MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE, IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 11TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1935, AT 3 P. M.

The call of the roll disclosed the presence, or absence, of Directors as follows:

At this meeting there were also present:

A. V. Sweeney, representing Butcher and Sweeney;

J. D. Johnson, representing Tarrant Construction Company; and

A. R. Martin, representing McKenzie Construction Company.

At this meeting C. A. Hickman, President, presided; W. K. Stripling acted in his capacity as Secretary.

At this time and place the following proceedings were had and done, v = z = z

1.

Minutes of the meeting of October 3, 1935, were read, approved and

ordered of record.

2.

In accordance with a prior notice to bidders for the work involved in placing the valves at the East Conduit at Eagle Mountain, there were presented to the Directors sealed bids, or proposals, as follows:

- (b) Tarrant Construction Company, of Fort
 Worth, a co-partnership, the sum\$ 3,025.00;

Each of said proposals was accompanied by a good faith check as required by the notice. The notice to bidders, and the detailed specifications, upon which said bids were based, appear as exhibits to the contract form to be used in completing the agreement between the District and the successful bidder: Reference is made thereto as part hereof.

Said sealed bids were opened and audibly read in the presence of all persons present. Thereupon the Directors had advice from John B. Hawley, as Engineer for the District, that, in his opinion, the stop log dam in place at the North end of the conduit would float to the top of the water at such time as the valves were in place and the pressure was equalized on both the up-stream and downstream sides of the dam; that, assuming this to be the case (he had no doubt that it was the case), the bid of Butcher and Sweeney would result in the lowest completed cost of the work. The said three proposals (they being the only proposals tendered to the District) are attached to the Minutes of this Meeting, in folio, as "Exhibit A," and reference here is made thereto as part hereof. Upon consideration of this matter, Director Hogsett moved that the contract be awarded to Messrs. Butcher and Sweeney; subject only to their being required to enter into contract and bond in a form satisfactory to the Engineers and attorneys for the District and the further requirement that the Construction Bond be a Surety Company bond for a sum not less than \$2,000.00, which bond would be subject to the approval of this Board of Directors as to sufficiency thereof. Further that, the good faith check of Messrs. Butcher and Sweeney for \$100.00 do be retained by the District until such time as they may have complied with the requirements as to the contract and bond.

Further that, the proposals and bids of Tarrant Construction Company and McKenzie Construction Company do be rejected, and that their good faith

checks do be instantly returned to them, respectively. Director Stripling seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken Directors Hickman, Stripling, Hogsett and Cooke, voted for the motion, and no director voted against the motion. The motion was carried by a statutory majority and it was so ordered.

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3.

Attached to these Minutes as "Exhibit B," is a statement of the financial condition of the District as of this day. This statement shows checks $\#_{13}$ 19 to $\#_{13}$ 77, for the aggregate sum \$13,395.23, authorized and issued since the last regular meeting. It also shows proposed voucher checks consecutive and inclusive serial numbers 4378 to 4417, for the aggregate sum \$1,939.01. There was consideration of these proposed voucher checks, together with the data to support the same, and it was found that each of said checks should be issued for the payment of sums now justly due and payable by the District, whereupon Director Stripling made a motion, seconded by Director Cooke, that said voucher checks do be executed and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive the same, in payment of the several accounts upon which said checks were based. The motion was carried and it was so ordered.

4.

Mr. William Merritt, Commissioner of Precinct No. 4 of Tarrant County, together with Mr. Kelley, Engineer for Tarrant County, appeared before the Board to present a request that this District do make available to the County money to be used by the County sufficient to construct a bridge over Briar Creek; construct an earthen embankment across the valley of Briar Creek and also to excavate a channel to relieve the sanded condition of Briar Creek from a point up-stream from the Bridge to the point where Briar Creek enters Eagle Mountain Lake. It was estimated that the cost of this work would approximate

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\$6.000.00. It was reported that the condition of the road at the particular point was such that the Federal Government would abandon rural mail service to a number of families who were living on lands contiguous to Eagle Mountain Lake, unless the road be promptly repaired. It further was reported that the County had no funds available for this purpose at this time. Commissioner Merritt reported that the road had value almost entirely confined to serving lands owned by the District and that the road likewise was important as a means of children reaching the Liberty School House. He further reported that in case the District would give aid to overcome a present financial stress, he would be able to, during the coming year, construct several "allweather" roads from the improved road from Azle to Boyd, leading to the East to the District's marginal land, and to a connection with the road upon which the repairs are sought. He stated that in his opinion these additional roads running from East to West would result in much increasing the useability and value of the District's marginal lands. He also made report of the fact that Mr. Marvin C. Nichols, of the District's Engineers, and Ireland Hampton, of the District's Attorneys, had made an inspection of the conditions at Briar Creek, jointly with him and Mr. Kelley. Mr. Nichols was not present, but Ireland Hampton made report that the inspection disclosed that the present condition of the road at Briar Creek was not due to the water level maintained in Lake Eagle Mountain; further that, in the opinion of the Engineer and himself, water level of 649 feet in Eagle Mountain probably could not affect the drainage at the point where the road in question crosses Briar Creek. Thereupon Commissioner Merritt insisted that the Directors give the matter further consideration and he and Mr. Kelley retired without any formal action

having been taken in the matter.

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.
