MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 7TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1934, AT 4 P. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence, or absence, of directors as follows:

PRESENT

E. E. Bewley
C. A. Hickman
Joe B. Hogsett

W. R. Bennett W. K. Stripling

In the absence of President Bennett, Director Bewley acted in his capacity as Vice-President; in the absence of Secretary Stripling, Director Hickman acted as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

1.

Minutes of the meeting of July 9, 1934, were read, approved and ordered of record.

2.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit A" is a statement of the financial condition of the district as of this day. This statement shows voucher checks numbers consecutive and inclusive, 3754 to 3760, for the total sum \$79.06, issued and delivered since the last meeting of the Board. It also shows proposed voucher checks consecutive and inclusive serial numbers 3761 to 3799, for the total sum \$2,664.36. There was examination of the data to support said proposed voucher checks and all of the same were found to be now due and payable, whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that the claims upon which said checks were based do be approved for payment and that said voucher checks

do be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same. Further that, it be noted in the record that Messrs. Burch & Woodruff had no accrual for specific services or expenses incurred during the month of July, 1934. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

3.

Directors Bewley and Hickman, as joint custodians of the security deposited in pledge by the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, as District Depositary, made report as follows: That in compliance with the Board's order entered on June 11, 1934, they had requested the Continental National Bank to send a representative to act jointly with them in removing the securities now held by the district from the safe in which the securities had been kept in the money vault of the Fort Worth National Bank to Lock Box No. 1324 in said Bank. That in pursuance of said request, the Bank had sent Mr. A. B. Davis to check the removal of these securities, in behalf of the Bank, and that all of said securities are now in the above designated Lock Box in said Fort Worth National Bank. It was the sense of the Directors that this action should be approved and confirmed and it was so ordered.

11.

Attached to these minutes as "Exhibit B" is a multiple reciprocal receipt numbered 28, dated July 21, 1934, executed in behalf of the Continental Bank by H. H. Wilkinson, as President; and for this district by E. E. Bewley, as Custodian of pledges. Said receipt specifically describes certain securities of the total par value \$66,000.00. Reference is here made

to said exhibit as part hereof. It was explained that this deposit of securities was made to secure additional deposits of taxes collected for the district and that in the opinion of Director Bewley the security gave adequate protection to the district. After an examination of the state of the district's balances, Director Hickman made a motion that said giving and taking into pledge of security described in said exhibit do be ratified and approved as the act and deed of the district as of the 21st day of July, 1934. Further that, one of said receipts do be attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B," and that the other copy of said receipt do be attached to the bond of the depositary bank as "Exhibit 28", as is provided for in said bond. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

5.

In the files of this district appears a letter to the district by John B. Hawley, dated August 7, 1934. With said letter were certain other letters which show the requirement that the district bear one-half of the expense of truck hire upon the work now being done at Eagle Mountain Dam through the use of labor provided by relief agencies without cost to the district. Major Hawley stated that this truck hire would probably accrue at the rate of \$30.00 to \$40.00 per week, and that it would be necessary that the payment be made weekly instead of monthly. His written communication suggested that if the employment of the trucks was authorized that he would make the weekly payment of payrolls and present monthly to the directors for reimbursement the accrued account, together with payrolls attached. Upon consideration of this matter, director Hogsett made a motion that the district do authorize the hiring of said trucks, and that

payment of the payrolls weekly by Major Hawley do likewise be authorized, and that the district hereafter monthly do reimburse Major Hawley for the payments made by him, subject only to the account being accompanied by the weekly payrolls actually covered by Major Hawley for the preceding month. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

There was presented to the directors for consideration the desire of the city of Bridgeport in Wise County, Texas, to have a contract by this district whereby that city might be furnished water for municipal uses by means of the release of water from Lake Bridgeport. This request was originally sent forth in a letter dated January 25, 1934, written to the district by Harry Hardy, as Mayor of Bridgeport, and reference here is made to said letter as part hereof. This letter states that the city would desire water not to exceed 300 acre feet per year, with a maximum daily requirement of 250,000 gallons. The letter desired to know if the water would be furnished, and, if so, upon what conditions. There was full consideration of this matter whereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that the district do tender to the city of Bridgeport a contract for the furnishing of water within the limits above stated, subject to approval of the district's attorneys and engineers as to the form of the contract, and the insertion therein of all such provisions as would fully protect the district. Further that, the stipulation as to the price to be paid for the water should be based on a preliminary estimate of the cost to furnish the same, with the further provision that the price to be charged be finally fixed at such a

sum as from actual experience might prove to be the actual cost of the water, be this sum either higher or lower than the original tentative estimate. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

7.

There was presented to the directors report of Messrs. Pitner and Adams, as Independent Auditors for the district, dated July 23, 1934, covering the month of June, 1934, and the year to date. Each of the directors had at a prior time received a copy of said report and was familiar with the contents thereof. It was the sense of the directors that the report required no action at this time and that the same should be received and filed: It was so ordered.

8.

There was presented to the directors the original voucher check number 3743, payable to Hobert Isarel, for the sum \$7.50, which had been mutilated and not paid for that reason. There was also presented check No. 3760, payable to Hobert Isarel, which had been issued and delivered to the payee in lieu of the prior check, under individual authorization of the directors. Upon examination of these matters it was the sense of the directors that the cancellation of check number 3743 and the issuance of check number 3760 should be ratified and approved as the act and deed of the district. It was so ordered.

9.

