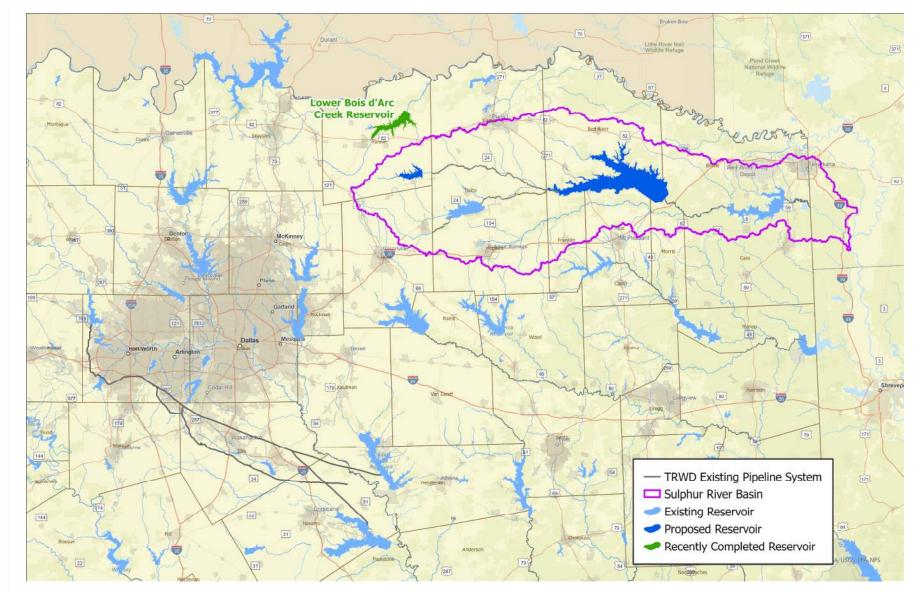

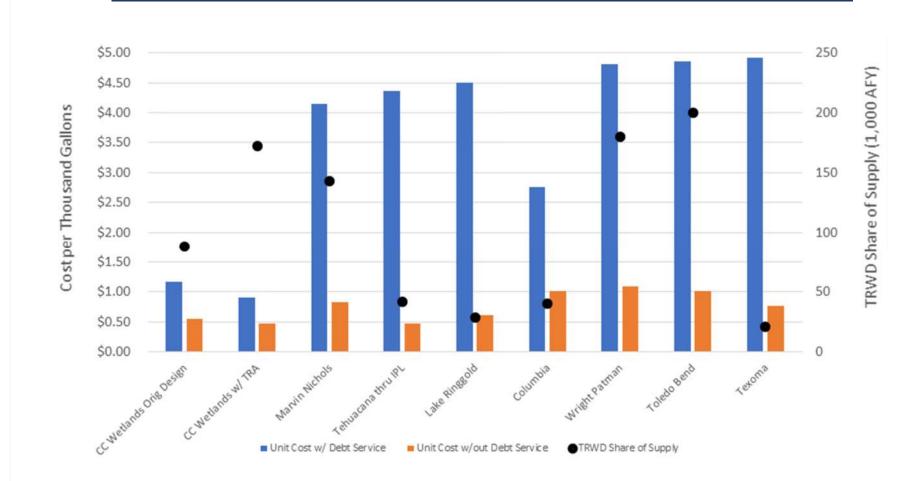

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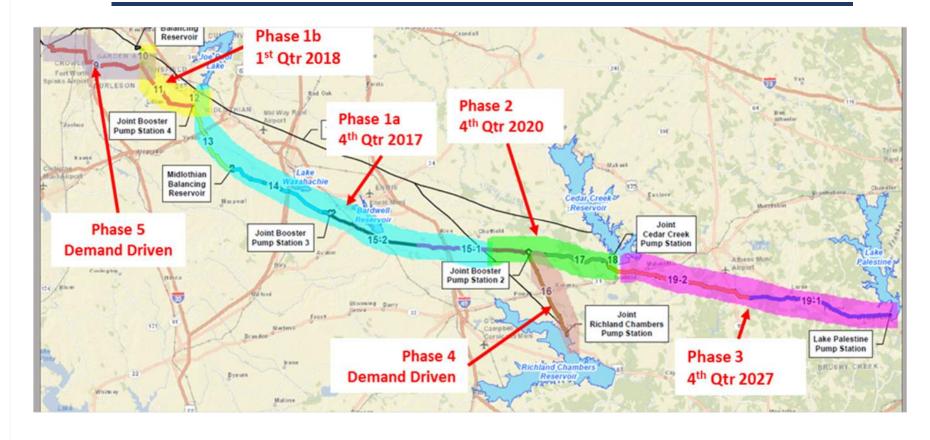

