




Arlington Outlet Existing Conditions





Actual location of 48" inlet piping, within excavation zone for new 10-foot diameter outlet pipe















Percent of Total Storage on May 15


expected to fall during a specified time period in the future. Because precipitation can vary significantly over short distances, QPFs are reported as the expected "areal average"
