MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 11TH DAY OF JUNE, 1934, 3:30 P.M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of all directors as follows, viz:

W. R. Bennett
E. E. Bewley
W. K. Stripling
C. A. Hickman
Joe B. Hogsett

At this meeting President Bennett presided; Directors Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, v i z :

1.

Minutes were read, approved and ordered of record as follows:

Called Meeting of May 14, 1934; Called Meeting of May 21, 1934; Called Meeting of May 29, 1934.

2.

Attached to these Minutes as exhibit "A" is statement of the financial condition of the district as of this day. This shows the check issued since last meeting for the sum \$252.08, and proposed voucher checks Nos. 3648 to 3680, for the aggregate sum \$1,954.77, which are proposed to be issued in payment of accounts due and payable by the district as of this day. There was examination of said voucher checks together with the data to support the same, whereupon director Stripling moved that each of the accounts on which said checks were based do be approved for payment; that said voucher checks do be executed and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Bewley. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

There was presented report of Messrs. Pitner & Adams as Independent Auditors for the district, of date May 22, 1934, covering the month of April and the year to date. Each of the directors had at a prior time received a true copy of said report and had examined the same. It was deemed the report required no action at this time and the same was ordered to be received and filed.

4.

Attached to these Minutes in folio as "Exhibit B" are four reciprocal receipts, which are proposed to become exhibits to the bond of Continental National Bank as the District Depositary. The receipt marked 21 shows the deposit of 11 bonds, Nos. 1290 to 1300, inclusive, of Fort Worth Independent School District, for the total par sum \$11,000.00; Receipt marked 22 shows pledge of 11 bonds, Nos. 1240 to 1250, inclusive, of Fort Worth Independent School District, for the total par sum \$11,000.00; Receipt marked 23 shows the withdrawal from pledge of certain U. S. Treasury notes of Series B-1937, for the total par sum \$70,000.00, and the substitution in pledge to the district of certain U. S. Treasury bonds of 1943-45, of the par value \$70,000.00. Receipt marked 24 shows the delivery into pledge of certain bonds of total par value \$72,000.00. Each of said receipts had been executed in behalf of the Continental National Bank (No. 21 by H. C. Burke, Jr., as Asst. Vice-Pres., and Nos. 22, 23 and 24 by H. H. Wilkinson, as President) and in behalf of the district by Director E. E. Bewley, as Custodian of Pledges for said District. Director Bewley stated that each of said transactions had been consummated and that he had actually received in to the possession of the district the bonds described by said reciprocal receipts as having been delivered to him. He thereupon moved that each of said transactions do be approved and confirmed as the act and deed of the district, to the same effect as though authorization had been made on the respective dates of said transactions. Director Hogsett seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

5.

Director Bewley explained that the facilities of the Fort Worth National Bank for the safe keeping of securities had become overtaxed and that the bank could not longer make available to the district the safe which had been in use by the district for the safe keeping of its securities.

This facility heretofore has been extended to the district without cost.

There was full consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that he, due to his almost constant absence from the city during business hours, be relieved of the duty as joint custodian of pledges and securities, and that Director Hickman do be substituted to act with Director Bewley as Custodian of said pledges and securities; further that, the Custodians of securities do be authorized and directed to rent from the Fort Worth National Bank one or more lock boxes, to have capacity as might be required, to safely keep the securities in the possession of the District. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

There was brought to the attention of the directors the fact that since October, 1933, the district has persistently pursued an effort to procure a bond for John Bourland, as Tax Collector for the district; that due to the fact that a Surety Company bond could not be procured, the

district for several months past, both orally and by writing, had requested Mr. Bourland to give a bond having personal sureties. Further that, Mr. Bourland had indicated orally that he was willing to give such a bond if the sureties could be had, but that he regarded it as not possible to procure them; that while he is willing to so state orally, he did not feel called upon to so state in writing, as had heretofore been requested of him. There was full consideration of this matter and it was the sense of the directors that there seemed to be nothing which the district could do to actually procure bond or to make a written record on the failure to procure such bond; further, that in the absence of such security the district should use all possible endeavor to have prompt settlement by Mr. Bourland in order to minimize, so far as possible, the amount of the district's money in his possession at any one time.

7.

Director Stripling presented to the directors request of Mr. W. U. Blocker, that he be permitted to cut from land purchased by the district from him, and situated at elevation lower than spillway level at the Bridgeport dam, such trees as might be required to make 500 to 600 fence posts. It was considered that this land ultimately would be required to be cleared and that the district would suffer no loss; provided only, that Mr. Blocker at the time of cutting his posts would gather and burn all residue timber in a clean and workmanlike manner. Upon motion of Director Stripling, seconded by Director Hogsett, an order was adopted to leave the granting or refusal of this request to the discretion of Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

There was presented to the directors for an allowance a claim of Mr. A. L. Culwell, Custodian at the Bridgeport Reservoir, to cover the cost of a horse used by him as Custodian, and the cost of gasoline and oil used by him in attending to the district's business, to cover the period from January 1, to May 31, 1934, for the total sum \$37.50. On examination of the request, Director Stripling moved that the request be granted and that the district's voucher check No. 3681, payable to the order of A. L. Culwell, for the sum \$37.50, do be issued and delivered to Mr. Culwell in payment of said account. Further, that from and after June 1st there do be paid to Mr. Culwell, to cover transportation charges found necessary in his work as Custodian of the Bridgeport reservoir, the sum \$7.50 per month. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

9.

Hawley & Freese, as Engineers for the District, requested payment on account of the sum \$2862.50, which was claimed to have accrued and be now due and payable under their contract with the district. Said account was referred to the Committee on Engineering for examination and recommendation.

10.

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.

Mr. W. R. Bennett, President, Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, Fort Worth, Texas.

Dear Sir:

After due consultation with your legal department and yourself, we caused to be constructed at the head of the flood channel known as "New River" in Wise County an earthen plug of wetted and rolled material, and two smaller plugs at other flood "side issues".

The total cost of the three structures was \$187.78, and they will serve to reestablish flow through the main channel of the river for some time to come and until a natural flood shall remove them.

Our original idea was to use "canvas dams" on the log jams, but the latter had been largely burned away, rendering this expedient impracticable.

One 48" gate at Bridgeport dam has been 3/4 open since July 1st, and two 48" gates at Eagle Mountain dam are discharging into Lake Worth, which is now spilling over into the river, cleansing it through the City. This spillover should continue another two or three days, after which we propose to close the Eagle Mountain gates and there accumulate water from Bridgeport for at least two weeks or until receiving further instructions from your Board.
