MINUTES OF A MONTHLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE, IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 8TH DAY OF AUGUST, A. D. 1935, 3:00 P. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence of all Directors as follows, viz:

C. A. Hickman
E. E. Bewley
W. K. Stripling
Joe B. Hogsett
W. S. Cooke

Also present:

Mr. G. T. Deibert, Real Estate and Taxation Agent, for the Trustees of the Chicago, Rock Island and Gulf Railway Company.

President Hickman presided; Director Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, v i z:

1.

Mr. G. T. Deibert called to the attention of the Directors the fact that there is approximately five miles of telephone wire strung on telegraph poles belonging to his company; that at some time in the past this wire served as a telephone line to what is known as the Rominger Ranch. He stated that the Railroad Company is now preparing to move their wires and poles from their present location and if it was the intention of the Directors of the District to maintain the telephone line, they would have their crew move the line at the same time they were moving their own lines; billing the District for the cost of moving the line.

Director Hickman stated that he had been informed that the telephone line to the Rominger Ranch had not been connected for use in several years. Mr. Deibert then stated if it was the intention of the District to abandon the telephone line, he would have the telephone line removed from the railroad's telegraph poles, without cost to the District. Thereupon Director Hogsett made a motion that the District do not assert any claim in the telephone line and that Mr. Deibert be so notified. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

2.

Mr. S. W. Freese, of the Engineers, was present and made oral request for authorization to have 4 or 5 core bore test holes made at the Bridge-port Dam at a total estimated cost of \$400.00 or \$500.00. Director Bewley made a motion that the authorization not to exceed \$500.00 be authorized; Director Hogsett seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion carried and it was so ordered.

3.

Mr. S. W. Freese also made oral request that the Engineers be authorized to procure paint and paint the fences at Eagle Mountain and Bridgeport Dams, the work to be done by the Custodian or with free labor. Director Hogsett made a motion that the request of the Engineers be granted. Director Stripling seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion carried and it was so ordered.

1 4.

Mr. J. P. Simpson, an attorney of Jacksboro, Texas, representing Ben Lyda, et al v. the District, in Cause No. 2803 in the District Court of Jack

County, Texas, appeared before the board and stated that he would accept the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars in full and complete payment, extinguishment and discharge of all and every claim and interest whatever on the part of the plaintiffs, jointly and severally, in the certain tract of land in Jack County, Texas, in above styled Cause, provided the \$200.00 be immediately paid him; upon the recommendation by the attorneys of the District that the sum of \$200.00 be paid, Director Cooke made a motion that the sum of \$200.00 be paid and the District's voucher-check No. \$4262 for \$200.00, payable to the order of J. P. Simpson, Attorney in Fact, do be issued and immediately delivered to Mr. Simpson. Director Bewley seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

5.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District as of this day. Said exhibit shows proposed voucher-checks #1229 to #1261, inclusive, for the sum aggregating \$2108.22 to cover accounts of the District now due and payable. Upon consideration of these voucher-checks and the data to support the same, Director Hogsett made a motion that said accounts do be approved for payment and that proposed voucher-checks #1229 to #1261, inclusive, do be executed and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same. This motion was seconded by Director Stripling. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

6.

Director Stripling brought to the attention of the Directors the fact that Mr. V. A. Vance of Azle, Texas, had been to see him several times regarding alleged damages to his land and crops caused by being overflowed by the waters from Eagle Mountain Lake.

Director Cooke made a motion that the claim of Mr. Vance be referred to the Land Committee with power to act. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken the motion was carried and it was so ordered.

7.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B" is the estimate of the Tax Assessor of Tarrant County, Texas, showing that he anticipates that the property valuation subject to the District tax for the year 1935 will be \$124,860,000.00; also, certain data showing the present financial condition of the district and the money requirements of the district up to October 1, 1936. There was full consideration of this matter, whereupon Director Cooke did present a resolution in words, figures and symbols, as follows, viz:

"BE IT RESOLVED, as the act and deed of Tarrant County Water Control and Improvement District Number One, that there do be levied, assessed and collected for the use and benefit of said District, taxes for the year 1935, which shall be at the rates hereinafter fixed, to be applied to each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the value of the property subject to the taxing power of this District for said year, as the same may be assessed, enrolled and equalized for said year. The rates for stated purposes, expressed in cents (\$\notings\$) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of said values, shall be as follows, viz:

Further it is ordered that the Secretary of this District do make proper certification of this levy to John Bourland, Tax Assessor and Collector for this District, in the manner provided for by Section 33 of Chapter 25 of the Acts of the 39th Legislature of Texas, Regular Session. It further is provided that a duplicate of said certificate of Levy, bearing certificate of appropriate receipt and filing in the office of the Tax Assesson and Collector for this District, do be procured and attached to these Minutes as part of "Exhibit B:" IT IS SO OR DERED."

Upon the reading of said resolution, Director Cooke moved the adoption of the

same as the act and deed of the District. This motion was seconded by Director Hogsett. Upon a vote being taken all directors voted for the motion and
no director voted against the same. Thereupon the resolution was declared to
have been adopted as the act and deed of this District.

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.