Director Hickman, in his capacity as a member of the Committee on Engineering, presented the request of Hawley and Freese, as Engineers for the district (under their contract with the district of date November 2,

1927, as approved by the board of directors of the district on that date, and as recorded in Minute Book Number Five of the district, page 148), dated August 4, 1934, showing a balance due the engineers of \$2,571.71. Director Fickman stated that all items on which the request was based were items which had accrued under the provisions of Section 2, page A-2 of Schedule A, which forms part of the contract between this district and Reconstruction Finance Corporation, and that payment of the accrual was subject to the provisions of subdivision (f) of said Section, which allocates the sum \$45,244.85 to the payment of "Engineering, Legal, and Miscellaneous" expense. The items on which said demand was based were as follows:

"Payment to contractors for work done subsequent to August 1, 1932 \$91,908.16 @ 2 % \$1,838.16 Rock Island Railway Right of Way land 128,538.00 @ 12 5,784.21 Carter & Meacham Const. Easements 8,251.65 @ 12 371.32 Plans and Specifications for uncompleted work on dams 41,000.00 @ 2 1,025.00 \$9,018.69 Amount Paid for Engineering out of RFC Funds 5,750.00

The Directors made examination of the data to support this request of the Engineers, and thereupon Director Hickman moved the adoption of a resolution, in words, figures and symbols, as follows, viz:

- "1. Whereas, Hawley and Freese, as the lawful and established Engineers for this district, under the terms of their contract of employment, stipulated for compensation as follows:
  - '(3) For engineering services to be rendered as above, the sum of four and one half per cent of the cost to the district of said works, payable as follows:

    (a) One per cent (1%) of the estimated cost upon completion and delivery of plans and specification for the works, less any payments which may be made during the progress of surveys and the drafting of plans and speci-

fications; (it being mutually understood that such partial payments will be made during the preparatory stages, upon estimates presented by second parties, approved by the Board of Directors of first party);

(b) One and one-half per cent (1½%) of the estimated cost of the works, upon award of contract or not to exceed 60 days after approval of plans by the Texas State Board of Water Engineers and

(c) Two per cent (2%) based upon "monthly estimates" and "final estimate" to contractors, during the construction period and upon final inspection of work; and upon land purchases as such purchases are made.

- "2. Whereas, under the terms of the contract between this district and Reconstruction Finance Corporation, and Schedule A thereto attached, the sum \$\pmu\_150.012.85\$ was to be applied only to payment for labor, material, engineering, legal and miscellaneous expense, which accrued on or after August 1, 1932; and
- "3. Whereas, it appears that the present request for payment made by the engineers grows out of the fact that on August 19, 1933 the district paid into a special deposit for the benefit of Chicago, Rock Island and Gulf Railway Company the sum \$257,076 to protect a judgment in condemnation of right of way land for the sum \$128,538.00; and
- "4. Whereas, of said sum \$128,538.00 has been irrevocably paid, insofar as this district is concerned, and now is subject to being taken into the possession of said Railway Company whenever it so elects; and
- "5. Whereas, said payment, as of this day, constitutes a mature accrual in favor of the engineers against this district, under the provisions of subdivision (c) of paragraph (3) of the contract between this district and the engineers; and
- "6. Whereas, the amount of money not otherwise allocated and now on deposit in the special fund of the district, under subdivision (f) of paragraph 2 of Schedule A (which forms part of the contract between this district and Reconstruction Finance Corporation), exceeds the sum of money now requested by the engineers:
- "7. NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved, as the act and deed of this district, that the request of the engineers for payment of the sum \$2,550.00 on account do be approved for payment out of the district's special fund hereinbefore designated; subject only, to authorization for such payment by Reconstruction Finance Corporation. Further that, when such authorization has been

received the district's voucher check therefor drawn against said special fund do be authorized for execution and delivery to said engineers as a payment upon said account: So be it ordered."

Director Hogsett seconded the motion to adopt said resolution as the act and deed of the district. Upon a vote being taken Directors Hickman, Hogsett, and Bewley voted for the motion, and no director voted against the same,

(Note: Engineers' Est. #38, )

whereupon said motion was declared to be adopted.(and R.F.C. approval of pay
(ment attached to these minutes.)

10.

Attached to these minutes as "Exhibit C" (in folio) is the estimate of the Tax Collector of Tarrant County, Texas, showing that he anticipates that the property valuation subject to the District tax for the year 1934 will be \$133,000,000.00; also, certain data showing the present financial condition of the district and the money requirements of the district for the balance of the year 1934 and the period up to October 1, 1935. There was full consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Hickman did present a resolution in words, figures and symbols, as follows, viz:

"BE IT RESOLVED, as the act and deed of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, that there do be levied, assessed and collected for the use and benefit of said District, taxes for the year 1934, which shall be at the rates hereinafter fixed, to be applied to each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the value of the property subject to the taxing power of this District for said year, as the same may be assessed, enrolled and equalized for said year. The rates for stated purposes, expressed in cents (\$) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of said values, shall be as follows, viz:

(a) For Interest and Sinking Fund purposes ..... \$ .31
(b) For Maintenance Fund purposes ..... .02
TOTAL LEVY FOR THE YEAR 1934 ..... \$ .33

Further it is ordered that the Secretary of this District do make proper certification of this levy to the Tax Assessor and to the Tax Collector for this District, in the manner provided for by Section 33 of Chapter 25 of the Acts of the 39th Legislature of Texas, Regular Session. It further is provided that

a duplicate of said certificate of Levy, bearing certificates of appropriate receipt and filing in the offices of the Tax Assessor and the Tax Collector for the District, do be procured and attached to these Minutes as part of "Exhibit C": IT IS SO ORDERED."

Upon the reading of said resolution, Director Hickman moved the adoption of the same as the act and deed of the District. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken all directors present voted for the motion and no director voted against the same. Thereupon the resolution was declared to have been adopted as the act and deed of this District.

11.

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.
