of larger capacity than would be required when both works were complete, and that the cost would probably be from \$8,000.00 to \$10,000.00, which was cheaper than the cost to install the large gate. He also explained that there were certain mechanical peculiarities of the 60" gate valves which made them not as desirable as the 48" gate valves. He therefore thought it desirable to adhere to the original plans, save that the 48" gate valves be installed at a time later than the completion of the other elements of the dam, and as a temporary provision he recommended:
- (2) That the District provide needles provided with stirrups on the upper end; that these needles probably should be 20 to 25 feet in length; that these needles be placed at an angle with a down stream inclination, just above the upstream end of the conduit. He explained that if it

was desired to make them absolutely water-tight, they could be covered with canvas on the upstream side, but he did not regard this as necessary; that they would sufficiently restrain the water without being canvased and without being tongue and grooved. He stated that these would be adequate to store water up to 60,000 or 70,000 acre feet. In case of moderate flood, the water would pass through the West Conduit, but if a flood of large proportions were to come, several or more of the needles could be pulled in order to permit the faster escape of water. He explained that the needles could be pulled by means of the stirrups on the upper end and the use of block and tackle. He stated that his preference for this plan was unqualified, even though there would be some additional cost to install the 48" gate valves after the gap in the Berkshire Levee at the Bridgeport Works had been closed.

He stated that he had no further specific recommendations to make, but that he and the District's Engineers were revising some calculations, upon which he expected to base a further study of the matter. He stated that in his opinion the figures already in hand would prove to be substantially correct, and that he therefore did not anticipate that he would care to make any change in his findings and recommendations. However, he stated when the revised calculations had been studied, he would make formal written report to the Board of Directors for the District.

Thereupon the meeting was adjourned.

### "EXHIBIT 9/12/32 - 3 P. M. Fort worth, Texas August 22nd 1932 To the Directors of Tarrant county water Control & Improvement Dist No 1, Fort Worth, Texas Gentlemen: We submit herewith the monthly audited statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements for the month of July and the year to date. As requested in the minutes we report the following unfinished business: The matter of establishing flood monuments and history was postponed indefinitely July 10th 1931. The minutes of May 4th 1931 request the opinion of attorneys as to the liability of the district engineers for payment of \$186.08 for making test pits on Berkshire levee, which was included by the contractors in extra work. Estimate #22 on Eagle Mountain Dam includes as extra work an item of \$239.11 for making foundation tests which might be changeable to the district engineers under their contract. The minutes of January 19th 1931, request that arrangements be made with the district engineers regarding their fees on residue land purchased and damage claim settlements. We are advised that no definite understanding has been reached on these

matters.

The matter of settlement with Tarrant County on highway matters is still pending.

Balance of \$100.00 on 1931 land rental due from J. I. Burgess has not been received as requested in the minutes of February 10th 1932.

There is some confusion in regard to taxes paid in January on Jack County land. This is being taken up with the Jack County Tax Collector for the necessary adjustment.

On July 7th 1931 check #2552 for \$509.89 was issued to Will Laird for balance on 179.87 acres of land in fee and 49.14 acres easement. This check has not been paid and is on hand in your office, due to faulty title on several acres of this land, although you have a recorded deed to the property. It seem that he is making no progress toward getting the matter closed up.

As requested we have examined the audit report made by the County Auditor on tax collections for the year 1930 and find the district received the amount collected. However, the report shows that the Tax Collector is due the district \$114.43 for errors as listed on page 12 of the report.

Contractors estimate #28 approved June 9th 1932 in-cluded \$498.99 for extra work performed in August 1931. Approval of this item was withheld pending an explanation of it by the district engineers.
