MINUTES OF A MONTHLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE, IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 11TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, A. D. 1935, AT 3:30 P. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of directors as follows, viz:

E. E. Bewley
W. K. Stripling
C. A. Hickman
Joe B. Hogsett
W. S. Cooke

Director Bewley presided in his capacity as Vice-President of the Board; Director Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary of the Board.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, viz:

Vice-President Bewley related that since the meeting held on January 15, 1935, by the Board of Directors of this District, death had removed from our midst Walter R. Bennett, President of our Board of Directors, creating a vacancy on the Board, and under and by virtue of the authority vested in the Board of Directors by law, a vacancy on the Board may be filled by appointment.

1.

Thereupon Director Stripling made a motion that the Board, under and by virtue of the authority vested in them by law, do appoint Mr. W. S. Cooke of Fort Worth, Texas, who is a person in all things qualified to act as a Director of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, to be and to serve as a Director for said District from this day until the Second Tuesday in January, 1936, or until his successor may have been chosen and may have qualified as provided by law; further that, the term of office so provided be hereby declared to be an appointment to fill the unexpired term of

former director W. R. Bennett. This motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken Directors E. E. Bewley, Joe B. Hogsett, W. K. Stripling and C. A. Hickman voted for the motion and no director voted against the motion. The motion was declared adopted and it is in all things so ordered.

2.

Thereupon Mr. W. S. Cooke did present his oath of office and his bond as a director, which, upon advice of the attorneys, were declared to be in conformity to the law and said bond executed by said W. S. Cooke, principal, and the Employers' Liability Assurance Corporation, Limited, as Surety, was found by the Directors to be a good and sufficient bond: Thereupon Director Stripling made a motion that said oath and bond do be accepted and approved, and that the same do be attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit A," which hereby is referred to as part hereof. Adoption of this motion was seconded by Director Hickman. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

3.

Director Hickman presented and moved the adoption of a resolution concerning the death of Walter R. Bennett, which was as follows:

"The record of this District would be incomplete without a memorial to the life and devotion to duty of Walter R. Bennett, long a member and President of this Board.

In a mortal world where death rules the final destiny of earth, he relinquished his hold upon this life on January 15, 1935, while yet in his middle years.

Reckoned in the months of the calendar his career had not passed the meridian when he quit his tasks and laid down his burdens, but in the sum of men's achievements he had already won success at a stage where others were still toiling for mere recognition.

He was innately honest with a spirit that scorned the petty arts of trickery and deceit. He was frank alike to friend and to foe, with a candor as natural to him as hunger or thirst. He had no dogma purely for Sunday, but an honesty of soul for every day wear, in season and out, for adversity as well as for fair weather.

He was abreast of his day, a reader and student, a citizen of the world, and he was graced with humor as well as with understanding. He was not self-ish with his thought, but as the possessor of a receptive mind he was ready to give the minted coin of his own ideas in a full and fair proportion in exchange for the plans of other men.

Constant and assiduous in his application to the problems of the District, he contributed his study and time without stint to the construction of the monumental works which will serve to prosper the fortunes and welfare of generations yet to come.

Therefore, Be It Resolved: That the Board of Directors of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One deplore the death of Walter R. Bennett as a grievous loss to the City in which he was born, to the State of which he was one of the foremost citizens, to the people of this District to whom his simple life and high clean standards afforded a pattern and guide for others to follow, and finally, but not least, to the loving family in which he excelled as husband and father, as breadwinner and as exemplar.

Be it further resolved: That a copy of this memorial be spread upon the minutes of the District for preservation in its archives, and copy be supplied to the family of the deceased."

Director Stripling seconded the motion to adopt the resolution. Upon a vote being taken all directors voted for the motion. The motion was carried and it was so ordered.

4.

The minutes of the meeting of January 15, 1935, were read, approved and ordered of record.

5.

Director Bewley, in his capacity as Custodian of Pledges made by the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, presented a reciprocal receipt dated January 31, 1935, properly executed, showing delivery into pledge of securities aggregating \$100,000.00 par value. Mr. Bewley stated that he actually received the securities described in the receipt and was in possession of

the same for the District; and that he desired to have confirmation of the transaction in the usual manner; whereupon Director Hickman made a motion that Director Bewley's action in this matter be approved and confirmed as the act and deed of the District, and to be effective as of January 31, 1935; further, that one of said reciprocal receipts be attached to the Minutes of this Meeting as "Exhibit B" and that another of said receipts do be attached to the depository bond of the Depository Bank, as "Exhibit No. 37," in conformity to the manner provided for in said bond. Adoption of this motion was seconded by Director Cooke. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

There was presented to the Directors a debit memorandum from Head,
Teas & Co., for \$109.73, for the annual premium on Hartford ABA #46486-Bank
Burglary & Robbery policy for the year ending January 30, 1936, covering
\$126,000 par value of the Unsold Series D Bonds of this District; said bonds
being now in the Safekeeping and Custody Division of the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas, for which Director Bewley holds the Continental
National Bank's official receipt. After discussion as to continuing this
policy in force, Director Hickman made a motion that the Hartford ABA #46486
Bank Burglary & Robbery Policy now in possession of Director Bewley, be by
him surrendered and returned to Head, Teas & Co., for cancellation; further,
that he as Custodian of pledges, remove the \$126,000.00 par value unsold
Series D Bonds of this District from the Safekeeping and Custody Division
of the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas, and place said
\$126,000.00 per value Unsold Series D Bonds of this District in the District's

Safety Deposit Box #1324, in the Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas. Director Stripling seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken, the motion carried and it was so ordered.

