




### **Trinity River Vision Authority** Updated TIF #9 Forecast






### Trinity River Vision TIF 9 Boundary






## Annual New Taxable Construction Activity in TIF 9






## TIF 9 Total Tax Revenue for all Jurisdictions by Year






#### TIF 9 Total Cumulative Revenue






### Combined Property Tax Rate for the Participating Entities (2014 to 2023)







In 2023 forecast, TXP assumed new projects built after 40 years instead of just appreciation.



## Key Issues, Opportunities, and Challenges Influencing TIF Growth

- The short-term focus should be on encouraging development along Main Street that is canal ready but not canal dependent.
- Higher interest rates are negatively impacting new real estate development.
- Declining tax rates of participating TIF 9 jurisdictions.
- TIF 9 and Panther Island have not attracted substantial new commercial activity over the past 20 years. What are future implications of hybrid work model?
- The results of the PANTHER ISLAND VISION 2.0 study could change the build-out pattern for TIF 9 relative to past studies and historic construction activity.
- TRWD owns over 100 acres within the TIF. The development of these properties will be needed for the TIF to generate maximum revenue.



#### TRWD constructed 1st section of Canal Structures in 2020-2021



- Encore Panther Island Multi-Family surrounds the canal