Integrated Pipeline Lake Palestine Pump Station



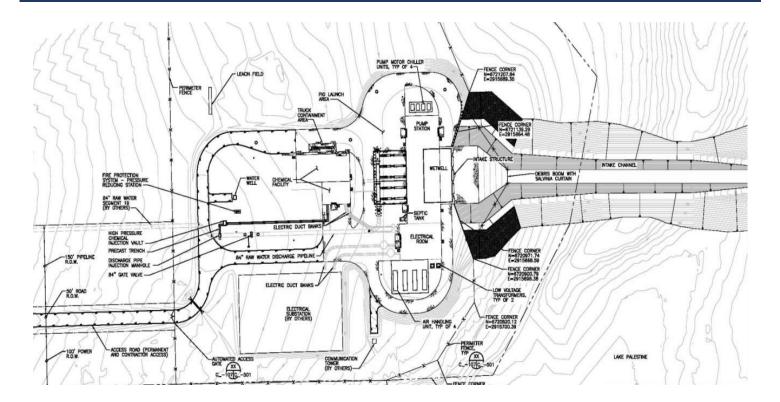
3-D model used to produce contract drawings reducing discipline and trade conflicts. The Cedar Creek and Palestine lake pump stations are split into two each construction contracts –

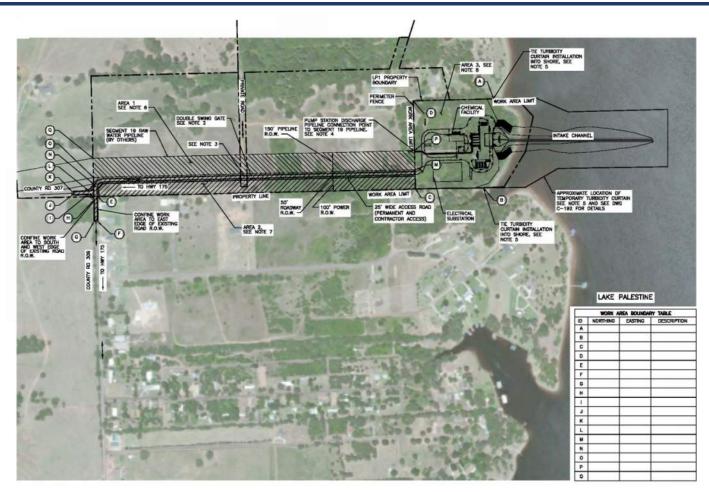


IPL Project Phase 3 – Lake Palestine Pump Station Site Plan

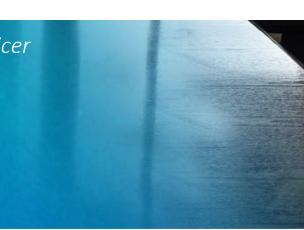

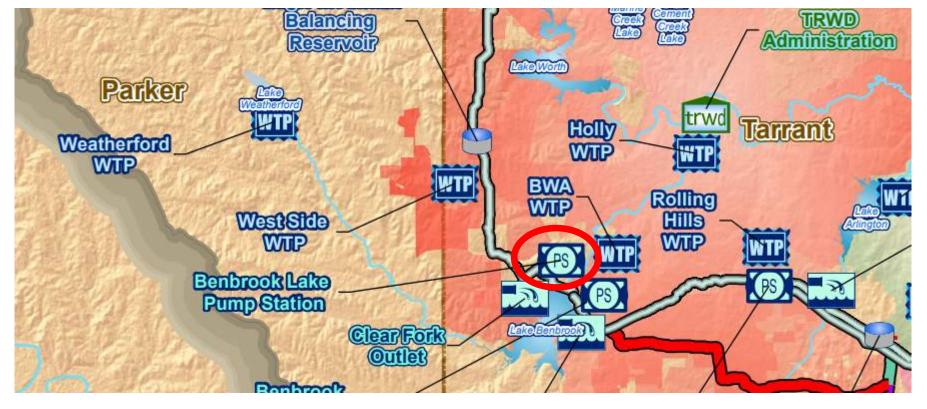

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What Kinds of Audits are there?