7.

Director Bewley presented five letters received by him from John B. Hawley, being:

- (a) A letter dated January 21, 1935, wherein he makes recommendation that certain work at Eagle Mountain Dam continue under the direction of Mr. R. A. Hunter, as foreman, with Mr. Riggs co-operating: After reading of this letter, Director Hogsett made a motion that the recommendation of Major Hawley be adopted. Director Stripling seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.
- (b) A letter dated January 21, 1935, estimating cost of deepening the "Pilot Channel" near head of "New River" in Wise County, and "plugging of the head of New River." After discussion of the matters referred to in this letter Director Hogsett made a motion that the Engineers make a study of the "New River area," submitting their views, plans, methods and estimate of the cost of eliminating the now existing hazard. Director Hickman seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.
- (c) A letter dated January 23, 1935, in which he concurred in Mr. Culwell's report to Attorney Hampton that it would be quite unwise to grant the request of Mr. Sampson, at least until he has had a topographic map made of all his land and sketches of the ditches, etd., he proposes to dig, on his land and to protect the Rominger land and the road. This letter was received and filed.
- (d) A letter dated February 11, 1935, recommending that the Engineers be authorized to proceed at once with the work of raising the "A frame" upon

which tackle for removing stop logs must be suspended, in order to continue conserving the water at Eagle Mountain Reservoir, the estimated cost of same being \$90.00, including labor and materials. Upon the reading of this letter Director Stripling made a motion that the Engineers' recommendation be immediately approved. Director Hogsett seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion carried and it was so ordered.

(d) A letter dated February 11, 1935, reporting increase in water level of Eagle Mountain and Bridgeport Lakes, and reporting that loam is being added to the slopes of both dams, when weather permits and "Relief Labor Forces" are available: Said letter was received and filed.

8.

Director Bewley then presented a letter dated February 11, 1935, from Hawley, Freese and Nichols, accompanied by a suggested inventory of work to be done by the District. Said letter is attached to these minutes as "Exhibit C." After discussion of the matter, Director Hogsett made a motion that the inventory to be submitted to the Public Works Administration should be re-written by the Engineers, so as to include the "New River Project," which should be given priority right on the inventory. Director Hickman seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

9.

There was presented to the Directors for consideration the report of Messrs. Pitner & Adams, Independent Auditors for the District, covering the period January 1, 1934, to December 31, 1934, both inclusive. Each of the Directors had received copy of said report and had made examination of same.

It was the opinion of the Directors that no further action was required at this time, and that the same should be received and filed as "Exhibit D" to these Minutes.

10.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit E" is a statement of the Finamcial Condition of the District as of this date: It also shows proposed voucher-checks #3983 to #4010, inclusive, for the aggregate sum \$3,872.63. There was examination of said proposed voucher checks, together with the data to support the same, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion that the presented accounts do be approved for payment and that said proposed voucher checks do be executed and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Cooke. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

11.

Director Hickman, upon behalf of the Land Committee, presented three proposals to lease land for the year 1935, as follows:

Director Hickman stated that he recommended the approval of each of these three proposals, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion that each and all three proposals for the leasing of the District's lands do be approved

for actual execution and consummation; subject, however, to these conditions, i. e., that the total consideration for each lease be paid to the District in timely manner, and that each of the intending lessess do enter into formal written contract for lease, in manner and form as required by the District. This motion was seconded by Director Cooke. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

12.

Vice-President Bewley then stated that at this time it would be proper to hold the annual election of officers and that nominations were in order for a President, Vice-President and Secretary:

Director Joe B. Hogsett moved that Director C. A. Hickman be chosen as President of the Board of Directors. This motion was seconded by Director W. K. Stripling. Upon a vote being taken, Directors Hogsett, Stripling, Bewley and Cooke voted for the motion.

Thereupon Director C. A. Hickman was declared to be the duly elected President of this Board of Directors and it is so ordered.

Director W. K. Stripling thereupon moved that Director E. E. Bewley do be elected as Vice-President of the Board of Directors. This motion was seconded by Director Joe B. Hogsett. Upon the motion being put to a vote, Directors Stripling, Hogsett, Cooke and Hickman voted for the motion. There-upon Director E. E. Bewley was declared to be the duly elected and qualified Vice-President of this Board of Directors: It was so ordered.

