MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 22ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1933, AT 3:30 P. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence, or absence, of Directors as follows, viz:

President Bennett presided; W. K. Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary. At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1.

Minutes of Meetings were read, approved and ordered of record as follows, viz:

August 10, 1933, held at 3:30 P. M., September 12, 1933, held at 2 P. M., and September 13, 1933, held at 7:30 P. M.

2. 2

There was discussion, consideration and agreement upon the form of a petition to be addressed to Reconstruction Finance Corporation, and having respect to authority for the use of money now embraced in the District's "R. F. C. Special Fund." It was the sense of the Directors that upon the formulation of such a petition, the President of the District and the Secretary of the District, be requested to execute the same and transmit it to Washington: It was so ordered.

3.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit A," is a list of Interest Coupons, which were detached from certain bonds of this District which were unsold on September 15, 1933. Said Coupons were 140 in number, and all matured on September 15, 1933. All of said Coupons were presented to the Directors for verification as to the number and mutilation thereof. It appeared that each of said coupons had been mutilated so that the same could not be circulated as evidence of debt by this District, whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that the said detached and mutilated coupons do be presented to the independent Auditors for the district for verification and filed in the District's records. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

4.

Director Hickman, in his capacity as Chairman of the Land Committee, presented for approval a policy of Insurance, Numbered D-165394 of the United States Fire Insurance Company of New York, giving coverage of \$750.00 on the ranch house, and \$750.00 on the barn, situated on the District's land, which was purchased from C. O. & M. V. Rominger, and providing for the payment of \$55.50 as premium. Director Hickman made a motion that said policy be accepted and that the District do authorize the payment of \$55.50 to Messrs. Roberts & Rhea, who are agents for said Insurance Company. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

5.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B," is a letter of the District's Engineers, dated September 25, 1933, relating to a proposal that the District make application to the Federal Administrator, for a loan and grant adequate to permit the district to proceed with the execution of the district's plans with reference to the levee system situated inthe city of Fort Worth. Upon consideration of this matter, Director Hogsett made a motion that the Engineers and Attorneys for the District do be authorized to prepare an application to the District Administrator, in Fort Worth, Texas, and to do any and all things required for the proper prosecution of said application. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

There came to the attention of the Directors the fact that on September 7, 1933, the District had deposited in its Interest and Sinking Fund, checks of the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas, as District Depositary, for interest on daily balances from August 5, to August 25, 1933, as follows:

Cashier's Check No. 052770, being interest on daily balances

in the District's R. F. C. Special Fund \$ 80.69 Cashier's Check No. 052771, being interest on daily balances in the District's Rock Island Condemnation Deposit,

from August 19, 1933 to August 25, 1933\$ 24.65 TOTAL \$105.34

It appeared that prior Minutes of the district were silent as to this deposit; whereupon Director Hickman made a motion that said two deposits do be ratified and confirmed; further, that all subsequent accruals of interest on the district's Special deposits, which have grown, or may grow, out of the District's contract with Reconstruction Finance Corporation, when paid, do be credited to the District's Interest and Sinking Fund, without further order of the Directors. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.

Gentlemen:

In connection with the improvement of the levee system through the city of Fort Worth, it would appear advisable at this time for the District to make application to the Public Works Administration for funds with which to carry on the construction.

Under our interpretation of the National Industrial Recovery Act, the district will be eligible to receive direct grant on this improvement to the extent of 30% of the cost of the material and labor.

We are further informally advised that the Administration is seriously considering allocating to strictly Federal projects, all funds not allocated to other public bodies by January 1, 1934.

We wish to strongly urge the Directors to file an application for direct grant and purchase of bonds for the construction of this improvement at this time.
