






If the district adopts a combined debt service, operation and maintenance, and contract tax rate that would result in the taxes on the average residence homestead increasing by more than eight percent, the qualified voters of the district by petition may require that an election be held to determine whether to reduce the operation and maintenance tax rate to the voter-approval tax rate under Section 49.23603. 




Integrated Pipeline Layout and Phases






Integrated Pipeline Long Tunnels Project








Combination Air Release/Vacuum Valves







Waterwheel Location – Clear Fork Trinity River










Reservoir Storage Across Texas