Director E. E. Bewley moved that Director W. K. Stripling do be elected as Secretary of the Board of Directors. This motion was seconded by Director Joe B. Hogsett. Upon the motion being put to a vote, Directors Bewley,

Hogsett, Hickman and Cooke voted for the motion. Thereupon Director Stripling was declared to have been duly elected Secretary of this Board of Directors:

It was so ordered.

13.

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.

S. COOKE to fill the vacancy created by the death the said W. R. Bennett: Said appointment was made to continue for the remainder of the unexpired term for which the said W. R. Bennett was elected:

NOW THEREFORE, I, W. S. COOKE, of Tarrant County, Texas, as principal, and EMPLOYERS' LIABILITY ASSURANCE CORPORATION, LTD., a corporation duly authorized by the laws of Texas to enter into contracts of indemnity, as surety, do hereby anknowledge ourselves bound and firmly held to pay to Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, its successors or assigns, the penal sum FIVE THOUS-AND (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS.

This obligation is, however, a bond, the condition whereof is that the said W. S. COOKE will well and truly perform the duties of a Director of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, in accordance with his oath of office and the laws of Texas defining said duties: A further condition is that the said W. S. COOKE will pay over to Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, all monies illegally paid to him out of the District funds, as voluntary payments or otherwise and that he will not vote, or give his consent, to pay out District funds except for lawful purposes: Further, that he will well and truly account to the District for all monies or property of the District which may come into his control as a Director of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One.

Upon fulfillment of the above defined conditions, this obligation shall become void; otherwise this obligation shall remain in full force and effect.

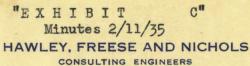

As per your request we have completed the regular annual audit of your books of account for the year ended December 31, 1934, and submit results of examination as shown by Exhibits and Schedules included herewith and listed in index, subject to comments following. This is in addition to the monthly audits of cash receipts and disbursements and the reports submitted thereon.

As your organization is of a municipal rather than commercial nature and as no operating departments are included as yet, we are submitting only the Balance Sheet and supporting schedules, Cash Receipts and Disbursements and other schedules of special interest.

Financial Condition

The assets and liabilities of the District as of December 31, 1934 are summarized and compared with the previous year as follows:

In checking the Tax Collectors record with your tax receipts we noticed that there was a difference of \$14,000.00 in remitting the collections for January 1934. Upon taking the matter up with the Collector's office the error was located and a check for the amount was immediately issued to the District. This was simply an error in deducting a partial payment of \$14,000.00 made the District, from both the January and the January supplement remittances, and would no doubt have been discovered when the Collector balanced his accounts for the year 1934. Both the January 1934 and the December 1934 collections have now been received by the District.

The amount of uncollected taxes is slightly more than your books show, due to the fact that the tax collector does not separate taxes from penalties and interest, both being credited against outstanding taxes. He further does not report tax collections by tax years, and this information, due to the system in use, can not be readily obtained from the County records. This rather complicates matters since 1932 when you began deviding your tax levies between the maintenance and interest and sinking funds. For example all taxes collected from October 1, 1933 to September 30, 1934 were distributed to the funds on the basis of your 1933 tax levy, and all taxes collected from October 1, 1934 to September 30, 1935 will likewise be distributed on the basis of your 1934 levy. This of course is not accurate as delinquent taxes for prior years are being collected all along, all of which prior to the 1932 levy belong to the sinking fund. We are advised by your attorney, Mr. Hampton, that this is not serious so long as the sinking fund is adequate and no one is harmed. The tax levy for 1934 was as follows:

The balance of your claim against the receiver of the Texas National Bank, \$1,888.21, is of doubtful value, although you may receive some further payments.

Your office furniture and fixtures having been depreciated down to \$574.52 were left at that figure without further depreciation.

Direct cost of projects to date is analyzed in Schedule 1. All items have been paid, there being no definitely determined unpaid items at this time.

We have examined deeds for land purchased, and payments to construction contractors and engineers, as well as those to others for damage claim settlements etc, as they were made from time to time.

The cost of engineering is built up from the cost of all prior years, and the total as shown in Schedule 1 represents all engineering cost to date, except of course the engineering fees for maintenance.

We inspected trust receipts of the Continental National Bank covering \$126,000.00 of unsold series 'D' Bonds.

Items carried under deferred charges are self explanatory, the bond discount being amortized on the basis of interest payments.

Liabilities

We attempted to set up all known liabilities that were definitely determined, although we made no special investigation to determine the amount of any liabilities, either actual or contingent, if any, not shown by your books or reported to us.

A record of bond maturities is included in Schedule 7. The bonds are annual serial on the level tax plan, and the \$6,374,000.00 issued and sold, with the balance of \$126,000.00 on hand unsold, make up the total authorized of \$6,500,000.00 \$41,000.00 of series 'A' and \$16,000.00 of series 'B' bonds have been paid off and retired.