Some Types of Audits

- Forensic Audit
- Oil and Gas Audit
- Internal Audit
- IRS Audit
- Financial Audit



Forensic Audit

- Investigates *specific data* to identify facts linked to allegations of fraud
- Derives evidence that could potentially be used in court
- Used to uncover criminal behavior such as fraud or embezzlement
- This type of audit is not concerned with an opinion regarding Financial Statements nor is it focused on compliance and/or performance



Oil and Gas Audit

- Determines if the lease operator is in compliance with the relevant provisions of the lease agreement and is paying the proper amount of money.
- On a test basis, the audit determines the accuracy and validity of these four components used by the operator:
 - volume determination
 - price determination
 - ownership percentage
 - deductions

TRWD has recovered over \$3,500,000 from Oil and Gas Audits. These audits are performed by a specialized Oil and Gas consultant familiar with the Oil and Gas operations.

Internal Audit

Reports to the Finance/Audit Committee

- Evaluates internal controls, such as governance, accounting, operations, information systems as well as other area identified in the risk assessment
- Reviews compliance with laws and regulations
- Provides management with the tools to attain operational efficiency and additional assurance that policy and procedures are being followed
- Identifies weaknesses within the organization's processes
- Findings are reported to the Finance/Audit Committee

TRWD has contracted with a Certified Public Accounting (CPA) firm that specializes in Internal Audits since 2007. Internal Audits are Co-Sourced with the TRWD Internal Audit Department. Two to three operational audits are performed a year.

IRS Audit

- IRS selects bond issuances of governmental agencies by:
 - Project
 - Referral or Questionable item
 - Random selection
- Audit tasks identify areas of noncompliance by reviewing items, such as:
 - Current status of the bonds
 - Support for the use of bond proceeds
 - Arbitrage related items
- After receiving the requested information, the auditor will review all documentation, and inform the agency of their finding

TRWD's most recent IRS Audit was completed in 2021 on the 2016A Bond Series. The audit concluded no adverse determination and no changes to tax exemption status of bonds.



Financial Audit

- An objective examination and evaluation of the financial statements of an organization to make sure that the <u>financial records are a fair and accurate representation of the transactions</u> they claim to represent.
- As required by law external audits are performed annually by Certified Public Accounting (CPA) firms. The audit report has an auditor's opinion. There are four types of opinions:
 - Unmodified Opinion the financial statements are presented fairly, in all material respects
 - Modified Opinion financial statements are not prepared and presented fairly in all material respects
 - <u>Qualified Opinion</u> financial statements are materially misstated, however the misstatement is not wide-spread
 - Adverse Opinion financial statements are materially misstated and the misstatement is wide-spread
 - <u>Disclaimer Opinion</u> auditor was unable to access and obtain information related to items that they believe could cause material, wide-spread misstatement
- External audits includes a review of both financial statements and internal controls

TRWD's Financial Statements has received an Unmodified opinion for over 50 years. The last 5 years TRWD has received "Excellence in Financial Reporting".

