MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 8TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1933, AT 4 P. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of all Directors as follows:

W. R. Bennett

E. E. Bewley

W. K. Stripling

C. A. Hickman

Joe B. Hogsett

President Bennett presided; W. K. Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit A," is a letter of this District, executed by the contractors for the District, giving instruction concerning the payment of the sum \$102,779. Reference is made to said letter as part hereof. There was consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that the District's Voucher Check #3301, payable to the contractors, for the sum \$65,311.58, do be drawn on the District's R. F. C. Special Fund; that the same be executed and delivered to the contractors; further, that the District's Voucher Check #3300, payable to Fort Worth National Bank, Assignee of the contractors, for the sum \$37,467.42, do be drawn on the District's R. F. C. Special Fund, be executed and delivered to the Fort Worth National Bank, in its capacity as assignee. Director Bewley seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B," is a statement of the Engineers' Accrued fees, together with a letter explanatory thereof. Said exhibit is here referred to as part hereof. Upon consideration of this matter, Director Bewley made a motion that the District's proposed voucher check, payable to Hawley and Freese, for the sum \$5750.00, drawn on the District's R. F. C. Special fund do be executed and delivered to the payees therein as a payment on account. Director Hogsett seconded the adoptiom of this motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

3.

There was presented to the Directors for allowance, claim of the contractors for the sum \$279/90, growing out of the money retained by the District at the time of final acceptance of the Bridgeport works. It appeared that this money had been retained to insure that the contractors would actually sod certain parts of the earthen embankment which had not been sodded at the time of final acceptance. Upon examination of the facts Director Bewley moved that the District issue its voucher check No. 3303, payable to the contractors, for the sum \$279.90, drawn on the District's Construction Fund, and that the same be delivered to the contractors in payment of said claim. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

4.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit C" is a letter written by Hawley and Freese, as Engineers for the District, dated August 7, 1933, wherein they give advice to the Directors concerning claims and counter claims

that should be considered by the District in effecting a final settlement of the accounts as between the District and its contractors. Reference here is made to said letter as part hereof. For brevity, reference hereinafter will be made to the item numbers used in said letter, under the respective headings "Bridgeport Dam", "Eagle Mountain Dam" and "General."

BRIDGEPORT DAM

- 1. It was the sense of the Directors that the stated claim of J. J.

 Boyd created no liability against the district and that the same should be
 disregarded. This conclusion was reached upon advice of counsel, which was
 based upon the fact that the claim grew out of an act of an independent
 contractor, and the further fact that the claimant had not asserted liability
 as against the district.
- 2. It was the sense of the Directors that the District should pay to the General Contractors \$100, for telephone wire and accessories used in the construction of the telephone line to the Bridgeport Dam.
- 3. Trinityfarm construction Company acknowledged its obligation to contribute \$150 to the sum of \$300, heretofore paid by the District to Wise County for its loss of its Hunt's Creek Bridge.
- 4. The District desired to have title to the two houses belonging to McKenzie-Uvalde Construction Company, which houses are situated on the dam site of Bridgeport Dam. The owners of the houses made a proposal that they would accept \$200.00, as full payment for said houses. It was the sense of the Directors that the proposal should be accepted and it was so ordered.
- 5. It was found that this item had been adjusted by prior issuance of the District's Voucher Check #3303.

6. Upon examination of this item, it was the sense of the Directors that the item of \$157.85 for removal of drift should be borne by the District. The contractors agreed that they should bear the sum \$141.05, for filling in washes on the main dam, at Bridgeport. It was the sense of the Directors that this item should be so adjusted and it was so ordered.

EAGLE MOUNTAIN DAM

- 1. Upon advice of counsel, it was the conclusion of the directors that the district had no liability to Mr. John I. Burgess, because of his claim made against Trinityfarm Construction Company and destruction of logs, grass, etc., and it was ordered that said item be disregarded for the purpose of this settlement.
- 2. It appeared that the District is now in possession of an indemnity bond for the sum \$1500.00, to protect the district against any liability because of controversy between Trinityfarm Construction Company and Messrs.

 Mitchell, Gartner & Walton. It was the sense of the Directors that this item be disregarded for the purpose of this settlement.
- 3. It was the sense of the Directors that this item should be disregarded, due to the fact that the District holds in escrow, money of the contractors adequate to protect the claim of Marathon Oil Company, in case it should ultimately establish its claim.
- 4. It was the sense of the Directors that this item be disregarded, due to the fact that the assignment to the Fort Worth National Bank was this day being satisfied by the delivery of the District's voucher check No. 3300.
- 5. Mr. Woodward, of Trinityfarm Construction Company, agreed that the house on the district's land at Eagle Mountain would be removed whenever the district required removal. It was the sense of the directors that remov-

al was not required at this time.

6. It was the sense of the Directors that the District should require removal of the dragline and other equipment situated at the Eagle Mountain Dam, and that the contractors should so be notified.

7 and 8. The sums represented in these items were material as between the district and Trinityfarm Construction Company. Mr. Woodward took the position that under the contract the expenditures represented the sums necessary to be expended by the district; that under the contract and bond for maintenance, the district was entitled to protection only in such cases as maintenance or replacements might become necessary by reason of defective material or workmanship, and that none of the expenditures had been made because of such defects. He therefore stated that his Company would refuse to recognize any liability whatever because of these items. Mr. Nichols of the District's Engineers, suggested that the year for maintenance under the contract had not yet expired and that it would not now be possible to fully state the account. It was the sense of the directors that consideration of these items should be deferred for later consideration without prejudice to the rights of either party and it was so ordered.

9. Upon consideration of this item and the recommendation of the district's Engineers, Director Hogsett made a motion that the District do pay to Trinityfarm Construction Company \$300.00, as rental on pipe line and other equipment, now being used by the district in watering grass on the Eagle Mountain main dam, said consideration to cover the time for one year from the date upon which use of the equipment began. This motion was seconded by Director Bewley. On a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

GENERAL

- 1. The Engineers and Attorneys for the district stated that they had made examination of the vouchers showing that Jacobson, Sweeney and Jacobson had actually paid all claims against them, as listed for settlement made between the District with the contractors on December 20% 1932. Further, that no work had been done or material furnished since the settlement of December 20, 1932; that at said time the district had received satisfactory affidavits by the contractors, showing in full outstanding claims; that in their opinion it was not now necessary to require other affidavits. It was the sense of the Directors that no further affidavits be required and it was so ordered.
 - 2. This item was disregarded as having no present value.
- 3. It was found that on December 20, 1932, the district had advice that the claim of Heitman & Co., for the sum \$1321.00, on its face, showed to have been barred at the time the same was filed. It was the sense of the directors that the same should be disregarded.
- 4. The contractors produced for examination by the directors documentary evidence that they had fully satisfied all claims of the sub-contractors, Jacobson, Sweeney, and Jacobson, and Barker Bros. It was the sense of the Directors that this be accepted as satisfactory proof.
- 5. Satisfactory proof of payment of claims by Jacobson, Sweeney and Jacobson, was produced. It was the sense of the Directors that the same should be received as satisfactory proof.

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.