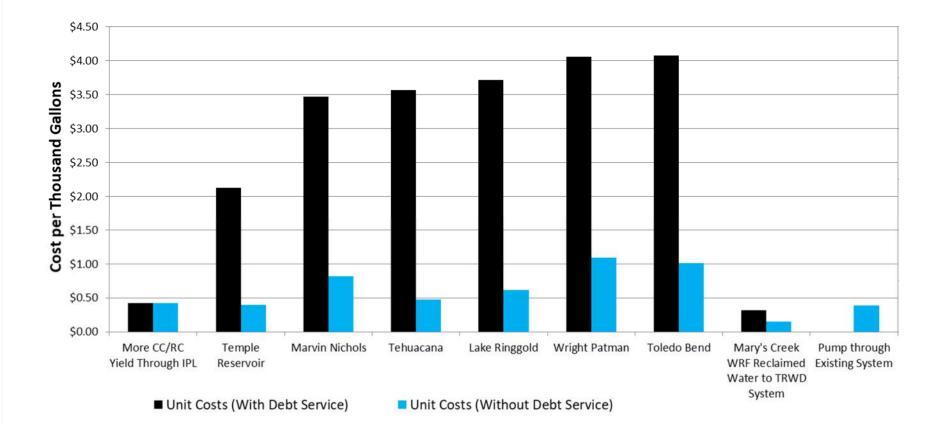


Goals for Mary's Creek Water Reclamation

- Promote and prioritize the use of reclaimed water
 - Prioritize direct reuse first
 - Transmit reclaimed water not used for direct reuse to TRWD water supply system
- Protect the Trinity River water quality and public use of the river
- Work with the City of Fort Worth and TCEQ to meet these goals

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History

- 2009 2010 Site Study and Stakeholder Engagement
- 2011 Property Acquisition
- March 2018 City applied for TCEQ Discharge Permit
- October 2018 TRWD met with City to discuss water quality concerns
- 2018 2020 TCEQ Review and Draft Permit
- March 2020 TCEQ Issued the Draft Permit
- April 2020 TRWD filed a request for a contested case hearing
- October 2020 Public Meeting, and TRWD Issued Comments to TCEQ
- October 2021 TCEQ Executive Director recommends that TCEQ Commissioners grant a contested hearing and refer the issue to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH)



Next Steps

- Continue business case discussions with the City regarding reclaimed water supply
- November 3, 2021: TCEQ to make decision on whether to grant a contested hearing, refer to State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH)

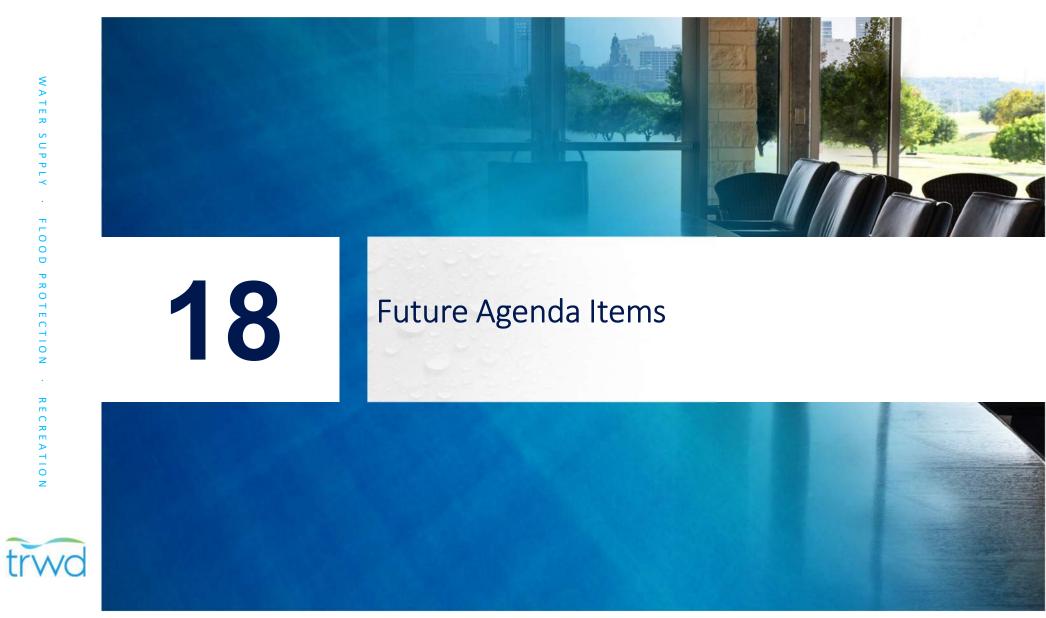
